Big Ben

Big Ben is the nickname for the Great Bell of the striking clock at the north end of the Palace of Westminster. The official name of the tower in which Big Ben is located was originally the Clock Tower. It was renamed the Elizabeth Tower in 2012 to mark the Diamond Jubilee of Elizabeth II. When completed in 1859, it was the largest and most accurate clock in the world.

Westminster Abbey

Westminster Abbey is a large, mainly Gothic abbey church in the City of Westminster. It is one of the United Kingdom's most notable religious buildings and the traditional place of coronation and a burial site for English and later British monarchs. Sixteen royal weddings have occurred at the Abbey since 1100.

St. James's Park

The park is bordered by Buckingham Palace to the west, The Mall and St James's Palace to the north, Horse Guards Drive to the east, and Birdcage Drive to the south. There is a lake and two islands in the park, namely St. James Park Lake, Duck Island and West Island. There is a small bridge over the lake. Looking west, you can see Buckingham Palace surrounded by woods and springs, and looking east, you can see the Foreign and Commonwealth Office building. From east to west, St. James's Park, Green Park, Hyde Park and Kensington Gardens are connected, forming a chain of large parklands in central London.

Buckingham Palace

Buckingham Palace is the London residence and administrative headquarters of the monarch of the United Kingdom. It is located in the City of Westminster! The palace is often at the center of state occasions and royal hospitality.

River Thames

It is a river located in southern England, with a total length of 346 kilometers, flowing through three counties in England. It is the longest river in England and the second longest river in the UK, second only to the Severn River, which is 354 kilometers long. It is also the busiest urban river in the world in terms of water traffic and one of the landmarks of London. Many English cities have been formed in the Thames Basin, including Oxford, Reading and Windsor in addition to London.

The British Museum

The British Museum is a public institution dedicated to human history, art and culture located in the Bloomsbury area of London, England. It has over eight million works of the largest collections during the era of the British Empire. It documents the story of human culture from its beginnings to the present day.

Catedral Metropolitana de São Paulo

The Catedral Metropolitana de São Paulo, or Catedral da Sé, is flanked by gigantic towers on either side. The majestic dome is inspired by the Cathedral of Florence's Renaissance minaret. The interiors boast intricate marble sculptures, stained glass panels and breathtaking architecture that's true to the Neo-Gothic school of design. The crypt houses

tombs of archdiocese luminaries and the organ is one of the largest on the continent.

Tower Bridge

Tower Bridge is easily one of the most recognizable in the capital, an iconic London landmark and one of Britain's best loved historic sites. This bridge is a must-see attraction for tourists, especially first timers.

Cambridge University

The University of Cambridge is a collegiate research-based university in Cambridge. It was founded in 1209 and granted a royal charter by Henry III in 1231. Cambridge is the second-oldest university in the English-speaking world and the world's fourth-oldest surviving university. This university does not have a main campus, and its colleges and central facilities are scattered throughout the city.

King's College, Cambridge

King's College is one of the 31 colleges of the University of Cambridge. It was founded by King Henry VI in 1441 and has always been committed to Henry VI's love of "education, religion, learning and research". When it was first founded, there was only one dean and 70 students, all from Eton College. At that time, King's College was established specifically for graduates of Eton College, which was founded by Henry VI, and no other students were accepted. In order to demonstrate the king's strong financial resources, the college pursued magnificent architecture from the beginning of its establishment. The most famous of its buildings is King's College Chapel. Its towering spires and magnificent Gothic architectural style have become the symbol and glory of the entire city of Cambridge.

Queens' College, Cambridge

Queen's College was founded by Margaret of Anjou (queen of King Henry VI of England) in 1448 and re-established by Elizabeth Woodville (queen of King Edward IV of England) in 1465. Queen's College is located on both sides of the River Cam and is the second college in the south. The Dean's Office of Queen's College was built in 1460 and is the oldest building on both sides of the River Cam. Queen's College is also one of the two colleges of Cambridge University that have buildings on both sides of the River Cam, the other being St. John's College.

Bridge of Sighs

The Bridge of Sighs refers to the Bridge of Sighs in Cambridge, where the University of Cambridge is located. Built in 1831, it spans the River Cam. The architect was Henry Hutchinson. The River Cam runs through the University of Cambridge in the UK, and there are many bridges. Among the many bridges in Cambridge University, the Bridge of Sighs is the most famous. It is named after the Bridge of Sighs in Venice, although they have little architecturally in common other than they are both covered bridges. The bridge is one of Cambridge's main tourist attractions and it is said that Queen Victoria loved it more than any other attraction in the city.

