Columbia University is a private Ivy League research university located in New York City. Established in 1754 as the King's College on the grounds of Trinity Church in Manhattan, Columbia is the oldest institution of higher education in New York and the fifth-oldest institution of higher learning in the United States. It is one of nine colonial colleges founded prior to the Declaration of Independence, seven of which belong to the Ivy League. Columbia is ranked among the top universities in the world by major education publications.

In the afternoon, we will visit the Metropolitan Museum of Art (MOMA). It is recognized as one of the top four museum along with British Museum, the Louvre and the Hermitage Museum. Finally, let's enjoy our time in the popular Hudson Yards! You may take a visit to the Vessel and The Edge, the suspended viewing platform. You can also enjoy

delicious food here.

New York University

NYU is one of the most prominent and respected research universities in the world, featuring top-ranked academic programs. Now among the largest private universities in the US, NYU provides a rigorous, demanding education to more than 50,000 students and undertakes nearly \$1 billion in research annually. It counts among its faculty recipients of the highest scholarly honors.

Washington Square Park

Well-known for its arch, honoring George Washington, the man for whom the park is named after, and its fountain, the arch's elder by 43 years and a popular meeting spot, Washington Square Park also houses several other monuments and facilities.

New York Public Library

It is the representing building in the New York Public Library system and a landmark in Midtown Manhattan, New York City. The branch, one of four research libraries in the library system, contains nine separate divisions. The structure has four stories open to the public. The main entrance steps are at Fifth Avenue at the intersection with East 41st Street. As of 2015, the branch contains an estimated 2.5 million volumes of books in its shelves.

Bryant Park

Bryant Park is a beloved, year-round New York City destination. Known as Manhattan's Town Square, the park is famous for its lush seasonal gardens, free activities, world class restrooms, and al fresco dining. Located adjacent to the New York Public Library and surrounded by iconic skyscrapers, Bryant Park is visited by more than 12 million people each year and is one of the busiest public spaces in the world.

Liberty Cruise

Any trip to New York City must include a boat cruise around the Statue of Liberty. This iconic landmark has stood in the city that never sleeps for more than 100 years, built initially as a joint effort between the United States and France to celebrate the anniversary of America's independence. You will ride on this amazing sightseeing cruise tour on the Hudson River to enjoy the city view from a totally different angle.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art

The Metropolitan Museum of Art contains over two million masterpieces of artworks, some dating to over five thousand years old and hailing from all around the world! It is one of the largest art museums in the world and you surely don't want to miss out on it. The Metropolitan Museum of Art's mission is to encourage and educate the future generations of tomorrow to continue the study of fine arts. The museum also offers a variety of events every month and exhibitions for everyone to enjoy.

Hudson Yards

Hudson Yards Is Manhattan's Biggest, Newest, Slickest Gated Community. You can see it on the skyline or along the Hudson River, upending Manhattan's silhouette.

Hudson Yards - Vessel

The huge structure at the Hudson Yards landscape gallery, the center of the square and the visual focus is the Vessel, which looks like a huge honeycomb. Some people regard it as "the Eiffel Tower of New York," and some people think it is the "real version of the Monument Valley." Come and appreciate the architecture from different angles to truly discover this one-of-a-kind structure.

Edge NYC

Edge is the highest outdoor sky deck in the Western Hemisphere located at 30 Hudson Yards, with a one-of-a-kind design. It's suspended in mid-air, giving you the feeling of floating in the sky with 360-degree views you can't get anywhere else. Look 100 stories down from the thrilling glass floor, lean out over the city on angled glass walls and sip champagne in the sky. Enjoy your adventure up in the sky!

University of Pennsylvania

The University of Pennsylvania (Penn or UPenn) is a member of the Ivy League. The university claims a founding date of 1740 and is one of the nine colonial colleges chartered prior to the U.S. Declaration of Independence. Benjamin Franklin, Penn's founder and first president, advocated an educational program training leaders in commerce, government, and public service, similar to the likes of a modern liberal arts curriculum.

