

# Cabo da Roca

Cabo da Roca is a cape which forms the westernmost point of the Sintra Mountain Range, of mainland Portugal. It is situated in Sintra, near Azóia, in the southwest of the district of Lisbon. Interestingly, the point includes a lighthouse that has been operating since 1772.

#### Padrão dos Descobrimentos

Padrão dos Descobrimentos is a monument on the northern bank of the Tagus River estuary, in the civil parish of Santa Maria de Belém. Located alongside the river where ships departed to explore and trade with India and the Orient; the monument celebrates the Portuguese Age of Discovery (or Age of Exploration) during the 15th and 16th centuries.

#### **Jerónimos Monastery**

Let's take an outside look at the beautiful Jerónimos Monastery! It is an outstanding monastery dedicated to the order of Saint Jerome! It is an important symbol of Portugal's power and wealth during the Age of Discovery.

#### **Belém Tower**

Belém Tower, officially the Tower of Saint Vincent is a 16th-century fortification located in Lisbon. It once served as a point of embarkation and disembarkation for Portuguese explorers and as a ceremonial gateway to Lisbon. It was built during the height of the Portuguese Renaissance and is a prominent example of the Portuguese Manueline style. It also incorporates hints of other architectural styles. The structure was built from lioz limestone and is composed of a bastion, a 30-metre (98.4 ft), four-storey tower. Since 1983, the tower has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one that you must discover.

#### Rossio

The Rossio is located in the Pombaline Downtown of Lisbon and has been one of its main squares since the Middle Ages. It has been the setting of popular revolts and celebrations, bullfights, and executions. It is now a preferred meeting place of Lisbon natives and tourists alike. The current name of the Rossio pays homage to Pedro IV, King of Portugal.

#### Avenida da Liberdade

Avenida da Liberdade is an important boulevard in central Lisbon, Portugal. Famous as one of the most expensive shopping streets in Europe this is a must-see location. It has since become one of the most prestigious addresses in Portugal and one of Europe's most popular luxury shopping destinations! It is home to a number of luxury stores,

boutiques, and hotels.

Due to its well-preserved old town centre, still partially enclosed by medieval walls, and many monuments dating from various historical periods, including a Roman Temple, Évora is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Plaza de España

The Plaza de España is a spectacle of light and majesty. Framed in the María Luisa Park, this plaza was designed by the great Seville architect Aníbal González as an emblematic space for the 1929 Ibero-American Expo. The result was a plaza-palace unique in the world. Its proportions are lavish. It has a total area of 50,000 square metres, without a doubt one of the most imposing plazas in Spain.

Alcázar of Seville

The Royal Alcázars of Seville, historically known as al-Qasr al-Muriq and commonly known as the Alcázar of Seville, is a royal palace in Seville, Spain, built for the Christian king Peter of Castile. The palace is a preeminent example of Mudéjar style in the Iberian Peninsula, combining Romanesque, Gothic, and Renaissance structural elements. It was registered in 1987 by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, along with the adjoining Seville Cathedral and the General Archive of the Indies.

**Seville Cathedral** 

The Cathedral of Saint Mary of the See, better known as Seville Cathedral, is a Roman Catholic cathedral in Seville,

Andalusia, Spain. It was registered in 1987 by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, along with the adjoining Alcázar palace

complex and the General Archive of the Indies. It is the fourth-largest church in the world as well as the largest Gothic

church.

**Tower of Gold** 

The Torre del Oro (English: "Tower of Gold") is a dodecagonal military watchtower in Seville, southern Spain. It was

erected by the Almohad Caliphate in order to control access to Seville via the Guadalquivir river. Its name comes from

the golden shine it projected on the river, due to its building materials (a mixture of mortar, lime and pressed hay).

Flamenco Dance Show

Flamenco dance (baile) is a highly-expressive, Spanish dance form. The flamenco is a solo dance characterized by hand

clapping, percussive footwork, and intricate hand, arm, and body movements. The dance is usually accompanied by a

singer and guitar player.

The Ronda Bullring was built at the end of the eighteenth century and is one of the most popular monuments in Andalusia

# Mijas

The white capital of the burro-taxi. The municipality of Mijas in the Costa del Sol is one of the most beautiful villages in Andalucía, a village nestled in the mountains keeping the typical charm of the white Andalusian villages.

# **Albaycin**

Albaicin is the old Moorish quarter of the city. It's located on a hill facing the Alhambra and there are dramatic views of this area from the palace's famous rose gardens. In the 13th century, the Moors fled to Granada and re-settled on the northern part of the hill, creating a suburb which took on the name of their former home. The Albaicin became a UNESCO World Heritige site in 1994.

