Today you will have a whole day in Tokyo, you can freely arrange your own day, the following is the recommended itinerary for your reference.

Line A:

Tokyo Disneyland or Tokyo DisneySea (Ticket at your own expense, about 6 hours)

Tokyo DisneySea is the world's first Disney theme park featuring stories and legends about the sea. Tokyo DisneySea is composed of seven themed seaports that give full play to the imagination and creativity. It is based on legends and stories about the sea from ancient and modern countries. Tokyo DisneySea is one of the most popular Disney parks in the world.

Line B:

Odaiba: Odaiba Seaside Park + Odaiba Venus Center + Odaiba Shopping Plaza (90 minutes of free time, you can have dinner here at your own expense)

Odaiba is located on the artificial land of Tokyo Bay. It is Tokyo's new leisure and entertainment center and shopping area. It is a very popular destination for younger people to explore. Explore the Fuji Television Building, Toyota Motor Museum, Funa no Science Museum, and Japan Science Mirai Museum which are all located here. Odaiba is also very popular with its huge Ferris wheel and abundant shopping and dining facilities. Odaiba Seaside Park has the only beach in Kyoto. Along the seaside you can not only enjoy the sea view, but also the Rainbow Bridge and Tokyo Tower. In front of the Odaiba Shopping Plaza stands a huge 1:1 Gundam Model of Mobile Suit, another unique landmark of Odaiba. Another cool place to see is the Daikanyama Tsutaya Bookstore. The Daikanyama Tsutaya Bookstore has been selected as "the most beautiful bookstore in the world." The Tsutaya Bookstore is partly composed of three buildings, among which Magazine Street is 55 meters long, divided by three buildings, and is used to distinguish six book categories.

Line C:

Harajuku: Harajuku is full of trendy brands. Together with Daikanyama and Shibuya, it is known as the representation of Tokyo street culture. It is one of the favorite places for young people to gather. It is also centered on Harajuku Station, located opposite of Takeshita Street, there are many department stores around, and all the attractions of food and shopping can be found. There are many young people in Tokyo wearing fancy clothes along the streets of Harajuku, making it a mecca for vintage lovers. Harajuku Subway Station is another interesting site to discover. It is a must-see for almost every visitor to Harajuku.

Shibuya: Shibuya is a commercial and entertainment district near the Shibuya Station. It ranks as one of the three major sub-centers of Tokyo alongside Shinjuku and Ikebukuro. It is one of the bustling districts in Tokyo. In this 24-hour block, there are various trendy and fashionable shops, restaurants, bars, entertainment centers and so much more! You can also often see performances by street bands. Take a special look at the bronze statue of Inuhachi!

Tokyo Disneyland

Tokyo Disneyland is a theme park based on the films produced by Walt Disney. It was opened in 1983 as the first Disney theme park outside of the United States. Modeled after Disneyland in California and the Magic Kingdom in Florida, Tokyo Disneyland is made up of seven themed lands and features seasonal decorations and parades.

or

Tokyo DisneySea

Tokyo DisneySea is a fantasy theme park in Tokyo Disney Resort that is unique to Japan. Inspired by the myths and legends of the sea, Tokyo DisneySea is made up of seven themed ports of call: Mediterranean Harbor, Mysterious Island, Mermaid Lagoon, Arabian Coast, Lost River Delta, Port Discovery and American Waterfront. While suitable for all ages, Tokyo DisneySea was designed to appeal to a more grown-up audience. The park addresses the Japanese visitors' strong interest in good food by providing a wider selection of restaurants than Tokyo Disneyland. They also serve alcoholic beverages, which are unavailable at the neighboring parks.

Odaiba

Odaiba is a popular shopping and entertainment district on a man-made island in Tokyo Bay. DiverCity Tokyo Plaza, this shopping, dining and entertainment complex opened in 2012 and features attractions related to the Gundam anime series, including a large, "life-size" Gundam statue in front of the building and Gundam Base Tokyo, a shop dedicated to plastic models.

or

Harajuku

Harajuku refers to the area around Tokyo's Harajuku Station, which is between Shinjuku and Shibuya on the Yamanote Line. It is the center of Japan's most extreme teenage culture and fashion styles. But, it also offers shopping for adults and some historical sites of interest to visit. Take a special look at the Takeshita Dori (Takeshita Street) and its side streets, which are lined by many trendy shops, fashion boutiques, stores, crepe stands and fast-food options.

