Tour introduction

Day 1

Denver - Vehicle - Cheyenne

All day

In the morning, we will fly to Denver, the capital of Colorado. Please wait for your guide at Baggage Claim Area 6 of the East Terminal in the airport lobby before 1:30 PM (Denver local time, which is the departure time for your guide). Visit the Colorado State Plaza and the capitol's golden dome. In the afternoon, head to the renowned 16th Street Mall, located in the heart of downtown, offering numerous shops and many of Denver's most historic buildings. Overnight in Cheyenne, the capital of Wyoming.

Itinerary:

Denver airport pick-up → Colorado State Capitol Building (40 mins) → The 16th St Mall, Denver (90 mins) → Cheyenne

Afternoon

Colorado State Capitol Building

The Colorado State Capitol, located on East Cowfax Avenue in downtown Denver, is the home of the Colorado General Assembly and the offices of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor of Colorado. Designed by Elijah E. Myers, it was built in the 1890s from Colorado white granite and officially opened in November 1894. The Capitol is situated slightly higher than other buildings in downtown Denver. Its 180-foot dome bears the initials of 16 of Denver's founders.

The 16th St Mall

The 16th Street Mall is located in the heart of downtown Denver, Colorado. Designed by famed architect I.M. Pei, the pedestrian promenade is made of red, white and gray granite in a repeating pattern that, seen from above, resembles the skin of a diamondback rattlesnake. The mall offers 42 outdoor cafés along the mall, making it the perfect place to grab a bite to eat or have a drink. Points of interest along the mall include the D&F Tower, a two-thirds replica of the Campanile of St. Mark's in Venice that was the highest building west of the Mississippi when it was built in 1909.

Day 2

Crazy Horse Monument - Vehicle - **Mount Rushmore National Memorial** - Vehicle -
Devil's Tower - Vehicle - **Gillette**

All day

This morning, we'll visit Crazy Horse, the world's largest mountain sculpture! This monument was carved by Native Americans and Americans, honoring the heroes who fought for Native American independence. We'll then visit the world-renowned Mount Rushmore, a symbol of the United States. The ingenious carvings have immortalized the figures of George Washington, the father of the American nation; Jefferson, the drafter of the Declaration of Independence; Roosevelt, the peacemaker; and Lincoln, the father of African Americans, on the majestic peak. We'll then depart for Devil's Peak, the world's first national monument! Known to Native Americans as "The Bear's Abode," Devil's Peak rises over 1,200 feet, a truly spectacular sight that attracts countless tourists and rock climbers every year.

Itinerary:

Cheyenne → **Crazy Horse Monument** (Mandatory, 60 mins) → **Mount Rushmore National Memorial** (Mandatory, 90 mins) → **Devil's Tower** (Mandatory, 45 mins) → **Gillette**

Morning

Crazy Horse Monument

Crazy Horse Mountain is named in memory of Crazy Horse, a young chief of the Sioux tribe and a national hero of the Indians. This westward-facing mountain is carved into the world's largest statue in the image of the legendary Crazy Horse. Going up the Black Mountain surrounded by beautiful mountains and rivers, on Crazy Horse Mountain, Crazy Horse's handsome head is gazing westward with a resolute expression. The legend of this monument lies in the precious spirit of the sculptor who built this project and devoted his entire family to this cause, and even more in the determination of the Indians to persevere in maintaining and promoting their own culture.

Afternoon

Mount Rushmore National Memorial

President Hill is located in the famous Black Hill area of South Dakota, which is famous for its towering stone mountains and mining history. The President Hill was completed in 1925 and is a huge project with statues of the

four presidents of the United States, including George Washington, Thomas Jackson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln. We will follow the tree-lined mountain trail to appreciate the President Hill from different angles and commemorate these four great presidents in American history.

Devil's Tower

Devil's Tower is considered a sacred place by the local Native Americans. It is awe inspiring when viewed from afar, and amazing when viewed up close! The huge volcanic rock columns have puzzled geologists from ancient times to the present, and the specific reasons for their formation have not yet been determined. We will follow the trail around the tower to appreciate the strange huge stone columns standing in the canyon from a close distance. On the way, you will have the opportunity to see rock climbers from all over the world challenging Devil's Tower here.

Day 3

Rocky Mountains - Vehicle - Yellowstone National Park

Here you can find almost everything you expect to see in a national park! Snow covered mountains, waterfalls, lakes, rivers, canyons, meadows, herds of buffalos, elks... and the most amazing geothermal features in the world! Geysers, hot springs, fumaroles and mud pots are the wonders that make YS truly unique. Stay overnight in West Yellowstone.

Itinerary:

Gillette → Pass by Rocky Mountains → Yellowstone National Park (Mandatory, 3 hours, we will head to Upper Yellowstone Falls, Artist's Point Spring, Hayden Valley, Yellowstone Valley, Mud Volcano, Fishing Bridge and other attractions, The tour guide will be adjusted according to the actual situation of the day, please refer to the actual arrangement.)