#### Alhambra Palace

The Alhambra is a palace and fortress complex located in Granada, Andalusia, Spain. The complex was begun in 1238 by Muhammad I Ibn al-Ahmar, the first Nasrid emir. It is now one of Spain's major tourist attractions, exhibiting the country's most significant and well-known Islamic architecture, together with 16th-century and later Christian building and garden interventions. The Alhambra is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

#### Cordoba

Cordoba is home to notable examples of Moorish architecture such as the Mezquita-Catedral, which was named as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984.

#### **Mosque-Cathedral of Cordoba**

The Mosque-Cathedral of Cordoba is arguably the most significant monument in the whole of the western Moslem World and one of the most amazing buildings in the world in its own right. The complete evolution of the Omeyan style in Spain can be seen in its different sections, as well as the Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque styles of the Christian part. It was designated as a World Heritage Site in 1984.

Puerta del Sol

The Puerta del Sol is a public square in Madrid, one of the best known and busiest places in entire the city. This is the center (Km 0) of the radial network of Spanish roads. The square also contains the famous clock whose bells mark the traditional eating of the Twelve Grapes and the beginning of a new year!

Plaza Mayor

The Plaza Mayor is a major public space in the heart of Madrid, the capital of Spain. It was once the centre of Old Madrid. It was first built (1580–1619) during the reign of Philip III. Only a few blocks away is another famous plaza, the Puerta del Sol. The Plaza Mayor is a space for the people of Madrid and tourists to shop, walk around, eat, and enjoy the outdoors.

**Market of San Miguel** 

More than 100 years have gone by since the Mercado de San Miguel opened its doors as a wholesale food market. Today, this historical building stands out as one of the world's main gastronomic markets. It allows visitors to experience the essence and most significant flavors of every corner of Spain.

El Corte Inglés

Grab a new outfit and shop at El Corte Inglés, in Madrid! It is the biggest department store group in Europe and ranks third worldwide. El Corte Inglés is Spain's only remaining department store chain and one that you must definitely have to check out for yourself!

#### Zaragoza

Zaragoza is the capital city of the Zaragoza Province and stands next to one of the most important rivers in Spain known as the Ebro. The city is famous for its delicious local cuisines and landmarks such as the Basílica del Pilar, La Seo Cathedral and the Aljafería Palace. Together with La Seo and the Aljafería, several other buildings form part of the Mudéjar Architecture of Aragon which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

# **Columbus Monument**

One of the most iconic monuments in the city is the Columbus Monument. It stands at the end of Barcelona's Rambla, near the sea. This major landmark on the Rambla was built in 1888 for the Universal Exhibition as a tribute to Christopher Columbus, who chose to disembark in the port of Barcelona on his return from America. In its top, dominating the sky of Barcelona, the statue of Christopher Columbus holding a navigational chart in his left hand, and pointing to the route to America with his right.

#### **Palau Nacional**

The Palau Nacional is a building on the hill of Montjuïc in Barcelona. It was the main site of the 1929 International Exhibition. It was designed by Eugenio Cendoya and Enric Catà under the supervision of Pere Domènech i Roura. Since 1934 it has been home to the National Art Museum of Catalonia. With a ground surface of 32,000 m2, the Spanish Renaissance-inspired building has a rectangular floor plan flanked by two side and one rear square sections, with an elliptical dome in the centre.

The Olympic Harbour is a marina located in Barcelona, Catalonia. Located east of the Port of Barcelona, it hosted the sailing events for the 1992 Summer Olympics. The venue was opened in 1991.

# Sagrada Família

Designed by the Spanish architect Antoni Gaudí (1852–1926), his work on the building is part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. On 7 November 2010, Pope Benedict XVI consecrated the church and proclaimed it as a minor basilica.

Parc Güell

Take a walk through the lovely Parc Güell! It is a public park system composed of gardens and architectural elements located on Carmel Hill, in Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain. The park was built from 1900 to 1914 and was officially opened

as a public park in 1926. In 1984, UNESCO declared the park a World Heritage Site under "Works of Antoni Gaudí".

Paseo de Gracia

Take a walk along the Passeig de Gràcia! It is one of the major avenues in Barcelona (Catalonia) and is one of the most

important shopping and business areas! It contains several of the city's most celebrated pieces of architecture.

Casa Milà

Casa Milà the last private residence designed by architect Antoni Gaudí and was built between 1906 and 1912. At the
