### **Matanuska Glacier Hiking Experience**

In the morning, the hotel gathers and departs by car to Matanuska Glacier for a **Glacier Hiking Experience** (about 2 hours) led by a professional guide. The Matanuska Glacier, Alaska's largest accessible glacier, is classified as a valley glacier, which, by its own gravity, is like a river covering the valley, winding north from the Chugachi Mountains to the Glen Highway, the most popular roadside attraction between Anchorage and Glenalton. About 10,000 years ago, the Matanuska Glacier began to retreat to its present position, and has not changed significantly in nearly two decades. Due to the geomorphological characteristics of the valley glaciers, the Matanuska Glacier is ideal for many glacier hikers due to its geomorphological characteristics, which make it more prone to sunny weather in winter than in the surrounding area. And this area is one of the most spectacular and breathtaking in Alaska because of the addition of glaciers and sheep mountains.

If you need to depart Anchorage on the same day, please book your flight for no earlier than 09:00pm, to avoid risking missing your flight.

#### **Tips:**

- 1) It is recommended to wear a warm down jacket, velvet jacket, hat, scarf, anti-ski boots, sunglasses, etc. , pay attention to the safety of your feet.
- 2) Be sure to comply with the guide requirements during the walk and sign the disclaimer required by the Park Service.
- 3) Free walking equipment such as helmets and non-slip shoe chains.

## **Day 3**

### **Anchorage - Train - Fairbanks**

All day

From the hotel in the morning, you'll take the **Alaska Aurora Winter Train\*** northbound to Fairbanks (08:30-20:00), Aurora Winter Train are very popular in the area and only travel on weekends, passing through the Alaska Mountains, Mount Denali, which travels at a slow speed that makes you relaxed and relaxed to enjoy the gold-and-gold along the way Magnificent views. Fairbanks is a transportation hub for expeditions deep into Alaska's interior and the Arctic Circle, and the world's best place to see the Northern Lights, with more than 243 days of clear night sky to observe during the year, and because it is only 310 kilometers from the Arctic Circle and is bordered by mountain barriers, it avoids bad weather, so Northern Lights hunters gather in the city where the Northern Lights are most easily observed. Check-in and a short break upon arrival, during which you can prepare for the northern lights observations at night.

At 10 pm, to escape the urban light pollution, take the **Aurora Shuttle** to our carefully selected **Aurora-Viewing Lodge**, in an excellent location that will increase your chances of observing the Northern Lights. Our professional guides will

introduce you to the Northern Lights and instruct you in camera parameter set-up and aurora borealis shooting techniques to help you take stunning aurora photos. Free hot drinks, coffee, cookies and a Northern Lights monitoring screen are available in the cabin, where you can warm up after watching the aurora (**1st Aurora Viewing, include cost**). You will return to the hotel to rest at around 2 am the next morning.

Fairbanks, Alaska's second-largest city, with a population of 100,000, is a transportation hub for expeditions deep into Alaska's interior and Arctic Circle. It is also the world's best place to see the Northern Lights! Make your dreams come true by visiting the beauty of Fairbanks! Plus, with more than 243 days of clear night skies each year you are very likely to catch at least one.

At 10 pm, to escape the urban light pollution, take the Aurora Shuttle to our carefully selected **Aurora-Viewing Lodge**, where you can stay warm while waiting for the Northern Lights to appear. Our professional guides will introduce you to the Northern Lights and instruct you in camera parameter set-up and aurora borealis shooting techniques to help you take stunning aurora photos. You will return to the hotel to rest at around 2 am the next morning.

## **Day 4**

**Fairbanks - Vehicle - Santa Claus House - Vehicle - Museum of the North - Vehicle - Fairbanks**

All day

Today you'll enjoy a leisurely morning at the hotel. You will depart at 1 pm for the famous "Santa Claus House" in the town of **North Pole**, which, in order to create a strong Christmas atmosphere in Santa's hometown, features a huge 16-meter-tall santa statue and 2-meter-tall polar bear and moose statues. Many of the surrounding public facilities are also decorated in a Christmas theme. Later, you'll follow your guide to the **Museum of the North** on the University of Alaska's Fairbanks campus, the best place for visitors to discover the mysterious Arctic world and the real life of early locals. With its unique architecture, the museum is one of Fairbanks' landmarks. The museum is divided into different exhibition halls, which not only give a detailed introduction to the local environment and history, but also display some rare arctic animal specimens ("Blue Babe", mammoth bones, a nearly 3-meter-tall brown bear, etc.). Afterwards you will return to the hotel for a rest. (If the Museum is closed, you will visit the Morris Thompson Cultural Center and be refunded your \$15 Museum of the North ticket fee on site).