In the morning, we will visit York, a famous medieval city in England. York is a city with a rich history and cultural relics, including those of Roman and Viking rule. Its medieval street buildings are well preserved, showing its nostalgic and simple side. It is also an important city that witnesses the history of England. Coming to York is like traveling through a time tunnel to the Middle Ages. You can visit York Minster, the largest cathedral in the UK with a history of nearly a

thousand years, and then climb the famous Roman city wall to witness the remains of the thousand-year-old fortress. Here, we will also come to the same filming location as Diagon Alley in the Harry Potter movies, as if we had returned directly to the movie world. It is definitely worth the trip. Afterwards, we will drive to the hotel in Edinburgh to check in and rest.

Morning

York Minster

Discover one of the world's most magnificent cathedrals, a masterpiece in stained glass and stone in a sacred space which has been at the center of Christianity in the north of England since the 7th century. The York Minster was built for the glory of God, and this is reflected in every aspect of this ancient building! It has exquisite, handcrafted stone throughout and has a collection of medieval stained glass.

York city walls

York's ancient city wall is the most complete and longest of all the ancient city walls in England. The York City Wall is a 5-kilometer-long square wall built by the Romans as a barrier to defend against foreign enemies. The wall was first built during the Roman rule and was later reinforced by the Danish occupiers. Most of the remaining walls were rebuilt from the 12th to the 14th century. Careful people will find that there are many copper pins on the wall, which were inserted by local archaeologists and engineers in order to accurately determine the location of the restoration project.

Edinburgh, the capital of Scotland, is the epitome of Scottish style. The mellow whiskey, bagpipers wearing Scottish plaid kilts, and its unique customs and national characteristics will make you linger. Upon arrival, first visit the Edinburgh Castle, which stands majestically on a dormant volcanic rock, and view the oldest royal crowns and jewels. Then visit the Royal Trail, City Hall and Holyrood Park which are connected to Holyrood Palace. During the free time at noon, you can go to the Elephant Cafe where J.K.Rowling wrote the book "Harry Potter" to enjoy a cup of coffee. You can also go to the memorial photo studio to cosplay as an "ancient Scotsman" and take photos, which is also a very interesting experience. Then we will drive to the hotel in Glasgow to check in and rest.

Edinburgh Castle

Situated at the top of the Royal Mile on top of Castle Rock is the Edinburgh Castle. It is the number one visitor attraction place located in Scotland and the most iconic building in the city. Once inside, you can explore some of the oldest and most important buildings of the city, including St Margaret's Chapel, The National War Memorial, and the Half Moon Battery. Here, you will also find the magnificent Grand Hall and Scotland's Crown Jewels - including the famous Stone of Destiny.

Royal Mile

The Royal Mile is the central avenue of Edinburgh's Old Town. This street starts at Edinburgh Castle and ends at the Palace of Holyroodhouse. The alleys on both sides are crisscrossed, forming the skeleton of the old town. The cobblestone ground had long been polished to a shine, and the buildings along the avenue were simple and majestic, full of history. Every afternoon, street performers in kilts play bagpipes, reminding visitors that they are in the ancient heart of Scotland.

Edinburgh City Chambers

Edinburgh City Hall is the office of the City of Edinburgh Council in Edinburgh, the capital of Scotland. It was formerly known as the Royal Exchange and opened in 1760. After the 19th century, it became the offices of the Edinburgh City Council. Edinburgh City Hall is a Grade A listed building in Scotland.

Holyrood Park

Holyrood Park is a royal park in the center of Edinburgh, the capital of Scotland, about 1 mile east of Edinburgh Castle. The park covers an area of 650 acres (260 hectares) and has a diverse landscape, adjacent to the Palace of Holyroodhouse.

Today is a condensed tour of the Scottish Highlands, so the itinerary will be a bit rushed and we will just stop here. In the morning, we will drive to the Glenfinnan South Viaduct, where the image of the Scottish ten-pound note is located. This is also the bridge where the Hogwarts Express, the protagonist of the movie "Harry Potter", passes through. It is a popular check-in spot for Harry Potter fans. In the afternoon, we passed through Scotland's first national park, Loch Lomond, which is located on the fault boundary between the Highlands and the Lowlands. There are more than 30 small islands in the lake with beautiful scenery. After taking some photos, we returned to Glasgow.

