Tour introduction

Day 1

Seattle - Vehicle - Olympia - Vehicle - Portland - Vehicle - Columbia River Gorge

All day

Starting from Seattle in the morning, we will first visit the Washington State Capitol Building in the capital city of Olympia. Then we will go to Portland, its climate is marked by warm, dry summers and cool, rainy winters. This climate is ideal for growing roses, and Portland has been called the "City of Roses" for over a century. And later we will travel to Columbia River Gorge in 40 miles to the east of Portland. And our last stop will be the capital city of the State of Washington – Olympia, to see the state house.

Itinerary:

Seattle → Olympia → Washington Capital State House (Outside Visit, 30 mins) → **Portland → The Grotto** (30 mins) → **Pittock Mansion** (Mandatory, 45 mins) → **International Rose Test Garden** (40 mins) → **Columbia River Gorge** → **Multnomah Falls** (60 mins) → **Bradford Island Visitor Center** (Mandatory, 40 mins) → **Hotel**

All day

Washington State Capitol Building

Home to the State Legislature, the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, and Treasurer for the state of Washington, this building is American Neoclassical in design. The State Supreme Court building and the Governor's Mansion are also on this campus.

The Grotto

An internationally renowned Catholic sanctuary set among 62 acres of botanical gardens, offering a place of peace and quiet reflection for all people. More than 100 beautiful statues, reflection ponds, and views offer inspiration to all who visit.

Pittock Mansion

The Pittock Mansion is a French Renaissance-style château in the West Hills of Portland, Oregon, USA. The mansion was originally built in 1909 as a private home for London-born Oregonian publisher Henry Pittock and his wife, Georgiana.

International Rose Test Garden

One of Portland's nicknames is the City of Roses, and this town has long been an incubator for the scented beauties. Nearly a century ago, a farsighted citizen convinced the local government to set up a rose test garden during World War I to preserve the species of European roses that might be decimated by the bombings.

Columbia River Gorge

The Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area protects the spectacular canyon where the Columbia River cuts through the Cascade mountains - with cliffs and overlooks of Washington to the north and Oregon's mountains and waterfalls to the south. The Gorge is unique in its natural and cultural history, as well as its designation as a National Scenic Area.

Multnomah Falls

Arrived at Multnomah Falls in beautiful Oregon! It is part of the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area which is a protected area that covers land in both Washington and Oregon. There are spectacular views where the river cuts through mountains and forests to create awesome cliffs, canyons, and waterfalls!

Bradford Island Visitor Center

In order to make salmon migration from the sea to freshwater lake to lay eggs, in every migratory season the salmon

will skip the section 21 ladder all the way, across the height of the dam, then into the lake.

Winter Itinerary (Winter Itinerary from 10/15/2024):

Portland, Oregon's largest city, sits on the Columbia and Willamette rivers, in the shadow of snow-capped Mount Hood. It's known for its parks, bridges and bicycle paths, as well as for its eco-friendliness and its microbreweries and coffeehouses.

Pioneer Courthouse Square → Japanese American Historical Plaza (You will see the Steel Bridge.) → Waterfront Park (You will see the Hawthorne Bridge.) → RoseQuarter (outside visit)

All day

Crater Lake National Park

Upon arrival, we will see the deepest lake in the United States and enjoy the beautiful scenery. The lake was formed after the collapse of Mount Mazama - an ancient volcano that erupted approximately 7,700 years ago, the length of lake is 6 miles and width is 4 miles with a depth of 1932 feet.

Portland In-depth City Tour

After breakfast, we'll go to Pioneer Courthouse Square, also known as Portland's living room, is a public space occupying a full 40,000-square-foot city block in the center of downtown Portland. We will visit the Japanese American Historical Plaza, we will see the Steel Bridge, Hawthorne Bridge. And later we will visit RoseQuarter(outside visit). The Grotto is a Catholic shrine in Portland is in a cave on a cliff. The whole area takes up about 62 acres and features several thousand feet of trails, making this a peaceful place for a reflective walk.