At 10 pm, to escape the urban light pollution, take the **Aurora Shuttle** to our carefully selected Aurora-Viewing Lodge, in an excellent location that will increase your chances of observing the Northern Lights. Our professional guides will introduce you to the Northern Lights and instruct you in camera parameter set-up and aurora borealis shooting techniques to help you take stunning aurora photos. Free hot drinks, coffee, cookies and a Northern Lights monitoring screen are available in the cabin, where you can warm up after watching the aurora (**2nd Aurora Viewing, include cost**). You will return to the hotel to rest at around 2 am the next morning.

**Options: Dog Sledding Adventure** (approximately 2 hours total)

### **Dog Sledding Adventure**

Visit Alaskan local Leslie's sled dog kennel. Income from tours allows Leslie to continue the grand tradition of dog sledding by training young mushers and helping them raise funds to compete in the annual Alaskan dog sled races that have become so popular all over the world. Two passengers in the sled husband's company to ride the same sled, sledding in the forest road, splashing white snowflakes, the process is quite thrilling (experience about 20-25 minutes)! While waiting for a ride, you'll also have the opportunity to get up close and personal with cute dogs. (From September to early November, in case of insufficient snowfall, the dog sled will be replaced by a dog pull ATV experience, about 10min.)

## **Day 5**

### **Fairbanks**

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All day

At 10 pm, to escape the urban light pollution, take the **Aurora Shuttle** to the surrounding area outside Fairbanks. Our professional guides will take you to the most favorable spot to observe the aurora according to the weather conditions and their rich experience in tracking the aurora. Our professional guides will also introduce you to the Northern Lights and instruct you in camera parameter set-up and aurora borealis shooting techniques to help you take stunning aurora photos (**3rd Aurora Viewing, include cost**). You will return to the hotel to rest at around 2 am the next morning.

- 2. Castner Glacier Ice Cave Tour** (approximately 8 hours round trip)

### **Chena Hot Springs Resort Tour**

Depart from your hotel around 11 am and travel to Chena Hot Springs Resort, famous for its century-old hot spring, interesting ice sculpture museum, and an advanced renewable energy project, making it one of the must-see attractions for almost every visitor to Fairbanks! You can relax in the outdoor natural hot springs, a particularly incredible experience when the surroundings are snow-covered. You will also have the opportunity to visit the year-round ice sculpture museum (at additional expense), which exhibits the work of world-class ice sculpture champions, including tables, chairs, and so on all made of ice. Those interested can visit the ice bar to sample an Apple Martini in a cocktail glass made of ice (at additional expense, must show ID and be at least 21 years old).

#### **Notes:**

- 1) You must wear a bathing suit in the hot springs, please prepare in advance.
- 2) For safety reasons, minors under age 18 may not enter the outdoor natural rock pool, but they may use the indoor pool and the outdoor hot tub.
- 3) If you choose not to enter the hot springs for your own reasons, the fee is not refundable.

or

### **Castner Glacier Ice Cave Tour**

Depart from your hotel in the morning and drive south along Richardson Expressway to Castner Glacier Ice Cave. The scenery along the road is beautiful. After getting off the car, you will follow the guide for about 2 miles to reach the largest valley ice cave in North America. This place is located in the east of Alaska Mountains, connected with the Castner Glacier, and you can feel its huge and profoundness only when you visit the ice cave mouth. The blue ice cave can be called the miraculous work of nature. The whole cave body is covered with ice layer accumulated for ten thousand years, which is crystal clear. Because the ice layer and mountain minerals have been infiltrating each other for years, the charming orchid ice layer occasionally appears like a metal texture, which is as beautiful and elegant as gold inlaid jade. While experiencing the stunning visual here, you can also experience the collision between nature and human beings in the long history.

#### **Notes:**

1. There are no meteorological facilities in the Castner Glacier Ice Cave area, so it is impossible to judge the local weather conditions in advance. If the ice cave cannot be reached successfully due to weather reasons after arrival, no fee will be refunded.