Shibuya

Shibuya is a popular shopping and entertainment area found around Shibuya Station. In this regard, Shibuya is one of Tokyo's most colorful and busy districts, packed with shopping, dining and nightclubs. Shibuya is also a center for youth fashion and culture. Its streets are the birthplace to many of Japan's fashion and entertainment trends. Numerous department stores and shopping malls can be found around the area catering to all types of shoppers.

All day

After breakfast, we will go to Yokohama, the third largest city in Japan, we will first go to Yokohama Minato Mirai 21, a landmark building in Yokohama. Yokohama, represented by Mirai 21, is a leisurely and modern seaside city. There is not only the blue sea here, but also the horizon of Tokyo in the distance. The huge Ferris wheel and Mount Fuji are the tourist labels of Yokohama. Then take a bus to Yokohama Chinatown, the largest Chinatown in Japan and even in Asia. From unique Chinese-style buildings to restaurants and old streets with decades of history, the strong Chinese style will blow your face the moment you step into the street. Come here, all kinds of food are mouth-watering, come with us to find the local flavor! In the afternoon, head to Kamakura Komachi Street, the most popular commercial street in Kamakura. There are many shops on both sides of the street, which are very suitable for purchasing various souvenirs. Then go to visit Tsuruoka Hachimangu Shrine, one of the three major Hachiman Shrines in Japan, and check in the Kamakura Great Buddha in Kamakura Kotoku-in Temple. After years of baptism, the Bronze Buddha is still kind-hearted and has a Zen-like appearance. It is one of Japan's national treasures.

Morning

Yokohama Minato Mirai 21

Minato Mirai 21 is a seaside urban area located in central Yokohama whose name means "harbor of the future." It has many large high-rises, including the Landmark Tower, which was Japan's tallest building from 1993 until 2014. This area was a large shipyard until the 1980s, when development began to turn it into a new city center. Minato Mirai is blessed with a great location along the water for guests to view. Visitors to the area will be able to find shopping centers, hotels, a convention center, an amusement park, a relaxation center with hot spring baths, museums, park space and so much more.

Yokohama Chinatown

Yokohama Chinatown is known as the world's best Chinese food spot in Japan. With more than 600 shops in only a 250,000 square meter area there are plenty of restaurants to choose from. Workers from restaurants and food stalls

and more call out to entice customers. The buildings and signs glitter and dazzle in brilliant colors. You will soon realize Chinatown is a completely different world!

Afternoon

Kamakura Komachi Dori Shopping Area

Kamakura Komachi Street is a well-known commercial shopping street in Kamakura, where local specialties and restaurants are concentrated. There are not only authentic Japanese snacks and dishes, but also unique souvenirs to bring home. It is a must-see commercial street for young people to explore. In the Komachi-dori shopping street, you can fully experience the friendly and characteristic service of the locals.

Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine

Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine is a shrine dedicated to Hachiman God in Kamakura City. In 1180 (the fourth year of Zhicheng), the Yuanyori Dynasty entered Kamakura and moved the shrine to its current location, called Tsurugaoka Wakamiya, and Hachiman God became the patron saint of Genji. In 1191 (the second year of Jianjiu) Hachimangu Shrine caught fire, the shogunate built the main palace on the mountain behind the Wakamiya and rebuilt the Wakamiya. After that, Hachiman God was revered as the guardian of Wumen. On the west side of Wakamiya-dori, which extends straight from Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine, is Komachi Street, a north-south road. From local specialty food shops such as natto and ham to craft shops such as Kamakura carvings, there are everything from old-fashioned restaurants to western-style cafes. There are more than 200 restaurants and shops lined up from both sides of the road to the depths of the small streets, attracting many shopping crowds.

