Day 2

Washington DC City Tour

All day

Today we will have an in-depth tour of the political center of the United States - the capital Washington DC.

Guided by a tour guide, we will visit the famous attractions in Washington DC. The first stop is the Pentagon, the home of the US Department of Defense. This is also where the 9/11 incident took place. Then we will visit Mount Vernon, the Capitol, the White House and other American landmarks that often appear on TV screens. Then we will visit the Lincoln Memorial, a neoclassical building. Finally, we will come to the Vietnam War Memorial Wall, where the world can know that the United States of America thanks those soldiers who served gloriously in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

Itinerary:

The Pentagon & 911 Memorial Museum (Outside visit, 20 mins) → **George Washington's Mount Vernon** (Optional, 180 mins) → **U.S. Capitol** (Inside Visit, 120 mins) → **The White House & Lafayette Square** (30 mins) → **Lincoln Memorial + Vietnam Veterans Memorial** (40 mins)

All day

The Pentagon

The Pentagon is the headquarters building of the United States Department of Defense. Located in Arlington County, Virginia, across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C., the building was designed by American architect George Bergstrom and built by contractor John McShain. The Pentagon is the world's largest office building, containing five sides and five floors above ground-level, two basement levels, and five ring corridors per floor. The Pentagon is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is a National Historic Landmark.

911 Memorial Museum

This memorial reminds people of that terrifying morning and the city that was once hurt, which makes people love it even more and cherish its beauty even more. After the 9/11 attacks that shocked the world, a memorial and museum was built on the site of the former World Trade Center. It displays 23,000 related images and 10,300 items. The most moving ones are the text messages and voice messages sent by the victims in their final moments to their loved ones.

George Washington's Mount Vernon

Here, the first president of the United States, the first great man in American history, is buried: George Washington. After the War of Independence, as the commander-in-chief of the Continental Army, he surrendered his military power and returned to his hometown in Vernon. After that, the whole country unanimously elected Washington as the first president in American history. Eight years later, he resigned from the presidency again and returned to his hometown, setting a precedent that the US president could not be re-elected for more than two terms. In 1799, he was buried here.

U.S. Capitol

As the political center of the United States, Washington has many iconic political and cultural landscapes, such as the Capitol Building and the U.S. Supreme Court. We will enter the Capitol Building, the geometric center of

Washington, DC, walk along the gorgeous and exquisite congressional corridors, listen to the stories behind each mural and each statue, and deeply understand why this is the highest symbol of a government owned by the people, governed by the people, and for the people.

The White House

The White House is a white neoclassical sandstone building covering an area of more than 73,000 square meters. It consists of the main building and the east and west wings. The White House is the office and residence of successive US presidents and is also synonymous with the US government. Many important US decision-making bills are signed and announced by the president in the White House. George Washington, the founding father of the United States, once expressed his views on the construction of the US President's residence: it must not be a palace, and it must not be luxurious, because the masters working here are servants of the state.

Lafayette Square

Lafayette Square is located in Washington, D.C., USA. It covers an area of about 30,000 square meters and is a very famous leisure place. In 1824, the park was named after the Marquis de Lafayette during the American Revolution. In 1970, the square and surrounding buildings were listed as national historic landmarks.

Lincoln Memorial

The Lincoln Memorial is a white ancient Greek temple-style building built to commemorate the 16th President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln. It is regarded as an eternal statue of the United States and a symbol of Washington. It is also the most famous rally for the pursuit of peace and democracy. Martin Luther King delivered his speech "I Have a Dream" here.

Vietnam Veterans Memorial

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is located north of the Lincoln Memorial. It is a 500-foot-long V-shaped monument made of black granite. It is used to commemorate the American soldiers and generals who died while serving in Vietnam during the Vietnam War. The glittering black marble wall is engraved with the names of more than 57,000 US soldiers who died in the Vietnam War between 1959 and 1975, in chronological order of the date of each person's death.

You will appreciate the magnificence of the Water of Thor from multiple angles in the dark, enjoy the colorful and magnificent Niagara Falls night light scene, and feel the unique charm of the falls.

Washington, D.C. → The Corning Museum of Glass (Optional, 1.5 hours) → **Niagara Falls Night View Tour** (Mandatory, 1.5 hours)

Afternoon

The Corning Museum of Glass

The world-renowned Corning Glass Center is located in Corning, a small town with unique style and quaint flavor in upstate New York. Although it is a small city, it is the center of the American glass industry. The status of Corning's glass and porcelain in the United States is just like the status of Jingdezhen porcelain in China, and it is also well-known in the world. Corning Glass Center can be said to be a magical glass world. Corning Glass Center has about 100,000 pieces of glass boutiques and artistic sculptures on display. These exquisite glass products are either colorful or crystal clear, dazzling and overwhelming. The Glass Center is not only a glass museum, but also a factory for the production of glass strengthening, glassware and handicrafts, and a store that sells glass and crystal products such as sunglasses, necklaces, pins, etc.

Niagara Falls Night View Tour

During the trip, we will go to [One Park, Two Islands, Three Falls], go deep into Niagara Falls Park, and see a wide variety of exotic flowers and trees up close; stand on two islands - Ram Island and Moon Island, and appreciate the magnificence of the Water of Thor from multiple angles in the dark; see the three major waterfalls - Horseshoe Falls, Bridal Veil Falls, and American Falls, and feel the majestic momentum of nature presented by the different

faces of the waterfalls under the illumination of colorful neon lights. At this time, don't forget to pick up your camera and take a photo with them.

