Tour introduction

Day 1

Seattle - Vehicle - Vancouver

All day

Today we will depart from Seattle and head to Vancouver, the major political, economic, cultural, tourist and transportation center in western Canada. Vancouver has a pleasant climate, diverse culture and high standard of living, and has been rated as one of the most livable cities in the world by the United Nations Human Settlements Program for many years.

Itinerary:

Seattle → Vancouver → Stanley Park (60 mins) → **Chinatown** (pass by) → **Canada Place** (60 mins, you can participate in the FlyOver Canada 4D experience for 30 minutes at your own expense) → **Gastown Steam Clock** (20 mins) → **Granville Island** (60 mins)

All day

Stanley park

Stanley Park is rated as one of the best city parks in the world because of its perfect fusion of city and nature. It is the largest city park in North America and one of the most famous parks in the world. The park consists of three large beaches, a zoo, an aquarium, a small golf course, a rose garden, a small train and countless giant round totem poles. Walking into the park is like walking into a natural oxygen bar. There are dense forests that cover the sky and the sun, and a wide and calm lake in the park. The Lions Gate Bridge and Five Sails Square can be seen on the river bank. On the other side is North Vancouver, where you can have a panoramic view of the Vancouver skyline.

Vancouver Chinatown

Vancouver Chinatown consists of several streets and alleys. In terms of area, it is the second largest Chinatown in North America, second only to San Francisco Chinatown in the United States. Walking into here, various Chinese elements give people the illusion of being in China. At the entrance, there is also a landmark building of Vancouver Chinatown - a Millennium Gate built for the arrival of the millennium. The archway, glazed tiles and stone lions combine ancient and modern Chinese architectural elements. The four characters "Carry on the past and open up the future" on the back of the archway express the deep expectation of local Chinese to build the Millennium Gate.

Gastown Steam Clock

Gastown is located in Vancouver, Canada. Among the many attractions in downtown Vancouver, Gastown is a must-see for tourists. The 2-ton steam clock is the iconic landscape of Gastown and has stood here since 1977. As the world's first steam-driven clock, the tradition of sounding the whistle every 15 minutes has lasted for hundreds of years. Standing next to the steam clock, watching the white steam whistling out, accompanied by the sound of the whistle, it seems as if you have returned to the ancient steam era.

Canada Place

Canada Place is a beautiful spot to walk around, sightsee and take amazing photos! It is a building located on the Burrard Inlet waterfront of Vancouver. It is the home of the Vancouver Convention Centre, the Pan Pacific Vancouver Hotel, Vancouver's World Trade Centre, and the virtual flight ride FlyOver Canada.

FlyOver Canada

This simulated flight entertainment project took a total of 2.5 years and \$16 million. You will see attractions such as Newfoundland's icebergs and Niagara Falls. The theater uses a 20-meter-high hemispherical screen to play ultra-high-definition clips made with new electronic technology, and the effect is breathtaking. In addition to the shocking audio and video, the project also has moving seats that move with the flight of the aircraft, allowing you to experience the thrill of flying across Canada in a helicopter and feel the magnificence of this country. In addition, Flying Over Canada also uses water mist, wind and fragrance to make the audience more involved in this flight experience. The whole journey takes everyone from the east coast of Canada to the west coast, and enjoys the beautiful natural landscape and cities that make people intoxicated.

Granville Island

Granville Island was formerly an industrial peninsula, with abandoned railway factories scattered throughout the streets and alleys. After renovation, it has a brand new look and is full of modern art. There is also a traditional farmer's market outdoors in summer. The leisurely atmosphere here allows you to experience the casual lifestyle of Vancouver locals.

Day 2

Victoria 1-Day Tour

All day

This morning, we'll board the BC Ferries and depart for Victoria, the capital of British Columbia. Aboard this luxurious, well-appointed ferry, you'll enjoy a delicious meal while admiring the scenery of the Strait and the islands along the way from the observation deck. You'll visit Canada's oldest Chinatown and trace the footsteps of Canada's first Chinese laborers. Then, we'll explore Victoria's picturesque Inner Harbour and visit the Highway 1 kilometer zero monument. Afterward, we'll return to Vancouver.

All day

BC ferry

The BC Ferry is the primary mode of transportation from Vancouver to Victoria. With so many people traveling between Vancouver and Victoria, vehicles are also transported together, so there's a queue upon arrival. The ferry, built in Germany, can accommodate approximately 400 vehicles. The six-story lounge features a comprehensive selection of amenities, including a souvenir shop, restaurant, children's playroom, computer room, business area, and first-class seating. The scenery along the way is breathtaking, with small islands constantly visible, seagulls flying around the mast, and with luck, dolphins. Combined with the azure blue sky and sea, the scenery is breathtaking.

