## Tour introduction

All day

Depart from Frankfurt, Germany in the morning and cross the border into the Czech Republic in the afternoon. First, we will arrive at Karlovy Vary, a spa town full of spa corridors and magnificent Baroque buildings. Karlovy Vary was founded by King Charles IV of Bohemia in 1370. It is the most famous and largest spa resort in the Czech Republic. In addition to appreciating the beauty of the architecture, you can also sip the mineral water that heals the body and mind. Then we will go to the capital of the Czech Republic and arrive in Prague, the ancient capital of Eastern Europe, which is known as the medieval gem, in the evening. The spires and domes of the ancient buildings in the city appear magnificent under the setting sun, so it is also called the Golden City, exuding a quaint atmosphere.

### **Karlovy Vary**

Walking into the town, you can see a winding river at the foot of the mountain flowing slowly along the valley into the distance. On both sides of the river, there are rows of buildings of various styles, colors and gorgeous decorations. Standing in the Market Hot Spring Corridor, a pure wooden structure is eye-catching. The green roof, white columns, hollow design, star-shaped carvings make the corridor look light, transparent, smart and delicate. The Mill Hot Spring Corridor is named after the mill nearby. There are 12 allegorical statues on the roof of the building, which are said to represent the 12 months of the year. This corridor, which is more than 130 meters long and has more than 100 columns, is extremely elegant and majestic. It is the largest and most beautiful corridor in the town.

## Day 2

### Prague - Vehicle - Bratislava

Prague's architecture is characterized by its vibrant and vibrant rooftops, creating a striking visual experience. Known as one of Europe's most beautiful cities, it was also the first city in the world to be designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. After our visit, we'll drive to Hungary, where we'll spend the night in Bratislava or a nearby city.

#### Prague Castle

A beauty of its own to discover is the Prague Castle! It is one of the largest coherent castle complexes in the world. It consists of a large-scale composition of palaces and ecclesiastical buildings of various architectural styles from the remains of Romanesque-style buildings in the 10th century through the Gothic modifications of the 14th century.

#### Old Royal Palace

The Old Royal Palace is located in the third atrium of Prague Castle, adjacent to St. Vitus Cathedral. It has undergone expansion and renovation on the basis of the original ancient Roman architecture, and gradually added Gothic and Renaissance buildings. It can be called a living fossil that witnesses the interpretation of European architectural styles. The Old Royal Palace was built in the 12th century and was the residence of successive Bohemian kings until it was ruled by the Habsburg family. Compared with the magnificent St. Vitus Cathedral, the white-walled and red-roofed Old Royal Palace does not have gorgeous gilded decorations or too

many relief murals, and looks relatively simple and rustic.

### **St. George's Basilica**

St. George's Basilica (Czech: Bazilika sv. Jiří) is the oldest surviving church building within Prague Castle, Prague, Czech Republic. The basilica was founded by Vratislaus I of Bohemia in 920. It is dedicated to Saint George. Primarily Romanesque in style, it is part of the collection of buildings that comprise the castle, the political capital of the nation, and the spiritual center of the Czech state.

### **Golden Lane**

Let's take you to visit colorful and vibrant townhouses! Golden Lane originated after the construction of a new northern wall of the castle. The area of the northern bailey was used for the building of modest dwellings, which are now the last remainder of the small-scale architecture of Prague Castle. Let's take a look at this architectural destination.

### **Charles Bridge**

Charles Bridge is a 14th century stone bridge linking the two sides of Prague. This magnificent structure is one of the city's finest attractions, is the main pedestrian route connecting the Old Town with the Lesser Town and Prague Castle. It is a uniquely designed bridge filled with musicians, painters, vendors and tourists.

## **Day 3**

### **Bratislava - Vehicle - Budapest**

All day

Today we will arrive in Budapest, the capital of Hungary, which is known as the "Paris of Eastern Europe" and the "Pearl of the Danube". The city is divided into two by the Danube River, the west bank of the river is called Buda, and the east bank is called Pest. First, we will visit the Heroes' Square, which celebrates the founding of the country and commemorates the Magyar League, and then come to the Hungarian Parliament Building, the largest building in Hungary, to admire the Gothic Revival style design. Then check in at the Elizabeth Bridge, which was built to commemorate Princess Sissi. It spans the beautiful Danube and connects Buda and Pest on both sides. After that, visit the Fisherman's Bastion and the Matthias Church, where successive Hungarian kings were

crowned. During dinner time, we have arranged for you either a Danube River Cruise to enjoy the sights of Budapest on both banks, or participation in a Hungarian National Ball, combined with an authentic Hungarian Authentic Flavors experience.