1. The East Gate of Yellowstone National Park is expected to open on 05/02/2026. Before that, the following attractions: Upper and Lower Falls, Artist Point, Hayden Canyon, Mud Volcano, Fishing Bridge, West Thumb Geyser will not be accessible. Please understand.

Afternoon

Yellowstone National Park

Located in the Rocky Mountains, known as the "backbone of America", it is located on the lava plateau between the Northern Rockies and the Central Rockies in the western United States. The geothermal wonders are its hallmark, a primitive landscape of the earth forged by water and fire. The natural landscape in the park is divided into five major areas, namely the Mammoth Area, the Roosevelt Area, the Canyon Area, the Geyser Area and the Lake Area, each with its own characteristics. It exceeds the limits of human art and is the most wonderful and spectacular scenery on the surface of the earth.

Upper Yellowstone Falls

The Upper Falls is located 400 meters upstream of the larger Yellowstone Falls. The waterfall falls vertically along the volcanic cliff with a drop of 33 meters. The originally uneven volcanic rocks below the waterfall have been eroded by the waterfall for hundreds of years and have become very smooth.

Artist Point

The scenery here is particularly spectacular. The canyon is more than 300 feet deep. The canyon walls are mainly yellow, mixed with black, red and pink, and clusters of green pine trees. These colors are mixed but not chaotic, looking like a peacock's tail, and also like the pointillism of a romantic painter who applied several layers of color in the same place.

Mud Volcano Area

Located in the eastern part of Yellowstone National Park, not far from the northern part of Yellowstone Lake. Most of the fountains here do not spray water, but mud, and every time they erupt, the ground shakes. Next to the mud volcano, there are colorful grasses that look extremely tender and gorgeous.

Night

Hotel: White Buffalo West Yellowstone; similar

All day

In the morning, we'll depart for Yellowstone National Park and enjoy a full day exploring the world's first national park. See the Grand Prismatic Springs, the eye of the Earth; the vibrant Palette; the world-renowned Old Faithful; the mysterious and tranquil Yellowstone Lake; the majestic and picturesque Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone; the galloping Upper Falls; the vibrant Morning Glory Pools; the misty Norris Springs; and get up close to wildlife. The excitement will continue one after another!

Itinerary:

West Yellowstone → Yellowstone National Park (8 hours)

All day

Yellowstone National Park

Located in the Rocky Mountains, known as the "backbone of America", it is located on the lava plateau between the Northern Rockies and the Central Rockies in the western United States. Yellowstone Norris Geyser Basin

Norris Geyser Basin, named after an early Yellowstone Superintendent, may be the hottest geyser basin in Yellowstone. The stark, barren landscape of Porcelain Basin is the result of the acidic environment. Due to the hostile condition plants, algae and bacteria have difficulty in establishing themselves. Instead, the basin derives its colors from mineral oxides, in spectrums of pink, red, orange (iron oxides) and yellow (sulfur and iron sulfates). The largest geyser in the world is located here. Steamboat Geyser has long periods of dormancy, but when it does erupt it sends jets of water nearly 380 feet high in a spectacular display.

Old Faithful Geyser

Old Faithful geyser is named for its consistent and regular eruption. Currently, it erupts approximately every 60 to 110 minutes, and each eruption lasts four to five minutes. The water column is more than 40 meters high, which is spectacular and never stops. The Old Faithful Visitor Center will display the eruption schedule in advance, so you can check the eruption time in advance before visiting with confidence.

The Grand Prismatic Hot Spring

Also known as the Seven Color Pool, it is the largest hot spring in the United States and the third largest in the world. It is 75-91 meters wide and 49 meters deep, and it gushes out about 2,000 liters of 71-degree hot water

every minute. The amazing thing about the Grand Prismatic Spring is that the color of the lake changes with the seasons. In spring, the lake changes from emerald green to golden orange-red, which is due to the algae and pigment-containing bacteria and other microorganisms living in the mineral-rich water. In midsummer, the chlorophyll content is relatively low, so the lake water appears brilliant orange, red or yellow. But in the cold winter, due to the lack of light, these microorganisms will produce more chlorophyll to suppress the color of carotenoids, so the water will appear deep dark green.

Night

Day 5

Yellowstone National Park - Vehicle - **Grand Teton National Park** - Vehicle - **Jackson** - Vehicle - **Salt Lake City**

All day

In the morning, we'll gather at the hotel and depart. While you're still reveling in the delights of yesterday's exciting trip, today we'll explore the stunning beauty of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem. We'll then enter Grand Teton National Park. Millennia-old glaciers cap the majestic Teton Mountains, while the blue skies and forests of the mountains are reflected in the pristine Jackson Lake at the foot of the mountains. The Snake River meanders through the water, creating a picturesque scene. We'll then visit the authentic Western cowboy town of Jackson, a world-renowned resort destination. Don't miss Elkhorn Park in the city center. In the afternoon, we'll arrive in Salt Lake City, the largest city in the Midwest, and visit the Great Salt Lake, known as America's Dead Sea.