Fun Fact: The ferries were first manufactured in Germany and can accommodate up to 400 cars at once, which is truly amazing!

The Butchart Gardens

Butchart Gardens, a renowned National Historic Site of Canada with over a century of history, is a family-owned

garden. Construction began in 1904, and through generations of dedicated effort, it has become a remarkable achievement in horticultural art. It is the second-largest garden in the world, attracting over 500,000 visitors annually. In March, fields of daisies, pansies, and periwinkles bloom; in April and May, tulips bloom in every corner of the garden. From late May, the rose garden becomes the centerpiece of summer, with peonies also showcasing their beauty. In July and August, the gardens host nightly fireworks displays, accompanied by open-air stages and musical performances, ensuring every visitor enjoys their stay. The gardens also boast rare blue poppies.

Chinatown Victoria

The Chinatown in Victoria is the oldest Chinatown in Canada and the second oldest in North America after San Francisco's. Now, Victoria Chinatown is surrounded by different cultural entertainment venues, as well as being an important venue by itself. Chinatown is also conveniently a few minutes' walk away from other tour sites, such as the Save-On-Foods Memorial Centre, Bay Centre, Empress Hotel, Market Square, and other significant sites.

Victoria Inner Harbour

The Victoria Harbor, including the Inner Harbor, is one of the most beautiful harbors in the world. The harbor has a long-standing history, starting with its first use by the First Nations. Recreational vessels and small cruise ships can be seen in the center of this famous heritage city, just a few steps away from its historic streets and distinctive architecture.

Victoria Mile Zero Monument

Located in the picturesque Beacon Hill Park in British Columbia's capital, Mile 0 is one of the symbolic starting points of the Trans-Canada Highway on the Pacific Coast. The highway, conceived in the late 1940s and constructed between 1950 and 1971, was the longest uninterrupted highway in the world at the time of its completion. Spanning a whopping 4,860 miles (7,821 kilometers), it runs across all 10 of Canada's provinces, crossing the Rocky Mountains and the wide-open prairies of central Canada.

Day 3

Vancouver - Vehicle - Kamloops - Vehicle - Spahats Falls - Vehicle - Valemount

All day

Departing Vancouver this morning, we'll drive along the scenic Fraser Valley Highway to Hope, the gold rush town featured in Sylvester Stallone's film "Rambo," a must-see for prospectors. We'll then travel to Kamloops, a semi-desert city renowned for its ginseng production. We'll visit a ginseng plantation and processing facility to learn

about ginseng cultivation and its therapeutic benefits, and even have the opportunity to sample authentic ginseng tea. We'll then proceed to Separate Falls. While not as picturesque as Huangguoshu Falls or as majestic as Niagara Falls, it remains a natural wonder, shaped by over 400,000 years of glacial and volcanic activity. We'll spend the night in Valemount.

Vancouver → **Hope** (30 mins) → **Kamloops** → **Kamloops Ginseng Factory** (45 mins) → **Spahats Falls** (30 mins) → **Valemount**

All day

Hope

Hope town is the perfect place to walk around and explore. It is filled with beautiful nature views and have an experience of instant relaxation. Take a look at all that this town has to offer.

Kamloops Ginseng Factory

The largest producer of American ginseng in North America was originally in the United States, and Kamloops later began to grow American ginseng. Because Kamloops has unpolluted fertile soil and a semi-desert dry climate, it has become the largest producer of American ginseng in North America and is known as the "Ginseng Capital". It has a long history and culture of Aboriginal people, with a total of 17 Aboriginal tribal communities, making it the most important Aboriginal community in the interior of British Columbia.

Spahats Falls

Volcanic rock deposits left behind centuries ago formed the cake-shaped gorge of Separhat Falls, making it one of the most dramatic waterfalls in Wells Gray National Park. Take a stroll through the cool hemlock and cedar forests and see the waterfall cascading through a keyhole in the rock face 80 meters above the Clearwater River. It's absolutely spectacular!

Day 4

Valemount - Vehicle - **Mount Robson Provincial Park** - Vehicle - **Maligne Lake**

All day

Depart from Valemount in the morning and enter Mount Robson Provincial Park. As British Columbia's oldest provincial park, Mount Robson is not only a UNESCO World Heritage site, but also the starting point of the Fraser

River's 1,368-kilometer journey to the Pacific Ocean. Then enter the town of Jasper and experience the unique charm of this town located in the national park. Next we will take a cruise on Maligne Lake, the world's second largest glacial lake and the only lake in the Rocky Mountains that is open to motor boats. After the tour, return to the hotel to rest.