Great Buddha of Kamakura

The city of Kamakura in Japan's Kanagawa Prefecture is home to one of the most poetic and paradoxical works of Buddhist sculpture. The statue of the Great Buddha, or Daibutsu, a giant bronze figure of Amida Buddha measures 11.3 meters in height at Kotoku-in, a temple of the Jodo-shu branch of Pure Land Buddhism. The elegant Buddha is seated in the lotus position with his hands in the gesture of meditation, his eyes cast downward in peaceful contemplation.

Next, follow us to go to Ginza to shopping! Well, do not miss Tokyo's famous shopping and entertainment district Odaiba! Enjoy the beautiful ocean view and beach in Odaiba's seaside park; go to DiverCity Shopping Plaza and take an photo with a huge 1:1 Mobile Suit Gundam model. Then we'll go to Shibuya. At the Shibuya Station, you can also see the statue built to commemorate the loyal dog Hachiko. Finally, we will visit Shinjuku Kabukicho and feel the charm of this sleepless city!

Morning

Sensoji Temple

Tokyo's oldest temple, Sensoji contains a sacred statue of Kannon, the goddess of mercy. Surrounded by imposing gates, a five-story pagoda, and the vibrant stalls of Nakamise Dori, Sensoji is a must-see destination on your trip to Japan.

Nakamise-dori Street

Get a feel for old-school Tokyo at one of Japan's oldest shopping streets, Nakamise-dori, which dates back to the 17th century. Most shops in this arcade have been run by the same families for several generations, serving souvenirs, topclass street food and irresistible snacks.

Tokyo Skytree

As the target of Tokyo, the Tokyo Clear Sky Tower is 634 meters high, which is the highest tower in the world. Tokyo Clear Sky Tower is located on the east side of Tokyo near Asakusa, Jinshicho and two countries. It used to be a handicraft area in Tokyo, leaving behind the traditional Edo culture and retaining the handmade technology of traditional Japanese crafts. It is an area that promotes the unique development of Tokyo.

Nijubashi Bridge

The bridge above is the main bridge to the Imperial Palace. It appears on guidebooks and postcards. It is arguably the

most famous bridge in Japan and even a major symbol of Japan. There are actually two main bridges to the Imperial Palace. The seimon ishibashi main entrance stone bridge and the seimon tetsubashi the main entrance to the iron bridge. When you stand in front of the stone bridge you can see the iron bridge behind, and it looks like there are two bridges.

Afternoon

Ginza

Ginza is Tokyo's most famous upmarket shopping, dining and entertainment district. It features numerous department stores, boutiques, art galleries, restaurants, night clubs and cafes. Most shops in the Ginza district are open every day of the week. A visit is most pleasant on weekend afternoons when the central Chuo Dori street is closed due to automobile traffic and becomes a large pedestrian zone.

Odaiba

Odaiba is a popular shopping and entertainment district on a man-made island in Tokyo Bay. Hachiko Memorial Statue

Shibuya Intersection has become a synonym for Eight Heroes, a famous loyal dog. Every day, this famous loyal dog will accompany his master Professor Ueno to Shibuya Station, where he will wait for his master to leave work, until one day the professor died of cerebral hemorrhage while working. However, in the following nine years, the loyal Eight Heroes continued to wait for his master to come home from work every day. The story of Ba Gong attracted the attention of the public. In 1934, a statue of Ba Gong was erected outside Shibuya Station in recognition of its loyalty. Unfortunately, Bagong died the next year, but his story has been handed down in Japan and around the world.

Shinjuku Kabukicho

Kabukicho is the location of many host and hostess clubs, love hotels, shops and restaurants. It is often called the "Sleepless Town." During the day tourists come to shop, find food, and explore the red-light district. In the evening, the streets glow under a dazzling array of neon signs. Although referred to a "red light district," there are no red lights in the literal sense. Kabukicho is a lively place and certainly worth a visit to capture a glimpse Tokyo's famous nightlife.