Penn Museum

Discover the Penn Museum, one of the world's finest archaeological and anthropological museums. From stone tools and household items to architectural monuments and rare artifacts, the museum illustrates the story of humanity's history and achievements. Get the chance to look at the unique materials from ancient Egypt, Asia, Mesopotamia, the Americas and ancient Greece and Italy.

Independence National Historical Park

This National Historical Park located in Philadelphia, serves as a way of preserving the importance of the Revolutionary War sites for future generations. Known as "America's most historic square mile," this 55-acre park in the "Old City" district is definitely a site to see.

Independence Hall

One of Philadelphia's most famous landmarks, Independence Hall in Independence National Historical Park is the location where both the Declaration of Independence and the United States Constitution were debated, written, and ratified by the Founding Fathers of the United States.

Liberty Bell

The famously cracked Liberty Bell is a sign of American Independence and spirit. Located at Liberty Bell Center in Philadelphia, this symbol of the American Revolution was crafted in 1752 - more than over 250 years ago.

Philadelphia Congress Hall

Home of the United States Congress when Philadelphia served as the nation's capital from 1790 to 1800 is the

Philadelphia Congress Hall. During Congress Hall's duration as the capitol of the United States, the country admitted three new states, Vermont, Kentucky, and Tennessee. The ratification of the Bill of Rights of the United States Constitution and both the presidential inaugurations of George Washington and John Adams were located here.

Johns Hopkins University

John Hopkins University is a private research university located in Baltimore, Maryland. Founded in 1876, the university was named for its first benefactor, the American entrepreneur, abolitionist, and philanthropist John Hopkins. The John Hopkins School of Medicine consistently ranks among the nation's very best in education. The architectural style of the campus follows the federal style of Homewood House.

Baltimore Inner Harbor

The Inner Harbor in Baltimore is a historical seaport, tourist attraction, and landmark of Maryland! The Inner Harbor has everything to offer from scenic waterfront views to spectacular museums. Feel free to grab a bite of fresh seafood to eat at a local restaurant while enjoying the live music from great street artists.

Princeton University

This illustrious university in central New Jersey is one of the oldest and most highly regarded institutions of higher learning in the entire United States of America. It has been associated with 35 Nobel Prize laureates.

The Firsts of America Exploration Tour: Harvard University (1 hour, official campus tour included) → The Old State House (the birthplace of the American Revolution and the place where the Declaration of Independence was first published) → The Tremont Street Subway Marker (the first subway system) → Boston Common (the first public park) → Boston Public Garden (the first public botanical garden) → Boston Public Library (the first large-scale free municipal library funded by the public) → Boston Trinity cathedral (Outside visit)

***Note: If the Boston Duck Boat is closed, this attraction will be replaced by Boston Harbor Cruise (Optional, 60 mins).**

View Boston at Prudential Center

View Boston is a 360° taste of the city, offering breathtaking views atop one of the tallest buildings in New England. You will find plenty of photo opportunities as you roam the 360-degree open air roof deck and stop to enjoy beverages with a view at Stratus. Explore the remarkable 3D model of the city with projection-mapping to dramatically reveal the seasons, spirit, and celebrations that bring Boston to life. Be enveloped by the 270-degree immersive theater screen showcasing street-level exploration of various neighborhoods and behind-the-scenes perspective from some of Boston's most beloved attractions, including Fenway Park!

Boston Duck Tour

The fun of Boston Duck Tours begins as soon as you board your "duck." You'll cruise by all the places that make Boston the birthplace of freedom and a city of firsts, from the golden-domed State House to Beacon Hill and the TD Garden, Boston Common and Copley Square to the Big Dig, Government Center to fashionable Newbury Street, Quincy Market to the Prudential Tower, and more. Then you will proceed to visit the Charles River for a breathtaking view of the Boston and Cambridge skylines.