Itinerary:

Valemount → Mount Robson Provincial Park (30 mins) → Town of Jasper (30 mins) → Maligne Lake Cruise (Optional, 90 mins) → Hotel

Morning

Mount Robson Provincial Park

Mount Robson Provincial Park, the second oldest park in British Columbia's park system, is truly one of the world's crown jewels. The mountain for which the park is named guards the park's western entrance. At 3,954 meters, Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies, towers over the lesser surrounding peaks; winter or summer, this is one of the finest views in the Rocky Mountains.

Town of Jasper

Jasper is a small town located in the northernmost Rocky Mountains of Alberta, Canada, with a population of approximately 3,000. The town was built in 1822 and has all the public facilities here, including restaurants, hotels, train stations, bus stations, cinemas, post offices, schools, hospitals, etc. There are many such towns in North America, each with its own history and charm, but because Jasper is located in Canada's famous national park, this town is particularly popular with tourists.

Maligne Lake

Maligne Lake is the second largest glacial lake in the world and the only lake in the Rocky Mountains where motor boats can sail. The scenery around the lake is magnificent, with dense pine forests, lovely grasslands and flowers all over the mountains. There are many hiking trails along the lake. The Fairy Island in Maligne Lake is the most beautiful scenery in the entire Jasper Park and often appears in various travel books and scenic postcards.

Night

Hotel: Tonquin Inn; Chateau Jasper; similar

Day 5

Jasper National Park - Vehicle - Columbia Icefield - Vehicle - Peyto Lake - Vehicle - Banff Town

All day

Today's journey begins with a visit to Jasper National Park, one of Canada's renowned alpine national parks and the largest in the Canadian Rockies. This stunning landscape, rich in wildlife, and a UNESCO World Heritage site, is a UNESCO World Heritage site. We'll then enter the Rocky Mountain National Park complex and reach Athabasca Falls. While not the highest waterfall in the Rockies, the interplay of rivers makes it one of the most powerful and spectacular. We'll continue along the Icefields Parkway to the Columbia Glacier. Take a giant snowmobile to the 300- meter-deep Athabasca Glacier and experience firsthand the remains of the Second Ice Age. Next, we'll visit the 280- meter-high Glacier Glass Bridge, a glass bridge overlooking the Columbia Icefield, offering a close-up glimpse of one of the world's most unique ecosystems. We'll then visit Peyto Lake, where the waters of this glacial lake are tinged with a Tiffany blue hue due to mineral deposits at the bottom. This jewel-like, shimmering water, nestled peacefully amidst the surrounding mountains, promises a truly spectacular viewing experience. We'll arrive in Banff in the evening.

Itinerary:

Hotel → Jasper National Park → Athabasca Falls (30 mins) → Columbia Icefield (3 hours, Includes Ice Explore and Icefield Skywalk) → Peyto Lake (30 mins) → Banff Town

Catch the iconic “Golden Mountain” glow and picture-perfect lake reflections at sunset with gorgeous layered light and shadow, and keep an eye out for wild elk, bighorn sheep and even bears along the way for unforgettable natural surprises.

All day

Jasper National Park

Jasper National Park spans 4,200 square miles (10,878 square km) and contains significant active geologic processes, scenic mountains, along with diverse animal and plant populations. When Jasper was first protected as a forest park in 1907, it covered an area of approximately 5,000 square miles (12,950 square km). In 1930 it was declared a national park with its present size. It was designated part of UNESCO's Canadian Rocky Mountain Parks World Heritage site in 1984.

Athabasca Falls

Located in Jasper National Park, Athabasca Falls is a waterfall formed in the upper reaches of the Athabasca River. It is known as the most breathtaking waterfall in the Rocky Mountains. Athabasca Falls is famous not only

for its height of 23 meters and the rushing water, but also because the waterfall water carries sand and stones and impacts the two banks with great force to form a pothole.

Columbia Icefield

The Columbia Glacier was formed in ancient times. It is located on the plateau and close to the North Pole. It is one of the 17 glaciers in the Rocky Mountains. It is a famous ancient ice sheet relic in the world and a great watershed between the Pacific Ocean, the Atlantic Ocean and the Arctic Ocean. The Columbia Glacier provides clean water and fresh air for the entire North America, and affects the ecological environment of animals and plants.