Night

The yakatabune

On the Yakatabune, you can enjoy the ingredients that they have carefully prepared for you. The upper and lower floors also provide different singing and dancing talent performances. In the innovation cabin, you can watch the performance of traditional Japanese musical instruments, songs and special dance performances. On the top of the boat, you can enjoy the performance of modern musical instruments and more. At the same time, you can enjoy the beautiful scenery of the Tokyo Bay!

Kanda Shrine

From the moment we step into the bird house of Kanda shrine, we can begin to understand Shinto, the largest religion in Japan. Through the performance of the Shinto show, you will learn the meaning of life and how to face our life again. After, we will go to Kanda shrine, to visit the second place of the Tokyo Night View legend to enjoy the night view of Kanda shrine and watch the Kanda shrine show. Don't forget to take a look at Kanda Shrine's money cat which is a very famous fortune cat.

Tokyo Tower

The observation deck is a 20-meter square room surrounded by a whole piece of large glass. Tourists feel as if they were born in the air and far away from the world. On a sunny day, looking down, you can see the whole Tokyo at a glance. The beautiful Mount Fuji in the west is amazing to discover. At night, the decorative lights on the tower body suddenly come on and form a colorful pattern in the night sky. Shortly after, we will go to the Tokyo Tower to visit Tokyo's landmark buildings, and overlook the night view of the entire Tokyo capital from the Tokyo Tower.

Day 6

After having breakfast at the hotel, we will first drive to Arakurayama Sengen Park to capture the beautiful vista of Mount Fuji. You can overlook the street view of Fujiyoshida City. We will pass by the popular Hikawa Clock Shop & Kanadorii. In the afternoon we will visit Lake Kawaguchiko, the famous shooting spot of Mount Fuji. Then, we will drive to the Mount Fuji 5th Station. Mount Fuji is the highest peak in Japan and one of the largest active volcanoes in the world. Finally, we will head to the Hamanako Hot Spring Resort to check-in. We will arrange lake view rooms for you.

Arakurayama Sengen Park

Arakurayama Sengen Park is a vividly hued park with an unbeatable view of Mt. Fuji. Arakura Fuji Sengen-jinja Shrine and its pagoda sit proudly in beautiful Arakurayama Sengen Park. The pagoda is perfectly positioned for spectacular views of distant Mt. Fuji and if you visit during the cherry blossom season you can fit three Japanese icons all into one shot.

Afternoon

Lake Kawaguchiko

Lake Kawaguchiko is the most easily accessible of the Fuji Five Lakes. The best views of Mount Fuji can be enjoyed from the lake's northern shores and are particularly breathtaking during the cherry blossom season around mid April and the autumn colors around the first half of November. One of the nicest spots for cherry blossoms is the seaside promenade near the Kawaguchiko Music Forest, while photographers will enjoy the "Momiji Tunnel" for autumn colors, a maple tree covered road section along the lake's northern shore.

Mount Fuji

Mt. Fuji is the tallest mountain in Japan and, with its classically symmetrical snow-capped cone, has long been the symbol of that country. The volcano is regarded as a sacred kami or spirit in the Shinto religion, specifically that of Princess Konohanasakuya-hime (aka Fuji-hime or Sengen), and climbing its slopes is considered an act of pilgrimage for followers of that faith. The mountain also has several important sacred shrines, caves, springs and a waterfall. As of 2013 CE Mt. Fuji is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Oshino Hakkai

Oshino Hakkai is a touristy set of eight ponds in Oshino, a small village in the Fuji Five Lake region, located between Lake Kawaguchiko and Lake Yamanakako. The eight ponds are fed by snow melt from the slopes of nearby Mount Fuji that filters down the mountain through porous layers of lava for over 80 years, resulting in very clear spring water.

