Tour introduction

Day 1

Paris - Vehicle - Luzern

All day

In the morning, we will set off along the highway towards the Swiss border. We are expected to enter Switzerland in the afternoon via the French, German and Swiss transportation hub Basel. After crossing the border, we will drive to Lucerne, a famous city in central Switzerland. If time permits, we will visit Lucerne and check in at the famous "Dying Lion" monument that praises the loyalty and bravery of the Swiss people and the landmark building of Lucerne, the Chapel Bridge.

[Monday] Itinerary:

Paris → Luzern (30 mins) → Lion Monument & Chapel Bridge and Water Tower (30 mins)

Morning Transportation: Drive from Paris to Luzern

Travel distance: 600km Travel time: 7Hour

Afternoon

Lion Monument

The wounded lion statue designed and carved by Danish sculptor Bertel Thorvaldsen was built to commemorate the 786 Swiss officers and guards who died protecting King Louis XVI and Queen Marie during the French Revolution in 1792. It is intended to pray for world peace. There is a text describing the incident below the monument. American novelist Mark Twain once praised the Lucerne lion as "the saddest and most touching stone sculpture in the world."

Chapel Bridge and Water Tower

Lucerne's landmark is considered to be Europe's oldest covered bridge! It was built in 1332 and was originally a part of the city fortifications. The pictorial panels, which were incorporated in the 17th century contain scenes of the Swiss and Lucerne's amazing history. This includes the biographies of the city's patron saints, St. Leodegar and St. Maurice. Lucerne's water tower is a powerful and attractive construction that you must see!

Day 2

All day

We will depart for Italy in the morning and arrive in Milan, the fashion capital, at noon. We will visit Milan Cathedral, which is said to be the third largest cathedral in the world and the symbol of Milan. The nearby Vittoria Emanuele II shopping street has huge arched buildings and glittering glass decorations. It is magnificent and lined with famous brands. In the afternoon, we will drive to Venice.

Lucerne → **Mt. Pilatus/Titlis** (Choose one of the two, optional, 2 hours) → **Milan** → **Milan Cathedral** (exterior, 30 mins) → **Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II** (30 mins) → **Venice**

Morning

Pilatus

By the Kapellbrücke in Lucerne, one can look up to see the majestic and towering Mount Pilatus, steeped in the legend of dragons. In Lucerne, there is even a Pilatus Street and a Pilatus Radio station, reflecting people's deep affection for this mountain. Mount Pilatus is renowned for its steep cogwheel railway and attractions like the "Golden Round Trip." At the summit, visitors can gaze south toward the continuous peaks of the Alps, while turning north offers views stretching across numerous lakes to the Black Forest region of Germany. The mountaintop also features several leisurely hiking trails, including the "Dragon Path."

Mount Titlis

Mount Titlis belongs to the Alps, with an altitude of 3,020 meters. It is the highest peak in central Switzerland and has the only glacier in central Switzerland. It is world-famous for its glaciers and glacial cracks that never melt all year round. You can take a 360-degree rotating cable car to the Titlis Glacier Park, where you can enjoy the beautiful scenery all around during the climb. When you reach the top, you will see magnificent mountains covered with snow, ice caves and glaciers. There are observation decks, restaurants, bars, nostalgic photo studios and souvenir shops on the top of the mountain.

Milan Cathedral

The world's largest Gothic cathedral is not only a church or a building, but also the spiritual symbol and landmark of Milan, a miracle in the history of world architecture and world civilization. Architectural Features There are 135 spires in the cathedral, each with a statue. Sculptures and spires are one of the characteristics of Gothic architecture. Milan Cathedral fully demonstrates this feature, so it is also the Gothic cathedral with the most statues in the world.

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II

The Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II is a covered arcade street named after King Vittorio Emanuele II of the unified Italy. It is considered one of the most beautiful commercial arcades in Europe. The arcade was built by the designer in imitation of the classical commercial arcades in Paris. The two intersecting corridors are in the shape of a cross, 198 meters long from north to south and 105 meters long from east to west. The two glass-vaulted corridors meet in the octagonal space in the middle, with a glass dome above. The sun shines through the glass roof and shines on the exquisite reliefs and murals below, emitting a sacred golden light.