If this breathtaking piece of engineering looks familiar to you, it's because both the viaduct and the steam train that

runs over it were featured in four of the Harry Potter films. That's right, it's the Hogwarts Express! But you don't have to be a 'Potter head' to appreciate the magic and majesty of Glenfinnan Viaduct; it's simply breathtaking to behold and attracts visitors from all across the globe. It's the longest concrete railway bridge in Scotland and traverses a thousand feet over the River Finnan, one hundred feet above the ground, passing through some of the most atmospheric and unspoilt scenery you're ever likely to see. It's so iconic it was featured on the 2007 Scottish £10 note!

Loch Ness

Loch Ness is one of many connected Scottish Highland lakes. Its water is very turbid due to a large amount of floating algae and peat, and the visibility in the water is extremely low, less than two meters. The lake bottom has a complex terrain with many caves. It is also the second deepest and second largest lake in Scotland and the United Kingdom, with an area of 56.4 square kilometers and a maximum depth of 226 meters. Due to its depth, the amount of water stored in it is more than the total amount of all freshwater lakes in England and Wales.

Afternoon Transportation: Drive from Loch Ness to Loch Lomond

Loch Lomond

Loch Lomond is a freshwater lake located on the Scottish Highland Boundary Fault. Loch Lomond is also the largest lake in Great Britain, with many islands on the lake, such as Malin Island, the largest freshwater island in the British Isles.

After setting off in the morning, we will stop by Gretna Green, a famous Scottish town for people to escape their

marriages, for a short visit. After arriving in the Lake District, you can choose to take a sightseeing boat or a historic steam train to explore Lake Windermere or visit the Peter Rabbit Museum. After the tour, head to Manchester. It is not only the headquarters of the football powerhouse Manchester United, but also an important industrial center in England. We will visit the football mecca - the exterior of the Manchester United Stadium, Old Trafford, and then proceed to the city for free activities. After dinner, we will drive to Manchester or a nearby city to check in and rest.

Glasgow → Gretna Green (30 mins) → **Windermere Lake** (60 mins) → **Windermere Lake Cruise + Steam Train** (Optional, 50 mins) → **Manchester → Old Trafford** (exterior, 15 mins) → **Free activities in Manchester**

Gretna Green, known as the "runaway wedding town", is one of the most famous wedding venues in the world.

Afternoon Transportation: Drive from Gretna Green to Windermere Lake District

Windermere

Windermere, known as "the most beautiful natural scenery in England" is a famous tourist center. The Windermere lake was formed at the end of the last glacial period in a glacial valley running north-south through the Khumbulian Mountains. It is part of the Lake District National Park and has yacht entertainment in summer. Here, you can stroll through the lake district, which the British call "the back garden" to enjoy the beautiful scenery along the way.

Windermere Lake Cruise + Steam Train

Take a boat tour of the lake area of Windermere to admire the lakes and mountains that overlook the villas in the valley like a fairy tale world. The steam train, left in the last industrial period in Britain, still maintain its former appearance. When the train leaves the station, it emits a huge steam mist that spreads throughout the station and disappears into the mountains through the old trestle bridge.

Afternoon Transportation: Drive from Windermere to Manchester

Old Trafford

Old Trafford Stadium is the world-famous home of Manchester United. Unusual aspects of the ground include the raised pitch, and that the teams enter the field from the corner of the Sir Bobby Charlton Stand. Outside the ground is the Sir Matt Busby Statue fronting the impressive green glassed East Stand facade, whilst above the entrance to the Club Museum outside the North Stand is a statue of Sir Alex Ferguson. There is also a clock and plaque in remembrance of the Munich disaster. Across Sir Matt Busby Way is the United Trinity Statue of three of the 1968 European Cup winning team; George Best, Denis Law and Bobby Charlton (now Sir).

In the morning, we will set off to Shakespeare's hometown: Stratford, located on the banks of the Avon River, which the British call Shakespeare's World. Here, you can visit the former residence of a great writer and the church where he is buried. Most of the names of the town's streets, hotels, restaurants, and theater facilities are related to Shakespeare. After your visit, return to London. Passing by the large brand-name direct shopping village Bicester Village, there are more than 160 well-known brands, most of the goods are sold at discounted prices. If there is a clearance sale or seasonal price reduction, then it is extremely cheap. We will arrive in London in the evening, officially ending this fulfilling and unforgettable journey!

Stratford-upon-Avon

Stratford-upon-Avon is a world-famous destination known for being the birthplace of the world's greatest playwright: William Shakespeare.