The Sannenzaka & Ninenzaka leading to the temple is also very charming. Afterwards, we will proceed to beautiful Gion and Hanamikoji Dori to appreciate the unique historical site. Fushimi Inari Shrine

Fushimi Inari Shrine is an important Shinto shrine in southern Kyoto. It is famous for its thousands of vermilions torii gates, which straddle a network of trails behind its main buildings. The trails lead into the wooded forest of the sacred Mount Inari, which stands at 233 meters and belongs to the shrine grounds. Fushimi Inari is the most important of several thousands of shrines dedicated to Inari, the Shinto god of rice. Foxes are thought the Inari's messengers, resulting in many fox statues across the shrine grounds.

Senbon Torii

Senbon Torii is a Japanese Shinto shrine building, which is mainly used to distinguish the divine realm from the secular realm inhabited by human beings, and represents the entrance of the divine realm. Senbon Torii is located in Fujian Daohe Society. The back of each Senbon Torii is engraved with the year of construction and the name of the firm and company. Entering Senbon Torii, the old and faded dark red arches and bright red arches are closely intertwined, which is visually shocking. The film Memoirs of a Geisha was filmed here. The orange tunnel where the younger generation ran through was Qianben Bird House.

Arashiyama

Arashiyama is a pleasant, touristy district in the western outskirts of Kyoto. The area has been a popular destination since the Heian Period (794-1185), when nobles would enjoy its natural setting. Arashiyama is particularly popular during the cherry blossom and fall color seasons. The Togetsukyo Bridge is Arashiyama's well known, central landmark. Many small shops, restaurants and other attractions are found nearby.

Kiyomizudera Temple

Kiyomizudera is one of the most celebrated temples of Japan. It was founded in 780 on the site of the Otowa Waterfall in the wooded hills east of Kyoto, and derives its name from the fall's pure waters. The temple was originally associated with the Hosso sect, one of the oldest schools within Japanese Buddhism, but formed its own Kita Hosso sect in 1965. In 1994, the temple was added to the list of UNESCO world heritage sites. Kiyomizudera is best known for its wooden stage that juts out from its main hall, 13 meters above the hillside. The stage affords nice views of the numerous cherry and maple trees below that erupt in a sea of color in spring and fall, as well as of the city of Kyoto in the distance. The main hall, which together with the stage was built without the use of nails, houses the temple's primary object of worship, a small statue of the eleven faced, thousand armed Kannon.

Sannenzaka & Ninenzaka

Ninen-zaka Slope and Sannen-zaka Slope are iconic streets of Kyoto City, which represent Japan's good old days. Once you get there, you can't help taking pictures of this nostalgic and dreamy scenery. These two slopes are approach to the famous Kiyomizudera Temple and also one of the main attraction of the city for the beautiful scenery. The historical stone paved streets are lined with traditional Japanese buildings, shops, cafes and inns, and are also surrounded by several famous landmarks.

Gion

Gion is Kyoto's most famous geisha district, located around Shijo Avenue between Yasaka Shrine in the east and the Kamo River in the west. It is filled with shops, restaurants and ochaya (teahouses), where geiko (Kyoto dialect for geisha) and maiko (geiko apprentices) entertain. Gion attracts tourists with its high concentration of traditional wooden machiya merchant houses. Due to the fact that property taxes were formerly based upon street frontage, the houses were built with narrow facades only five to six meters wide but extend up to twenty meters in from the street.

Hanamikoji Dori

Hanamikoji-dori Street is a street running east-west through Kyoto City. Hanamikoji-dori Street spans a length of about 1 km from Sanjo-dori Street at its north end to Yasui Kitamon-dori Street at its south end, and is the main street passing through the central zone of Gion. The section of Hanamikoji-dori Street south of Shijo-dori Street started to develop during the Meiji period with tea rooms and restaurants lining the road.

Yasaka Shrine

Yasaka Shrine is one of the most famous shrines in Kyoto. The shrine's main hall combines the honden (inner sanctuary) and haiden (offering hall) into a single building. In front of it stands a dance stage with hundreds of lanterns that get lit in the evenings. Each lantern bears the name of a local business in return for a donation.

The Osaka Castle built with green tiles and white walls stands in the middle of the park. The stone walls are also architectural wonders! Finally, we will visit Shinsaibashi-suji Shopping Street and Dotonbori, the busiest business district in Osaka.