### **Heroes' Square**

Heroes' Square is the central square of Budapest, the capital of Hungary. It is a place of history, art and politics. The Hungarian people built Heroes' Square and erected a monument to celebrate the 1000th anniversary of the founding of the country. The square was completed in 1896. There is an angel Gabriel on the top of the monument. The angel holds the crown of King Stephen's coronation, symbolizing that Hungary has become a Christian country.

### **Hungarian Parliament Building**

The Hungarian Parliament Building, with a typical neo-Gothic style, was built in the early 20th century and is one of the more magnificent and solemn buildings in Hungary. If you want to understand the history and culture of Hungary, the Hungarian Parliament Building is a must-visit place. The Hungarian Parliament Building is majestic, with two tall and pretty towers made of white stone. Portraits of Hungarian historical celebrities and huge murals depicting Hungarian historical events can be seen everywhere inside.

### **Elisabeth Bridge**

The Buda side of the Elisabeth Bridge is the Liberty Hill, and the Pest side is the Vaci Street and Ferenciektere Square. It was built in memory of the Austro-Hungarian Queen Elizabeth Amalia Eugenie (also known as "Princess Sissi") who was assassinated in 1898. Because the bridge is pure white and exquisite, the Elisabeth Bridge is also known as the most elegant bridge on the Danube. The local Chinese simply call it the White Bridge. At night, when the neon lights hit the bridge, it will present charming colors, like a soft ribbon on the Danube. The bridge is named after the former Queen Elizabeth of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, also known as Princess Sissi. Now a large memorial statue of her is erected in the small garden on the Buda side. Princess Sissi loved Hungary all her life and made great contributions to the establishment of the empire. She played a pivotal role in eliminating the contradictions between the two nations and fighting for the interests of the Hungarian nobles. Therefore, the

Hungarian people are full of infinite love and admiration for this legendary woman.

### **Fisherman's Bastion**

Fisherman's Bastion is a two-story white building complex that combines neo-Gothic, neo-Romanesque and Hungarian local architectural styles. It is rated as the most impressive and outstanding building complex in Hungary. In the Middle Ages, the fishermen here were responsible for defending this section of the city wall, hence the name Fisherman's Bastion. Fisherman's Bastion is known as the Budapest observation deck, where you can have a bird's eye view of the beautiful scenery of Budapest.

### **Matthias Church**

The exterior of Matthias Church is neo-Gothic, with a variety of colors such as Hungarian folklore, Art Nouveau style and Turkish design. The intricately carved and decorated stone spires and colorful mosaic inlaid roofs are the characteristics of the church. The church ingeniously built a tall bell tower in a corner of the church, which makes the whole building light and less heavy and restrained than other churches. The coronation ceremonies of Hungarian kings of all dynasties were held here, so it is also known as the "Coronation Church".

### **Danube River Cruise**

The Danube is the only natural factor that separates Buda and Pest, but it is also the river that connects the two cities together. Cruising on the Danube, you will see the Parliament Building, the Museum, the City Hall, the Margaret Bridge, the Chain Bridge, the Elizabeth Bridge, the Liberty Bridge, the Petofi Bridge and other buildings one by one, which is spectacular.

### **Budapest - Vehicle - Vienna**

**Austrian Parliament Building**

The Vienna Parliament Building is located beside the Ringstrasse in the center of Vienna, adjacent to the Town Hall Park and the Hofburg. It was originally the Austrian Parliament under the Habsburg Dynasty. In front of the Parliament Building is the famous statue of Athena, holding a token in her left hand, representing justice, and the goddess of victory in her right hand. The sculptures under her feet symbolize the four major rivers of the Austro-Hungarian Empire at that time: the Danube, the Rhine, the Elbe and the Moldova. Statues of ancient Greek and Roman historians are placed on the slope of the porch to remind politicians to always bear in mind their historical responsibilities. The seven Corinthian columns on the main facade are magnificent, and the triangular eaves are carved with the scene of Emperor Franz I issuing constitutions to 17 nations.

