Finally, we will come to Hudson Yards, which combines food, entertainment, shopping, and Internet celebrity attractions. You can check in at the Internet celebrity giant pine cone Vessel and the suspended observation deck The Edge, or enjoy delicious food. In the evening you will have the opportunity to enjoy a musical on the famous Broadway.

Manhattan's financial dream blossomed in New York, where almost all the world's top financial institutions are gathered. Today we will visit some classic landmark buildings in New York, the world's financial center, such as the Canyon of Heroes, Park Road Building, Trinity Church, New York Stock Exchange, Rockefeller Center, etc., to experience the rich financial and commercial atmosphere.

**New York University**

New York University is a private research university located in Manhattan, New York City, USA. Founded in 1831, the university has become the largest private non-profit higher education institution in the United States, and ranks among the top universities in various rankings. New York University currently has 36 Nobel Prize winners, 3 Abel Prize winners, 9 National Medal of Science winners, 16 Pulitzer Prize winners, and 19 Academy Award

winners. In addition, it also has many Emmy Award, Tony Award, MacArthur Award, and Guggenheim Award winners.

### **Washington Square Park**

Well-known for its arch, honoring George Washington, the man for whom the park is named after, and its fountain, the arch's elder by 43 years and a popular meeting spot, Washington Square Park also houses several other monuments and facilities.

### **Liberty Cruise**

Take the Statue of Liberty cruise around the island to start a one-hour tour of the Hudson River. On the way, you will see the Manhattan skyline and the scenery on both sides of the Hudson River, and overlook the Empire State Building and the World Trade Center. The cruise slowly passes by the Statue of Liberty, and you can clearly see the Statue of Liberty wearing a radiant crown, holding the torch of freedom, and holding the Declaration of Independence in her hand. It is magnificent and eye-catching, symbolizing the lofty ideals of the American people for freedom and their yearning and pursuit for a better life.

### **Hudson Yards**

In 2019, Hudson Yards opened with great anticipation, becoming the most dazzling skyscraper cluster on the far west side of Manhattan, subverting the public's imagination of the city! But the miracle of Hudson Yards is far more than that... The most eye-catching one should be the new landmark Vessel, known as the "Eiffel Tower of New York", with a hollow spiral staircase connecting the two, which is extremely subversive and controversial. Hudson Yards also has the highest city observation deck in the Western Hemisphere, the Edge, which is higher than the Empire State Building Observation Deck at 1,050 feet and the Rockefeller Center Observation Deck at 850 feet above the ground! Of course, Hudson Yards has become a popular check-in destination in New York, and the 7-story luxury mall The Shops next to it is also worth a visit. The Shops covers an area of 1 million square feet and includes New York's first and only high-end department store Neiman Marcus, which includes more than 100 brands. The food market, known as "Little Spain", was co-founded by three Spanish chefs. Walking into it feels like a Spanish tapas street. The New York Times introduced the top 20 foods here, and Iberian ham ranked first. It uses Libyan pigs that are only three weeks old. It is worth a try. Of course, there is also the Spanish paella that you can never go wrong.

### **Hudson Yards Vessel**

The huge structure located in the Hudson Yards landscape corridor, the center of the square and the visual focus is called Vessel. It is a honeycomb-shaped staircase, and netizens affectionately call it the "big pine cone". You can find unique beauty when appreciating the building from different angles. It is a great place to check in on your circle of friends.

## Edge NYC

Edge is the highest outdoor sky deck in the Western Hemisphere located at 30 Hudson Yards, with a one-of-a-kind design. It's suspended in mid-air, giving you the feeling of floating in the sky with 360-degree views you can't get anywhere else. Look 100 stories down from the thrilling glass floor, lean out over the city on angled glass walls and sip champagne in the sky. Enjoy your adventure up in the sky!

## Day 2

### New York City Tour

All day

Today, we will first go to Columbia University, located in Upper Manhattan. It is one of the 14 founding schools of the Association of American Universities and one of the Ivy League schools. Then we will go to the first artificial landscape park in the United States, Central Park, which has acres of light green grass, a small forest with lush trees, courtyards, an open-air theater, etc. There is also a park called Strawberry Fields, which is a peace park in

memory of John Lennon. After that, we will come to the largest art museum in the United States, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, which is as famous as the British Museum in London, the Louvre in Paris, France, and the Hermitage Museum in St. Petersburg, Russia, and is one of the four largest museums in the world. After that, we will go to the New York Public Library with its rich collection and Bryant Park, an oasis in the downtown area. You can also buy and taste the famous Lady M cake and Blue Bottle Coffee.