Nara Park

Nara Park is a large park in central Nara. Established in 1880, it is the location of many of Nara's main attractions including Todaiji, Kasuga Taisha, Kofukuji and the Nara National Museum. It is also home to hundreds of freely roaming deer.

Todaiji Temple

Todaiji is one of Japan's most famous and historically significant temples and a landmark of Nara. Until recently, Todaiji's main hall, the Daibutsuden (Big Buddha Hall), held the record as the world's largest wooden building, despite the fact that the present reconstruction of 1692 is only two thirds of the original temple hall's size. The massive building houses one of Japan's largest bronze statues of Buddha (Daibutsu). The 15 meters tall, seated Buddha represents Vairocana and is flanked by two Bodhisattvas.

Osaka Castle Park

The construction of Osaka Castle started in 1583 on the former site of the Ishiyama Honganji Temple, which had been destroyed by Oda Nobunaga thirteen years earlier. Toyotomi Hideyoshi intended the castle to become the center of a new, unified Japan under Toyotomi rule. It was the largest castle at the time. The castle tower is surrounded by secondary citadels, gates, turrets, impressive stone walls and moats. The entire Osaka Castle Park covers about two square kilometers with lots of green space, sport facilities, a multi-purpose arena (Osakajo Hall) and has a shrine dedicated to Toyotomi Hideyoshi. The park is one of Osaka's most popular hanami spots during the cherry blossom season, which usually takes place in early April.

Shinsaibashi-suji Shopping Street

Visiting a shopping arcade in Japan is usually a great insight into what makes a local neighborhood tick. Shinsaibashi-suji Shopping Arcade, along with its longer, more traditional cousin Tenjinbashi-suji Arcade up in the Kita district, is one of Osaka's quintessential "shotengai" (covered shopping arcade) and one of the city's major tourist destinations.

Dotonbori

Dotonbori is one of the most prosperous business districts in Osaka and a landmark food stronghold. Almost all the specialties of Osaka are included here, including ramen noodles, octopus roast, teppanyaki, revolving sushi, puffer fish cuisine, etc. The most famous ones are "Osaka King General" and "Crab Road Music". In the night when neon lights are flashing, there is even more excitement here.

Kitano-cho

Kitano-cho is a city district at the foot of the Rokko mountain range where many foreign merchants and diplomats settled after the Port of Kobe was opened to foreign trade in the second half of the 19th century. More than a dozen of the former mansions, known as Ijinkan, remain in the area and are open to the public as museums. The entire district is pleasant to walk through and offers a variety of cafes, restaurants and boutiques, making it a favorite among young Japanese couples.

Port of Kobe

Port of Kobe opened on January 1, 1868. It has been an area where foreigners have lived since the Meiji era, and it is

full of exotic flavors. Today, it is a very popular tourist destination in Kobe, and many local residents and tourists from all over the world often come here for entertainment, food and shopping. The popular sightseeing areas here mainly include parks, mosaic gardens and Kobe Seaside Paradise.

Arima Onsen

With a history of over one thousand years, Arima Onsen is considered to be one of Japan's oldest hot spring resorts and has often stood at or near the top of onsen rankings for Western Japan. The town has two types of hot spring waters which spring up at various sources around town: the Kinsen ("gold water") is colored brown with iron deposits and is said to be good for skin ailments and muscle pain. The clear Ginsen ("silver water") contains radium and carbonate and is said to cure various muscle and joint ailments.

Mountain Rokko

The green and continuous Rokko Mountain is located in the north of Kobe City and is 30 kilometers long from east to west. It is the largest outdoor leisure resort in the Kansai region. It is designated as part of the Seto Inland Sea National Park where you can enjoy the changes of nature's beauty throughout the year. There is a wide plateau area around the top of Rokko, with golf courses, observation decks, alpine botanical gardens, tourist ranches, forest parks and other leisure places. At night, from the top of the mountain, you can observe the charming night view of Kobe city and port, which is known as the "one-million-dollar nighttime view."
