Santuário Nacional de Cristo Rei

Santuário Nacional de Cristo Rei is a landmark building in Lisbon, and also the best viewing platform for city scenery. The statue of Jesus was completed in 1959 and is located at one end of the "April 25" bridge, facing Lisbon. The artist Francisco Franco spent 10 years to complete the statue. The statue is just the same as the statue of Jesus in Rio de Janeiro, and it shows the power of faith and also witnesses the religious fanaticism of the people of the Iberian Peninsula.

Cabo da Roca

Cabo da Roca is a cape which forms the westernmost point of the Sintra Mountain Range, of mainland Portugal. It is situated in Sintra, near Azóia, in the southwest of the district of Lisbon. Interestingly, the point includes a lighthouse that has been operating since 1772.

Sintra

UNESCO has listed Sintra as a world heritage site, and has also created a special category for it: "landscape culture".

British romantic poet Byron praised it as a beautiful town of "brilliant Eden".

Palácio Nacional de Sintra

Palácio Nacional de Sintra is a well preserved medieval royal palace in Portugal. The palace combines Moorish and

Gothic architectural styles, and its big chimney is particularly striking. Before the establishment of Portuguese republic,

the palace was often used as the king's summer palace. There are many characteristic rooms in the palace, among

which the big swan hall is beautifully decorated, and 27 lifelike swans are depicted on the ceiling. There is also a

mermaid hall decorated with tiles, a Chinese hall for collecting ivory towers, and a badge hall decorated with beautiful

tile murals and noble badges. As a part of Sintra cultural landscape, the palace is listed as a world heritage site by

UNESCO.

Parque e Palácio Nacional da Pena

Parque e Palácio Nacional da Pena is the former residence for of the royal family. The palace itself is a hodgepodge of

many architectural styles, including Gothic, Renaissance, Moorish, and Manueline. Its success is attributed to Ferdinand

of saxe Coburg Gotha, husband of Portuguese Queen Maria II in the 19th century. This is not only a national historic site

of Portugal, but also one of the seven wonders of Portugal. In 1995, the Palace was listed as a world cultural heritage as

part of Sintra. Now it is frequently used in the state affairs activities of the President of Portugal and other government

officials.

Padrão dos Descobrimentos is a monument on the northern bank of the Tagus River estuary, in the civil parish of Santa Maria de Belém. Located alongside the river where ships departed to explore and trade with India and the Orient; the monument celebrates the Portuguese Age of Discovery (or Age of Exploration) during the 15th and 16th centuries.

Jerónimos Monastery

Let's take an outside look at the beautiful Jerónimos Monastery! It is an outstanding monastery dedicated to the order of Saint Jerome! It is an important symbol of Portugal's power and wealth during the Age of Discovery.

Belém Tower

Belém Tower, officially the Tower of Saint Vincent is a 16th-century fortification located in Lisbon. It once served as a point of embarkation and disembarkation for Portuguese explorers and as a ceremonial gateway to Lisbon. It was built during the height of the Portuguese Renaissance and is a prominent example of the Portuguese Manueline style. It also incorporates hints of other architectural styles. The structure was built from lioz limestone and is composed of a bastion, a 30-metre (98.4 ft), four-storey tower. Since 1983, the tower has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one that you must discover.

Rossio

The Rossio is located in the Pombaline Downtown of Lisbon and has been one of its main squares since the Middle Ages. It has been the setting of popular revolts and celebrations, bullfights, and executions. It is now a preferred meeting place of Lisbon natives and tourists alike. The current name of the Rossio pays homage to Pedro IV, King of Portugal.

Avenida da Liberdade

Avenida da Liberdade is an important boulevard in central Lisbon, Portugal. Famous as one of the most expensive shopping streets in Europe this is a must-see location. It has since become one of the most prestigious addresses in Portugal and one of Europe's most popular luxury shopping destinations! It is home to a number of luxury stores, boutiques, and hotels.

Caceres Ancient Town

Let's take a trip to visit Cáceres! Cáceres was declared a World Heritage City by UNESCO in 1986 because of the city's blend of Roman, Moorish, Northern Gothic, and Italian Renaissance architecture.

This major landmark on the Rambla was built in 1888 for the Universal Exhibition as a tribute to Christopher Columbus, who chose to disembark in the port of Barcelona on his return from America. In its top, dominating the sky of Barcelona, the statue of Christopher Columbus holding a navigational chart in his left hand, and pointing to the route to America with his right.

Palau Nacional

The Palau Nacional is a building on the hill of Montjuïc in Barcelona. It was the main site of the 1929 International Exhibition. It was designed by Eugenio Cendoya and Enric Catà under the supervision of Pere Domènech i Roura. Since 1934 it has been home to the National Art Museum of Catalonia. With a ground surface of 32,000 m2, the Spanish Renaissance-inspired building has a rectangular floor plan flanked by two side and one rear square sections, with an elliptical dome in the centre.

Lluís Companys Olympic Stadium

Landmark events such as the opening and closing ceremonies of the 1992 Barcelona Olympic and Paralympic Games and the athletics competitions were held in this venue, as the Museu Olímpic i de l'Esport across the road from the stadium reminds us. It is now rated as a five-star venue by UEFA, which entitles it to host top-level European matches. The stadium is named after Lluís Companys, the president of the Catalan government during the Spanish Civil War.

Montjuic Mountain

Olympic Harbour

The Olympic Harbour is a marina located in Barcelona, Catalonia. Located east of the Port of Barcelona, it hosted the sailing events for the 1992 Summer Olympics. The venue was opened in 1991.

consecrated the church and proclaimed it as a minor basilica.

Parc Güell

Take a walk through the lovely Parc Güell! It is a public park system composed of gardens and architectural elements located on Carmel Hill, in Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain. The park was built from 1900 to 1914 and was officially opened as a public park in 1926. In 1984, UNESCO declared the park a World Heritage Site under "Works of Antoni Gaudí".

Paseo de Gracia

Take a walk along the Passeig de Gràcia! It is one of the major avenues in Barcelona (Catalonia) and is one of the most important shopping and business areas! It contains several of the city's most celebrated pieces of architecture.

Casa Batlló

Casa Batlló is one of the two greatest buildings designed by Antoni Gaudí, and is considered one of his masterpieces. Like everything Gaudí designed, Casa Batlló is only identifiable as Modernisme or Art Nouveau in the broadest sense. The ground floor, in particular, has unusual tracery, irregular oval windows and flowing sculpted stonework. In 2005, Casa Batlló became an UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Casa Milà

Casa Milà the last private residence designed by architect Antoni Gaudí and was built between 1906 and 1912. At the time, it was controversial because of its undulating stone façade and twisting wrought iron balconies. In 1984, it was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.