### **Columbia University**

Columbia University is a private Ivy League research university located in New York City. Established in 1754 as the King's College on the grounds of Trinity Church in Manhattan, Columbia is the oldest institution of higher education in New York and the fifth-oldest institution of higher learning in the United States. It is one of nine colonial colleges founded prior to the Declaration of Independence, seven of which belong to the Ivy League. Columbia is ranked among the top universities in the world by major education publications.

### **Central Park**

Central Park is the back garden of New York citizens. The park is beautiful in all seasons: bright red and green in spring, bright sunshine in summer, fiery red maple leaves in autumn, and silvery white and bleak in winter. Both local residents and tourists from all over the world are deeply attracted by this paradise among high-rise buildings. The park looks natural, but its landscape is actually carefully created: there are several artificial lakes, long walking trails, two skating rinks, a wildlife sanctuary, many lawns and children's playgrounds. It is also a well-known urban park in New York. From "Spider-Man" to "The Avengers", Central Park has frequently appeared in Marvel movies.

### **The Metropolitan Museum of Art**

The Metropolitan Museum of Art is located next to the beautiful Central Park. It is one of the three largest museums in the world, along with the British Museum and the Louvre in France. It embodies the world's 6,000 years of splendid civilization and brings together the art treasures of the essence of mankind. The huge building area provides enough space for exhibitions, creating a feature of the Metropolitan Museum of Art - reproduction. The museum currently has a total of 3 million collections, with 17 exhibition sections, mainly including Egyptian art, Greek and Roman art, Oriental art, Western European art, Islamic art, American art and other parts. The entire

museum is like a time capsule. Visiting each layer of space, you can constantly feel the charm of time and space retrospection and admire the world's immortal civilization.

### **New York Public Library**

The magnificent New York Public Library has a solemn lion sculpture at the entrance. Walk up the marble steps and through the corridor to enter the castle-like library. The beautiful marble columns and walls in the hall show her low key and gorgeous beauty. The library has a rich collection of 16.47 million books, periodicals, manuscripts, pictures, etc. The library with a classical atmosphere is also a frequent guest in film and television works. "Night at the Museum", "The Day After Tomorrow", "Spider-Man", "Detective Chinatown" and other films have been filmed here.

### **Bryant Park**

Bryant Park is a beloved, year-round New York City destination. Known as Manhattan's Town Square, the park is famous for its lush seasonal gardens, free activities, world class restrooms, and al fresco dining. Located adjacent to the New York Public Library and surrounded by iconic skyscrapers, Bryant Park is visited by more than 12 million people each year and is one of the busiest public spaces in the world.

## Day 3

### **Philadelphia - Vehicle - Baltimore**

Today, we will drive to Philadelphia. First, we will visit the University of Pennsylvania, which has the Wharton School of Business, which is rated as the "best business school in the world". A one-hour campus tour will give you an understanding of the school's history and outstanding achievements; visit the University of Pennsylvania Museum of Archaeology and Paleoanthropology, which has a rich collection of collections. The Chinese exhibition hall is the most dazzling part of it. The most famous ones include the stone carvings of the Six Horses of Emperor Taizong of Tang Dynasty, the huge Buddhist murals of Guangji Temple in Shanxi, and the world's third largest crystal ball; you can also enjoy lunch in the campus cafeteria of the University of Pennsylvania and experience the wonderful university life. Leaving the University of Pennsylvania, we will go to the National Independence Historical Park, a national historic site in the United States, to visit the Independence Palace, where the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States were discussed and signed, and the Liberty Bell, which has extraordinary symbolic significance. After the visit, we will leave Philadelphia and drive to Baltimore to visit the famous research university, Johns Hopkins University.

### **University of Pennsylvania**

Founded by Benjamin Franklin in 1740, the University of Pennsylvania is the fourth oldest institution of higher education in the United States. It is also the first modern institution of higher learning in the United States to engage in science, technology and humanities education, and one of the eight famous Ivy League schools. In addition to feeling the strong learning atmosphere while walking through this institution of higher learning, we will also check in at the statue of Benjamin Franklin on campus. Former US President Trump, the world's richest man Buffett, as well as Liang Sicheng, Lin Huiyin and others have walked out of here.

### **Penn Museum**

In the 19th century, the University of Pennsylvania organized many expeditions to explore the Middle East and the Far East. Today, the museum has collected a large number of cultural relics from Babylon, Mesopotamia, Egypt, the Ottoman Empire, China and the Far East, including mummies, ancient Greek sculptures, and Chinese Han Dynasty unicorns. In addition, there are two of the six horses from Zhaoling that have been lost in the United States - Saluzi and Quanmao. These exhibits are of extremely high level in the archaeological community, and many of them are unique works of art that can only be appreciated here, with the exquisite craftsmanship that makes people stunned.