Columbia Icefield Adventure — Ice Explore

Check in at the Glacier Discovery Centre and take a shuttle to the Icefield Transfer Station to board a large Glacier Explorer built specifically for glacier travel.

Columbia Icefield Skywalk

Explore the immense powers of glaciology from a fully accessible, cliff-edge walkway that leads to a glass-floored observation platform 280 m (918 ft) above the Sunwapta Valley. From ice-capped mountain peaks to vast glacier-formed valleys, the Columbia Icefield Skywalk is your front-row seat to nature's most grand performance.

Peyto Lake

Peyto Lake is a popular sightseeing spot! It is a glacier-fed lake in Banff National Park in the Canadian Rockies. The lake itself is near the Icefields Parkway. During the summer, a significant amount of glacial rock flour flows into the lake from a nearby glacier. The suspended rock particles are what give the lake a unique bright, turquoise color. Due to its bright color, photos of the lake often appear in illustrated books.

Night

Day 6

All day

In the morning, we will say goodbye to Banff Town. We will take the Banff Sulphur Mountain Gondola and look out over the majestic Hot Springs Chateau Hotel, and enjoy the beautiful scenery of Banff Town and the Rocky Mountains. Then we will go to Lake Louise Village, which is surrounded by towering snow-capped mountains and quiet forests. It is an ideal place to enjoy rest and food. You can arrange lunch flexibly according to your personal preferences. Then we will go to Lake Louise, known as the "Rocky Mountain Sapphire", to feel the tranquility and beauty. Then we will check in at another glacial lake in Banff, Moraine Lake, with its calm waters rippling with blue waves. After the tour, we will pass through Glacier National Park and enjoy the excellent scenery of the Glacier Valley. Overnight in Grizzlytown/Salmon Bay.

Itinerary:

Banff → Banff Gondola (60 mins) → Lake Louise Village (Optional Lunch) → Lake Louise (90 mins) → Moraine Lake (30 mins) → Revelstoke/Salmon Arm

Tips:

The opening hours of Menglian Lake are from June to mid-October; if the attraction is not open by then, this attraction will be cancelled and the visiting hours of Lake Louise will be increased accordingly.

Town of Banff

Banff is a small town within Banff National Park in Alberta, Canada. It is one of Canada's most popular tourist destinations. It is known for its mountainous environment and hot springs, and is a popular destination for outdoor activities and hiking, biking, climbing, and skiing.

Banff Gondola

It only takes 8 minutes to reach the top of Sulphur Mountain, 2,281 meters high, by taking the Banff Gondola. At the top, you can enjoy a 360-degree panoramic view of Banff National Park, Banff Town and the Bow River Valley, and take in the unparalleled beauty of the Rocky Mountains. There is a restaurant and interactive experience hall on the top of the mountain. From new restaurants and interactive exhibits to multi-sensory theaters and amazing 360-degree observation decks, the new Banff Gondola experience allows you to gain a richer sensory experience.

Lake Louise

Lake Louise, located on the south side of Highway 1, is a famous attraction in Banff National Park. With Mount Victoria as its barrier and surrounded by dense forests, the mountains and waters are interdependent, forming a perfect landscape photo. Lake Louise is like a pearl, otherworldly and otherworldly, so it is known as the "Sapphire in the Rocky Mountains" and has become a lake favored by photographers.

Moraine Lake

Moraine Lake is a glacial lake in Banff National Park in Canada. It is located in the famous Valley of the Ten Peaks. The bottom of the lake is filled with mineral-rich gravel. Over the years, the sedimentation has formed ever-changing blue water. It is recognized as the most photographed lake in the world. The lake surface is sapphire blue and crystal clear, like a shining pearl.

Morning

Okanagan Lake

Okanagan Lake, also known as Lake Okanagan, is located in the Okanagan Valley in British Columbia, southwestern Canada. It is the source lake of the Okanagan River, a tributary of the Columbia River. The lake is long and narrow, with an area of 351 square kilometers. According to legend among the local indigenous Indians, there is a water monster called Ogopogo in the lake. The air here is dry, the four seasons are distinct, and the climate and environment are unique, making it a tourist destination suitable for all seasons.

Grizzli Winery/Summer Hill Winery

The winery is rooted in the heart of Canada's Okanagan region. Surrounded by mountains and lakes, with long sunshine and large temperature differences between day and night, unique wines are created here. Here, you can taste red and white wines and buy world-famous Canadian ice wine.