**Hofburg**

The Hofburg is the official residence and workplace of the President of Austria and was formerly the principal imperial palace of the Habsburg dynasty. Located in the center of Vienna, it was built in the 13th century and expanded several times afterwards.

**Heldenplatz**

Heldenplatz is a square in Vienna, the capital of Austria. Many important events have taken place here, the most

famous of which is the announcement of the German-Austrian merger by Hitler in 1938. Walking along the square, you can see the statues of Archduke Karl and Prince Eugen standing at both ends to resist foreign enemies. Heldenplatz is the outer square of the Hofburg Palace. It was built during the reign of Emperor Franz Joseph I and is part of the so-called "Imperial Square" that was not fully built. To its northeast is the Leopoldinian Tract of the Hofburg Palace, to its southeast is the New Hofburg, and to its southwest is the Inner Ring Road, which separates it from the "Outside the City Gate" (Aeusserer Burgtor). There are no buildings in the northwest, and you can have a good view of the Inner Ring Road, the Parliament Building, the City Hall, and the Burgtheater.

### **Vienna State Opera**

The Vienna State Opera is one of the top opera addresses in the world, with first-class productions of the very highest caliber and a different program every day: around 50 operas and ballet works per season, danced by the Vienna State Ballet. The variety of the operatic program is unparalleled anywhere in the world.

### **Stadtpark**

It is located on the east side of the Vienna Ring Road in Austria and is built along the Vienna River. The flower clock, lawns, flocks of birds and statues of musicians here form a very beautiful scene, making it a great place for walking and outings.

### **Domkirche St. Stephan**

Stephen's Cathedral is a landmark building in Vienna and one of the three largest cathedrals in Europe. Today, the cathedral still stands quietly in the center of the bustling old city, like the guardian of Vienna. When you come to the center of Vienna, you will definitely be attracted by its magnificence. Historical background The church was built in 1147. It was originally built in the name of a Roman church. In the 14th century, Rudolf IV ordered a large-scale reconstruction. After being burned down by the smoke of World War II, it was rebuilt several times before it became the Gothic cathedral that is now presented to the world. Since the late 15th century, Stephen's Cathedral has been the bishop's seat of the Catholic Church and an important church in Austria. The magnificent building Stephen's Cathedral consists of a main building and three towers. The towering conical spire soars into the sky, and the colorful roof inlaid with green and yellow mosaic tiles shines in the sun. The armband pattern composed of tiles and the double-headed eagle representing the Habsburg dynasty are very spectacular. The interior of the church has been rebuilt several times, and various European architectural arts have been compromised and integrated here. The sun shines into the church through the colorful stained glass windows, forming a dreamy halo.

### **Schönbrunn Palace**

Schönbrunn Palace is one of Europe's most beautiful Baroque complexes and has been in the possession of the Habsburgs since 1569. The wife of Emperor Ferdinand II, Eleonore von Gonzaga, had a pleasure palace built on the site in 1642 and called the property "Schönbrunn" for the first time. The palace and garden complex created from 1696 onwards following the siege of Vienna was completely redesigned under Maria Theresa after 1743. Today, due to its historical significance, its unique layout and magnificent furnishings, the palace is a UNESCO

World Heritage site.

### **Schönbrunn Palace Garden**

The back garden of Schönbrunn Palace is the Austrian royal garden, a typical French-style garden. The huge flower beds are flanked by neatly trimmed green tree walls, within which are 44 statues of characters from Greek mythology. At the end of the garden is a "Poseidon Fountain". To the east is the inconspicuous "Fountain of Beauty", which is the origin of the name of the imperial palace. Directly opposite the Fountain of Beauty is a man-made Roman ruins and an obelisk. The highest point of Schönbrunn Palace is the Arc de Triomphe, and to the west of the Neptune Fountain are the zoo and tropical plant greenhouse.

### **Hallstatt**

It is known as the most magnificent and charming part of Austria. The Salzkammergut, covering an area of more than 3,000 square kilometers, has been a summer resort and hunting destination for Austrian and German nobles since the mid-19th century. Hallstatt is a beautiful pearl in the Salzkammergut Lake District. It is one of the most beautiful towns in Austria and has been listed as a world natural and cultural heritage. The ancient market built on the mountain and the overlapping wooden houses are the characteristics here. You can stroll in the picturesque streets of Hallstatt.