Itinerary:

West Yellowstone → **Yellowstone National Park** (40 mins, stop at West Thumb Geyser Basin) → **Grand Teton National Park** (Mandatory, 60 mins) → **Jackson** → **Jackson Town Square with Elk Antler Arches** (60 mins) → **Great Salt Lake** (Mandatory, 20 mins) → **Salt Lake City**

Kindly Reminder:

1. Yellowstone National Park is located in the Rocky Mountains at an altitude of approximately 7000 feet; In the hot summer of July and August, the temperature can sometimes only reach 4 °C in the morning. Please pay attention to keeping warm.
2. The East Gate of Yellowstone National Park is expected to open on 05/02/2026. Before that, the following attractions: Upper and Lower Falls, Artist Point, Hayden Canyon, Mud Volcano, Fishing Bridge, West Thumb Geyser will not be accessible. Please understand.
3. The South Gate of Yellowstone National Park is expected to open on 05/10/2026. Therefore, West Thumb Geyser will not be accessible from 05/02/2026 to 05/09/2026. Please understand.

Morning

West Thumb Geyser Basin

The West Thumb Geyser Basin, located on the edge of Yellowstone Lake, was formed 150,000 years ago by the collapse of the earth's crust. The combination of hot springs and lake water has created a wonderful misty landscape: the misty area is the steam of hot springs, and the green waves are the water of Yellowstone Lake, which complements the blue sky and white clouds in the background, forming a landscape different from other hot spring areas in Yellowstone. This area is equivalent to the bay of Yellowstone Lake, where many geysers gather. The colors of the water outlets vary, some are transparent green, and some are dark black like cement. Many water outlets present a beautiful fantasy.

Grand Teton National Park

Grand Teton National Park was established on February 26, 1929. There are 300 kilometers of trails in Grand Teton National Park. There are many lakes in the park, including Jackson Lake and Jenny Lake. Most of the area of Grand Teton National Park is located in the Rocky Mountains, and the natural scenery is very magnificent. In addition, Grand Teton National Park also has extremely rich biological resources, including American bison, grizzly bears, black bears, moose, etc.

Afternoon

Jackson Town Square with Elk Antler Arches

The park is not big, but there are giant arches made of deer antlers in the four directions of east, west, south and north. The antlers are all sharp, but they are not obtained by hunting. Every winter, a large number of elk come from the mountains to the "National Elk Refuge" in Jackson to spend the winter. In the spring, the antlers fall off naturally and are replaced. After the elk leave, countless treasures are left everywhere.

Great Salt Lake

Great Salt Lake, lake in northern Utah, U.S., the largest inland body of salt water in the Western Hemisphere and one of the most saline inland bodies of water in the world. The lake is fed by the Bear, Weber, and Jordan rivers and has no outlet. The lake has fluctuated greatly in size, depending on the rates of evaporation and the flow of the rivers that feed it. Like the Dead Sea, the Great Salt Lake exists within an arid environment and has chemical characteristics like that of the oceans. However, it has a much greater salinity than the oceans, since natural evaporation exceeds the supply of water from the rivers feeding the lake.

The magnificent and exquisite building is a landmark of Utah and the most impressive state capitol building in the United States. We'll then proceed to Temple Square, a sacred site for the Mormons. A Mormon sister will lead us through the site and share insights into the teachings and history of Mormonism. After the tour, your guide will arrange for light rail, shuttle bus, or Uber transfer to Salt Lake City International Airport (SLC). Please book flights departing after 1:00 PM.

Salt Lake City → Utah State Capitol (30 mins) → Temple Square (40 mins) → Salt Lake City International Airport (SLC)

Morning

Utah State Capitol

The Utah State Capitol is the house of government for the U.S. state of Utah. The building houses the chambers and offices of the Utah State Legislature, the offices of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, the State Auditor and their staffs. The capital is the main building of the Utah State Capitol Complex, which is located on Capitol Hill, overlooking downtown Salt Lake City. The Neoclassical revival, Corinthian style building was designed by architect Richard K.A. Kletting and built between 1912 and 1916. The building was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1978.

Temple Square

Temple Square is a 10-acre (4.0 ha) complex, owned by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (LDS Church), in the center of Salt Lake City. Contained within Temple Square are the Salt Lake Temple, Salt Lake Tabernacle, Salt Lake Assembly Hall, the Seagull Monument, and two visitors' centers. The square was designated a National Historic Landmark District in 1964, recognizing the Mormon achievement in the settlement of Utah.
