Tour introduction

Day 1

Madrid - Vehicle - Zaragoza

All day

Today we will visit Madrid, the capital of Spain. The Royal Palace of Madrid was a magnificent building during the peak of the Spanish royal family; The Kilómetro Cero marker copper brick representing the center point of Spain is inconspicuously placed on the pedestrian walkway of the Sun Gate; And the Puerta del Sol is a great place to buy Spanish specialties, clothing, and souvenirs. In the afternoon, drive to Zaragoza. Upon arrival, proceed directly to the Plaza de Nuestra Señora del Pilar to admire the Baroque architectural complex. Finally, visit the Basílica de Nuestra Señora del Pilar. Finally go to the hotel to check in and rest.

Morning

Plaza Mayor

The Plaza Mayor is a major public space in the heart of Madrid, the capital of Spain. It was once the centre of Old Madrid. It was first built (1580–1619) during the reign of Philip III. Only a few blocks away is another famous plaza, the Puerta del Sol. The Plaza Mayor is a space for the people of Madrid and tourists to shop, walk around, eat, and enjoy the outdoors.

Plaza de España

Located at the end of Gran Vía, the most conspicuous thing in the center of the square is the Cervantes Monument.

Directly in front of the Cervantes statue are the portraits of the protagonists Don Quixote and Sancho Panza in his "Don Quixote".

Columbus Monument

One of the most iconic monuments in the city is the Columbus Monument. It stands at the end of Barcelona's Rambla, near the sea. This major landmark on the Rambla was built in 1888 for the Universal Exhibition as a tribute to Christopher Columbus, who chose to disembark in the port of Barcelona on his return from America. In its top, dominating the sky of Barcelona, the statue of Christopher Columbus holding a navigational chart in his left hand, and pointing to the route to America with his right.

Royal Palace of Madrid

The Royal Palace of Madrid is the official residence of the Spanish royal family at the city of Madrid. Although now used only for state ceremonies it still remains as the largest functioning royal palace and floor area in Europe.

Kilómetro Cero

This is the zero kilometer starting point of all roads in Madrid and throughout Spain. It was originally established by King Philip II in the 16th century. In Spain, all roads lead to Puerta del Sol. So on the sidewalk in front of the municipal building, there is a semicircular graphic sign made of tiles. In the middle of the sign is a map of Spain with KM 0 written on it. In the middle of the map, there is a 0 at the intersection of two pointers pointing in different directions. Its other name is: the belly button of Spain.

Puerta del Sol

The Puerta del Sol is a public square in Madrid, one of the best known and busiest places in the entire city. This is the center (Km 0) of the radial network of Spanish roads. The square also contains the famous clock whose bells mark the traditional eating of the Twelve Grapes and the beginning of a new year!

Plaza de Nuestra Señora del Pilar

Located south of the Ebro River, it is the large square in the old town of Zaragoza. It can accommodate 500 people. It is named after the Cathedral of Our Lady of Pilar in the square. It is nicknamed Zaragoza's "city living room". It is also often called the Plaza de las Catedrales and is home to Zaragoza's two cathedrals, the Cathedral of Jesus Christ the Savior of Zaragoza and the Basilica of Our Lady of Pilar.

Basílica de Nuestra Señora del Pilar

The 11-domed Church of Our Lady of Pilar is the symbol of Zaragoza and has many beautiful stories about it. It was originally a Gothic church building. During the addition, renovation and decoration process, artistic styles such as silversmith style and Baroque were partially added. The church was built in the 14th century. The decorative screen on the central altar was made in the 15th century. The tapestry of the Passion of Christ was painted in the 15th-16th century.

Day 2

Zaragoza - Vehicle - Barcelona

All day

In the morning, head to Barcelona and upon arrival, visit the most representative Sagrada Família, which is the masterpiece of the architectural genius Gaudi. Continue to the home stadium of La Liga powerhouse Barcelona: Camp Nou Stadium, where you can take photos outside the building as a memento. Following, we will visit the Lluís Companys Olympic Stadium, where the 1992 Olympic Games were held. From the hill, we can enjoy a panoramic view of the city. Then head to the bustling Las Ramblas and Plaça de Catalunya located in the city center, which are must visit popular attractions in Barcelona! Finally, go to the hotel to rest.

Tuesday Itinerary:

Zaragoza \rightarrow Barcelona \rightarrow Sagrada Família (Outside visit, 1 hours) \rightarrow Camp Nou (Outside visit, 15 mins) \rightarrow Lluís Companys Olympic Stadium (Outside visit, 15 mins) \rightarrow Las Ramblas & Plaça de Catalunya (1 hours)

Sagrada Família

Welcome to a true symbol of Barcelona known as the Sagrada Família! It is a large unfinished Roman Catholic minor basilica in the Example district of Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain. Designed by the Spanish architect Antoni Gaudí (1852– 1926), his work on the building is part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. On 7 November 2010, Pope Benedict XVI consecrated the church and proclaimed it as a minor basilica.