### **Marienplatz**

The square was built in 1158 and is the largest and most important square in Munich. Because the new and old town halls of Munich are located around the square, Marienplatz is also known as the "living room" of Munich. It is now a transportation hub for Munich, a place for cultural activities and leisure and entertainment for citizens, and the Bayern Munich football team also celebrates its victory here. The new town hall on the square and the adjacent Frauenkirche, with two twin towers with green "onion-shaped" spires, constitute the eternal theme of Munich postcards.

## Day 6

**Munich** - Vehicle - **Vaduz** - Vehicle - **Titlis** - Vehicle - **Luzern** - Vehicle - **Zurich or nearby cities**

All day

After breakfast, we will head to Switzerland, known as the Garden of the World, passing through Vaduz, the capital of the small European country of Liechtenstein. Vaduz is famous for its Alpine landscape, hiking trails and stamps. Then we will cross the mountains to the Engelberg Mountains in central Switzerland to visit the Titlis Snow Mountain. Take the rotating mountain cable car to the Titlis Peak, which is 3,000 meters above sea level and covered with snow all year round. After 45 minutes, we will reach the top of the snow mountain to visit the ice cave, and then walk on the snow viewing platform. The surrounding peaks and glaciers are in full view. You can have lunch at the mountaintop restaurant. After that, we will go to the picturesque city of Lucerne to see the Lion Monument carved on the cliff to praise the loyalty and bravery of the Swiss nation. Stroll through the quaint streets full of boutiques, buy authentic specialty chocolates and souvenirs, or go to the watch shop to buy Swiss watches.

### **Lion Monument**

The wounded lion statue designed and carved by Danish sculptor Bertel Thorvaldsen was built to commemorate the 786 Swiss officers and guards who died protecting King Louis XVI and Queen Marie during the French Revolution in 1792. It is intended to pray for world peace. There is a text describing the incident below the monument. American novelist Mark Twain once praised the Lucerne lion as "the saddest and most touching stone sculpture in the world."

## **Day 7**

We'll then travel through the Swiss mountains into Germany's Black Forest, admiring the renowned mountain lake of Dietzensee, the largest natural lake in the Black Forest. Dietzensee's azure waters contrast beautifully with the azure sky, white clouds, and lush trees, creating the illusion of "traveling within a painting." This area is also known for its cuckoo clock production, with interesting clocks for sale everywhere. Your guide will explain the manufacturing process. Afterward, you can enjoy a hearty pork knuckle lunch and a

slice of authentic Black Forest cake at a lakeside restaurant, at your own expense. This truly worthwhile experience! We'll then return to Frankfurt.

To the south, you can see the Alps in the distance. There are medieval cobblestone paths along the river for tourists to walk by the lake and enjoy the very picturesque scenery.

**Rheinfall**

Switzerland's landscapes are often characterized by tranquility and peace. However, if you visit the small town of Schaffhausen on the Rhine River, you'd be surprised to find it filled with the roar of a mighty army. This is the Rhine Falls, Europe's largest and most spectacular waterfall. Formed between 14,000 and 17,000 years ago, the Rhine Falls feature a staircase carved into one of the rocks, allowing you to experience the falls up close. Alternatively, you can head to the other side of the falls for a different perspective. There's a restaurant near the falls, perfect for a bite to eat and a short rest. If you have more time, you can walk from the train station to the falls. Along the way, you'll see the surrounding houses and the tree-lined path along the riverbank, creating a picturesque scene well worth admiring.

**Titisee**

Titisee is a lake in the southern part of the Black Forest in Baden-Württemberg. It means "Maiden's Lake" in German. Formed by the Feldberg Glacier, Titisee is located on a mountain 850 meters above sea level. It is the largest alpine lake in Germany with drinking water quality. The rich green of the Black Forest is reflected in the pure water surface of Titisee, and the birds' natural singing creates a romantic atmosphere here. On the north bank of the lake is the hot spring town of the same name, which is part of the Titisee-Neustadt city. The famous specialty here is the exquisitely made cuckoo clock, which is said to be a cuckoo wall clock carved from wood by residents of the Black Forest to kill the boredom of the long winter.