### **Independence National Historical Park**

Philadelphia is a land that witnessed the independence and birth of the United States. The National Independence Historical Park, built in the spirit of the American War of Independence, contains some historical buildings related to the American Revolution and the founding of the country. It is known as "the most historic

square mile in the United States." In the park, you can see the Independence Square surrounded by green trees, the towering milky white clock tower, and the bronze statues of the founding heroes standing on the lawn. The overall atmosphere here makes people feel solemn and dignified.

### **Independence Hall in Philadelphia**

Independence Hall is a famous historical monument in the United States and a symbol of American independence. Located in the city of Philadelphia, Independence Hall is a two-story old-style red brick building with creamy white doors and windows and a spire. A large clock is embedded between the main house and the tower. On July 4, 1776, the most important document in American history, the Declaration of Independence, was signed in Independence Hall, announcing that the North American colonies would break away from Britain and establish a "free and independent United States."

### **Liberty Bell in Philadelphia**

To the west of the lawn outside the Independence Palace stands a small memorial hall, where the world-famous Liberty Bell is placed. There is a long jagged crack from the bottom to the top of the Liberty Bell, which is very conspicuous and cannot be repaired. However, it is precisely this kind of incompleteness that inspires the American people to cherish and respect it. It is a symbol of the American spirit of freedom and American culture, and the pride of the American people. It rang for the first reading of the Declaration of Independence, for the adoption of the Constitution by the United States, for sending Franklin to Britain to petition, and for calling citizens to discuss the Sugar Act and the Stamp Act promulgated by Britain, and for the death of Washington.

### **Philadelphia Congress Hall**

Home of the United States Congress when Philadelphia served as the nation's capital from 1790 to 1800 is the Philadelphia Congress Hall. During Congress Hall's duration as the capitol of the United States, the country admitted three new states, Vermont, Kentucky, and Tennessee. The ratification of the Bill of Rights of the United States Constitution and both the presidential inaugurations of George Washington and John Adams were located here.

### **Johns Hopkins University**

Johns Hopkins University is located in Baltimore, Maryland. It was founded in 1876. It is a small and medium-sized private research university. It is the first research university in the United States and one of the 14 founding schools of the Association of American Universities, a North American academic alliance. Its medical school is world-renowned, and its bioengineering major ranks first in the United States. It is very attractive to students who

want to be a student or study medicine in the future. The campus is full of green trees, classical Georgian red brick buildings, and scattered small squares, which are very charming.

### Princeton University

Princeton University is one of the eight Ivy League schools and a famous comprehensive private university. There are many Gothic Revival-style buildings on campus, most of which were built in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Nassau Hall is the main administrative building on campus. It was built in 1756 and was briefly used as the Capitol in 1783.

#### **The Firsts of America Exploration Tour**

Boston is one of the oldest cities in the United States, with a strong academic atmosphere. After experiencing the cleansing of history, many firsts were born in Boston. Today we will visit the first university in 1636 - Harvard University, the birthplace of the American Revolution and the place where the Declaration of Independence was first published - The Old State House, the first subway system in the United States, the first public park in the United States, the first public botanical garden in the United States, and the first large-scale free municipal library invested by the public in the United States, to experience the strong historical style of Boston.

#### **View Boston at Prudential Center**

View Boston is a 360° taste of the city, offering breathtaking views atop one of the tallest buildings in New England. You will find plenty of photo opportunities as you roam the 360-degree open air roof deck and stop to enjoy beverages with a view at Stratus. Explore the remarkable 3D model of the city with projection-mapping to

dramatically reveal the seasons, spirit, and celebrations that bring Boston to life. Be enveloped by the 270-degree immersive theater screen showcasing street-level exploration of various neighborhoods and behind-the-scenes perspective from some of Boston's most beloved attractions, including Fenway Park!

### **Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT)**

The Massachusetts Institute of Technology located in Cambridge, Massachusetts is a research university known for its highly selective and intense academics. MIT alumni include 24 Nobel Prize winners and 22 Rhodes Scholars.

After that, we will go to Quincy Market, where you can enjoy a local Boston lobster meal. After leaving Boston, we will drive to Yale University, a member of the Ivy League. Yale University is one of the most influential private universities in the United States and the third university established in American history.

### **United States Military Academy**

West Point Military Academy is the first military academy in the United States and one of the oldest military academies in the United States.