Camp Nou

Barcelona's fantastic Camp Nou stadium and the museum of one of the most successful football clubs in the world, FC Barcelona! Even if you're not a big football fan, the stadium tour will still impress you. During the tour, you will learn more about the club's unique story and how it represents a city, the Catalan region, and even their Catalan language.

Lluís Companys Olympic Stadium

Landmark events such as the opening and closing ceremonies of the 1992 Barcelona Olympic and Paralympic Games and the athletics competitions were held in this venue, as the Museu Olímpic i de l'Esport across the road from the stadium reminds us. It is now rated as a five-star venue by UEFA, which entitles it to host top-level European matches. The stadium is named after Lluís Companys, the president of the Catalan government during the Spanish Civil War.

Las Ramblas

The middle of the avenue is full of flower shops and pavilions. This is a street full of life and colour, with a central sidewalk where you can stroll among the various stalls, florists and shops. The avenue is over one kilometer long, starting from Plaza Catalunya and ending at the Columbus Tower. Each section of the road has a different name. Frequented by tourists and Barcelona locals, this place is always bustling with activity. In addition, there are frequent performances by street artists, which, together with other ever-changing performances, turn Las Ramblas into an unforgettable miniature tour of Barcelona. It was built in the 18th century and was derived from Barcelona's medieval city walls. Today it contains many of Barcelona's most important buildings.

Plaça de Catalunya

Plaza Catalunya is the central square of Barcelona and one of its main attractions. It is one of the largest squares in Spain and one of the core areas of Barcelona life. Many important streets such as Las Ramblas, Passeig de Gràcia or Roundabout Sant Pere start from here. The grounds are large and host performances, exhibitions and trade fairs or fashion shows throughout the year. In addition, it is one of Barcelona's main commercial districts and a hub for many modes of transportation. There is a huge space in the center of the square, surrounded by gardens and forests. It features two twin fountains separated by a terrace and sculptures by important artists, mainly Catalan.

Depart in the morning along the coastline to València, the third largest city in Spain. Historically, València has served as the gateway for Spain to the Mediterranean, a hub of commerce and culture. After arriving, visit the city square, ancient city gate, and Valencia Cathedral in the old town area, and finally head to the hotel.

Catedral de València

This is a long-standing ancient building that has gone through the changes of ancient Roman temples, Arab mosques and Christian churches. It is a witness to the historical changes of the country of Spain. Because of this, this church also contains a variety of architectural styles such as Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque, and Neoclassicism, and is well worth viewing.

Then, we will head to the famous resort of the Sun Coast and arrive at the village of Mijas in the White House at dusk for sightseeing. The classic Andalusian mountain city scenery offers a distant view of the beautiful Sun Coast. Overnight in Malaga or nearby cities.

Alhambra Palace

The Alhambra is a palace and fortress complex located in Granada, Andalusia, Spain. The complex was begun in 1238 by Muhammad I Ibn al-Ahmar, the first Nasrid emir. It is now one of Spain's major tourist attractions, exhibiting the country's most significant and well-known Islamic architecture, together with 16th-century and later Christian building and garden interventions. The Alhambra is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Costa del Sol

The Costa del Sol is a region on the Mediterranean coast of the province of Málaga in Andalusia, southern Spain, between the Costa de la Luz and the Costa Tropical. Previously just a few quiet fishing villages, the area became a world-famous tourist destination in the second half of the 20th century thanks to the whitewashed villages located on the hills overlooking the ocean, attracting millions of visitors each year.

Day 5

Today we will go to Ronda, which is one of the famous attractions in southern Spain. Afterwards, we will go to Seville to visit the cathedral built in the 16th century. Afterwards, we will visit Alcázar de Segovia, which was listed as a World Cultural Heritage site by the United Nations in 1987. Then take a stroll through the Holy Cross area, the Tower of Gold, and Parque de María Luisa, which was the location of the 1992 World's Fair. The intricately carved porcelain paintings on the Spanish Square recount the history and charm of Spain in the past.

Seville Cathedral

The Cathedral of Saint Mary of the See, better known as Seville Cathedral, is a Roman Catholic cathedral in Seville, Andalusia, Spain. It was registered in 1987 by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, along with the adjoining Alcázar palace complex and the General Archive of the Indies. It is the fourth-largest church in the world as well as the largest Gothic church.