2. When Fairbanks leaves, if it is not suitable to drive due to the road condition warning, the trip of the day will be cancelled and the original route will be refunded.
3. The Castner Glacier Ice Cave is a natural landscape with certain risks. Please follow the requirements of the professional guide during the whole process!

or

### **Denali National Park Walking Tour**

Depart from your hotel around 10 am and travel by car to Denali. The drive from Fairbanks to Denali is very beautiful, with views of the magnificent Alaska Range mountains to the South, and colorful forest flanking the road. If you are lucky, you may even see some wildlife on the way. Denali National Park is one of the longest-protected ecological preserves in the world. Weather permitting, your guide will take you on a short hike in the park.

- 3. Aurora-Viewing Lodge Or Aurora Chasing** (approximately 4 hours round trip):

All day

### **Overland Adventure Across the Arctic Circle**



Depart in the morning and take an arctic arctic bus along **the Dalton Highway**, one of Alaska's most remote and challenging roads. The whole road is 414 miles long, and is one of the world's "Ten Roads of Death." On the way you can observe the arctic tundra wilderness, with the possibility of seeing wildlife such as caribou, foxes, wolves, bears, or musk ox. You'll also pass over one of North America's five largest rivers, **the Yukon River**, and see an incredible product of human engineering, **the Trans-Alaska Pipeline**, which crosses the state from north to south. Finally, you will arrive at the sign indicating you've reached the Arctic Circle (66°33' north), and receive a special "**Arctic Circle Exploration Certificate**" to remember your trip. You'll return to Fairbanks between 2 to 3 am. If you need to depart Fairbanks the following day, please book your flight for no earlier than 7 am, to avoid risking missing your flight.

### **Fly Over the Arctic Circle Adventure**

Start by going to the airport to take a small sightseeing plane to the town of Coldfoot. From the plane you'll get majestic bird's-eye views of the snow-covered tundra. Upon arrival, you can send a postcard to your friends and family at the **Arctic Post Office** in Coldfoot. In the afternoon you'll return to Fairbanks via the famous **Dalton Highway** on a specially-equipped arctic bus. On the way, visit the **Trans-Alaska Pipeline**, **the Yukon River**, and the Alaska **Arctic Circle** (66°33' north) marker, where you will receive an "**Arctic Circle Exploration Certificate**". You'll return to Fairbanks between 2 to 3 am.

### **Aurora Viewing Cabin or Aurora Chasing**

At 10 pm, to escape the urban light pollution, take the Aurora Shuttle to our carefully selected **Aurora-Viewing Lodge**, where you can stay warm while waiting for the Northern Lights to appear. Our professional guides will introduce you to the Northern Lights and instruct you in camera parameter set-up and aurora borealis shooting techniques to help you take stunning aurora photos. If you choose the **Aurora Chasing**, we will go to the surrounding area of Fairbanks by car and follow the guide to find the northern lights. You will return to the hotel to rest at around 2 am the next morning.

## **Day 7**

### **Fairbanks - Vehicle - Home**

Ice fishing is a winter favorite for Alaskans. You'll learn fishing skills from a fishing expert. After catching the fish, the guide will also process a grilled fish for each guest on site, allowing you to taste the freshest fish, and then release the extra fish back to the snow lake.

4. If you do not provide our company with your correct flight information in time, and as a result we do not have a car and staff member available, we reserve the right to refuse any free airport pick-up or drop-off service originally offered. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.
5. Alaska fire code does not permit adding extra beds in hotel rooms. All hotel rooms have either one or two beds.
6. This product is priced as a package tour. If you are unable to participate in some of the tour activities or unable to use any part of the itinerary or included services, we are unable to give any refunds.

### Notes for Participation:

1. This tour requires you to bring a photo ID, such as a foreign passport with an American visa, or an American driver's license.
2. The sequence of activities in this tour itinerary is subject to change based on the tour departure date, weather conditions, etc., but the content of the tour will not change. The sequence in the above itinerary is provided for reference only, and may not match your final itinerary.
3. If there are discrepancies between any time stated in the itinerary and the time given by your guide, please meet at the time your guide has informed you of.
4. Different guides are assigned to each day tour, so each day you will have a different guide leading your tour.
5. While observing the aurora, in order to avoid affecting the experience of others, please **do not** use flash photography.

7. On the Dalton Highway lingering in the middle of the road is strictly prohibited. Guests must take responsibility for