Day 4

Niagara Falls Classic Tour

All day

Today we will carry out a series of activities at the waterfall, and learn about the past and present of the Niagara Falls from both water and land perspectives.

Itinerary:

Niagara Falls Classic Tour (Optional, 2.5 hours, including Whirlpool State Park+Cave of the Winds+Maid of the Mist)

Note:

The Maid of the Mist waterfall viewing boat is open to the public from the end of April to October (depending on the ice conditions on the river). After the boat is closed, the itinerary will no longer visit this attraction. The specific closure time is subject to the actual notification of the attraction.

All day

Niagara Whirlpool State Park

The Niagara Whirlpool is 125 feet deep and was formed by water erosion 7,500 years ago. It is located where the Niagara River suddenly turns northeast from the northwest. The rapid river water flows back after the change of direction, forming a huge whirlpool. The park is very quiet, with barbecue pits and picnic tables. Standing on them, you can overlook the whirlpool below, which is very spectacular. There is a trail in the park that leads down to the bottom of the valley, and you can take a speedboat into the whirlpool to experience the thrilling scene.

Cave of the Winds

The entrance to the Cave of the Winds is on Goat Island, where there is a small museum and a small cinema. You can then take an elevator down 53 meters in the Niagara Gorge cave to the bottom of the valley. Standing at the foot of the falls, looking up, you will see the falls rushing down with overwhelming momentum, which can't help but make people feel passionate and resonate with nature.

Maid of The Mist

The Maid of the Mist is the most monumental boat trip in the United States since 1846. There is no better way to experience Niagara Falls in the United States. Put on a blue raincoat and take aboard the dreamy Maid of the Mist boat to experience the refreshing mist, surging waves, and roaring waterfalls produced by more than 2 million liters of water per second. As a unique fleet of yachts, under the skilled command of captains, they have been sailing safely in the waves of the Niagara Gorge for more than 100 years and have carried tens of millions of tourists directly into the depths of the misty water.

All day

With so many areas and landmarks so well known, exploring the entire city in one day can seem like an impossible task, but we have itineraries designed just for you. Under the guidance and introduction of the guide, you can learn more about the unique history and culture of this city by visiting many famous landmarks!

New York City Fortune Tour (Mandatory, 2 hours) → **One World Trade Center Observatory** (Optional, 70 mins) → **Liberty Cruise** (Optional, 60 mins) → **Washington, D.C.**

New York City Fortune Tour:

First Stop: Canyon of Heroes → Woolworth Building → 15 Park Row (the world's tallest skyscraper between 1899-1901) → The Porter Building → St. Paul's Church → Telegraph Building

Second Stop: Equitable Building → Trinity Church → Bank of New York → Federal Hall → New York Stock Exchange → Trump Building → Deutsche Bank → Charging Bull → Customs House → Standard Oil Building → Cunard Line HQ

Third Stop: Times Square

Morning

New York City Fortune Tour

Manhattan's financial dream blossomed in New York, where almost all the world's top financial institutions are gathered. Today we will visit some classic landmark buildings in New York, the world's financial center, such as the Canyon of Heroes, Park Road Building, Trinity Church, New York Stock Exchange, Rockefeller Center, etc., to experience the rich financial and commercial atmosphere.

One World Trade Center Observatory

One World Trade Center, also known as the "Freedom Tower," stands on the site of the original World Trade Center, which collapsed during the September 11 attacks. At 1,776 feet, One World Trade Center is the tallest building in the United States and the third tallest in the world. This height commemorates the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. Upon arrival, guests are greeted by a large video board featuring welcome messages in various languages, and their hometowns are highlighted on a dynamically generated world map. "Voices" offers a unique experience, where the story of the people who built the building recounts their experiences, while "Foundations" provides an up-close look at the bedrock on which the building stands. From the Global Welcome Center to the guest elevators featuring virtual time-lapse, to the breathtaking video displays, and finally to the Discovery Level with its 360-degree views, every detail is a welcome addition to this experience.

Liberty Cruise

Take the Statue of Liberty cruise around the island to start a one-hour tour of the Hudson River. On the way, you will see the Manhattan skyline and the scenery on both sides of the Hudson River, and overlook the Empire State Building and the World Trade Center. The cruise slowly passes by the Statue of Liberty, and you can clearly see the Statue of Liberty wearing a radiant crown, holding the torch of freedom, and holding the Declaration of Independence in her hand. It is magnificent and eye-catching, symbolizing the lofty ideals of the American people for freedom and their yearning and pursuit for a better life.

Day 6

National Museum of American History

All day

On the last day of the trip, we will drive to the National Museum of American History. Smithsonian National Museum of American History

The National Museum of American History is the largest museum in the United States. It is a subsidiary museum of the Smithsonian Institution and is located on Constitution Avenue in Washington, DC. The museum has a collection of more than 17 million historical relics related to the industry, agriculture, science, technology, politics, military, finance, handicrafts, transportation, post and telecommunications, textiles, medicine, clothing, music, folklore, etc. It reflects the evolution of American experience from colonial times to the present, allowing people to understand the history of United States and the people of different races living here.