Alcázar de Segovia

The Alcázar of Segovia is a medieval castle located in the city of Segovia, Castile and León, Spain. The fortress is a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Rising out on a rocky crag above the confluence of two rivers near the Guadarrama mountains, it is one of the most distinctive castle-palaces in Spain by virtue of its shape – like the bow of a ship.

Alcázar of Seville

The Royal Alcázars of Seville, historically known as al-Qasr al-Muriq and commonly known as the Alcázar of Seville, is a royal palace in Seville, Spain, built for the Christian king Peter of Castile. The palace is a preeminent example of Mudéjar style in the Iberian Peninsula, combining Romanesque, Gothic, and Renaissance structural elements. It was registered in 1987 by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, along with the adjoining Seville Cathedral and the General Archive of the

Indies.

Tower of Gold

The Torre del Oro (English: "Tower of Gold") is a dodecagonal military watchtower in Seville, southern Spain. It was erected by the Almohad Caliphate in order to control access to Seville via the Guadalquivir River. Its name comes from the golden shine it projected on the river, due to its building materials (a mixture of mortar, lime and pressed hay).

Parque de María Luisa

Parque de María Luisa is a large urban park in Seville, designed by French landscape architect Forestier for the Ibero-American International Exhibition held here in 1929. A unique Spanish garden architectural style called "New Sevillian" or "New Arab" was born, which had an important influence on the architectural design of all Spanish public parks in the first 30 years of the 20th century.

Plaza de España

The Plaza de España is a spectacle of light and majesty. Framed in the María Luisa Park, this plaza was designed by the great Seville architect Aníbal González as an emblematic space for the 1929 Ibero-American Expo. The result was a plaza-palace unique in the world. Its proportions are lavish. It has a total area of 50,000 square meters, without a doubt one of the most imposing plazas in Spain.

Day 6 Sevilla - Vehicle - Lisbon

All day

Travel to Portugal in the morning and arrive at the westernmost point of the European continent, Cabo da Roca, in the afternoon. In addition to experiencing the grandeur of the vast Atlantic Ocean, you can also purchase a commemorative certificate. After completing the tour, we will head to the capital Lisbon and then visit the Belém Tower, the Padrão dos Descobrimentos, and then head to the Jeronimos Monastery to get a glimpse of the exterior of the Manuel style buildings left behind during the peak of Portuguese naval power in the 16th century. Following, we will freely explore the area around the Marusi Square and the Pangbu Square. If you are interested, you can taste authentic Portuguese egg tarts at the century old shop.

Cabo da Roca

Cabo da Roca is a cape which forms the westernmost point of the Sintra Mountain Range, of mainland Portugal. It is situated in Sintra, near Azóia, in the southwest of the district of Lisbon. Interestingly, the point includes a lighthouse that has been operating since 1772.

Belém Tower

Belém Tower, officially the Tower of Saint Vincent is a 16th-century fortification located in Lisbon. It once served as a point of embarkation and disembarkation for Portuguese explorers and as a ceremonial gateway to Lisbon. It was built during the height of the Portuguese Renaissance and is a prominent example of the Portuguese Manueline style. It also incorporates hints of other architectural styles. The structure was built from lioz limestone and is composed of a bastion, a 30-metre (98.4 ft), four-storey tower. Since 1983, the tower has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one that you must discover.

Padrão dos Descobrimentos

Padrão dos Descobrimentos is a monument on the northern bank of the Tagus River estuary, in the civil parish of Santa Maria de Belém. Located alongside the river where ships departed to explore and trade with India and the Orient; the monument celebrates the Portuguese Age of Discovery (or Age of Exploration) during the 15th and 16th centuries.

Mosteiro dos Jerónimos

Mosteiro dos Jerónimos is a gorgeous and magnificent monastery located in the Belém district of Lisbon, Portugal. It can be said to be an architectural art treasure of Portugal in its heyday. It was built to commemorate the Portuguese's discovery of the maritime route to India. The famous navigator Vasco da Gama is also buried here. In 1983, it was listed as a World Cultural Heritage by UNESCO in partnership with the nearby Belem Tower.

Toledo

Toledo is a city and municipality of Spain! The de jure seat of the government and parliament of the autonomous community of Castilla–La Mancha is located in Toledo. Toledo was also declared as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1986 for its extensive monumental and cultural heritage.

Catedral de Toledo

Catedral de Toledo is an outstanding example of Spanish Gothic architecture and the cathedral of the Catholic Archdiocese of Toledo. Its construction began in 1226 and took nearly 300 years to complete. It was further expanded in the 18th century and took several decades to build. It integrates multiple architectural art styles and is also one of the largest churches in Spain. The cathedral is not only a religious sanctuary, but also houses a large collection of precious works of art, including paintings, sculptures, and gold and silver wares.