Day 3

Venice - Vehicle - Rome

All day

In the morning, we will visit Venice, one of the world's top ten tourist destinations and known as the "Water City". We will take a "water taxi" to the famous St. Mark's Square, visit the Byzantine-style St. Mark's Basilica, the Bridge of Sighs connecting the palace and the prison, the once busiest Grand Canal, and the unique shopping alleys. Group members can take an authentic gondola at their own expense to cruise along the canals and enjoy the scenery of the Water City. Later, we will go to the famous glass craft factory to visit the process of glassmaking in Venice, which has hundreds of years of history. In the afternoon, we will set off for Rome, the capital of Italy, the "Eternal City".

[Wednesday] Itinerary:

Venice (1.5 hours): **St. Mark's Square + Church of Saint Mark + Bridge of Sighs + Venice Gondola Rides** (you can take a gondola cruise or a Golden Canal cruise at your own expense) → **Glass Craft Factory** (1 hour) → **Rome**

Morning

St. Mark's Square

St. Mark's Square is unique among European city squares. It is located in the city center, but it is not as noisy as other squares, thanks to the quiet water traffic in Venice. As a landmark of Venice, it is favored by tourists, photographers and even pigeons. There is a circle of exquisite Renaissance-style buildings on the edge of the square. St. Mark's Basilica, the Mint, and the Doge's Palace are located on the east side of the square. On the south side are the bell tower and the new and old parliament buildings. Climbing the bell tower, you can overlook the entire square.

Church of Saint Mark

The Church of St. Mark is a Serbian Orthodox church located in the Tašmajdan park in Belgrade. It was built in the Serbo-Byzantine style by the Krstić brothers and was completed in 1940. It was completed on the site of a previous church dating back to 1835. Today, it is one of the largest churches in the country.

Bridge of Sighs

The Bridge of Sighs is a Baroque-style stone bridge located on the side of the Doge's Palace. It is one of the most famous bridges in Venice. It is a sealed arch bridge building, and you can only look out through the small windows on the bridge. The two ends of the bridge connect the court and the prison. Death row prisoners pass through this bridge before execution and sigh about their impending life, hence the name "Bridge of Sighs". The current Bridge of Sighs is the bridge in the movie "Bridge of Sighs" where the exiled hero and heroine promised each other for life at sunset, thus sweeping away its gloomy and ominous atmosphere.

Venice Gondola Rides

Venice is a very unique city, with water as the entrance and the river as the street. Apart from buildings and squares, there is almost no land in the city. Venice has no roads, no cars, no traffic lights, only winding waterways, boats coming and going, and more than 400 bridges of different styles. The unique Venetian gondola has a unique name - "gondola". This light, slender, and uniquely shaped boat has a history of more than a thousand years. It has always been a means of transportation for Venetians living on the lagoon.

Day 4

Rome - Vehicle - Arezzo

All day

In the morning, we will visit the famous Roman attractions: the Colosseum, the cultural essence built in 72 AD, the Arch of Constantine, the magnificent Mausoleum of Unity, and the Fountain of Dei Vire, also known as the Trevi Fountain. In the afternoon, we will set off towards Florence, known as the cradle of culture.

[Thursday] Itinerary:

Colosseum (exterior, 15 mins) → **Arch of Constantine** (exterior, 15 mins) → **Il Vittoriano** (exterior, 15 mins) → **Trevi Fountain** (exterior, 15 mins) → **Bagnoregio** (Optional, 1 hour) → **Arezzo**

Morning

Colosseum

The Colosseum is the iconic symbol of Imperial Rome and one of Rome's most popular tourist attractions! It is an oval amphitheater located in the center of the city of Rome and east of the Roman Forum. It is the largest ancient amphitheater ever built and is still the largest standing amphitheater in the world today.

Arch of Constantine

The Arch of Constantine, located on the west side of the Colosseum, is 25.7 meters long, 7.4 meters wide, and 21 meters high. It has three arches with exquisite sculptures and is magnificent. It was built to commemorate Constantine the Great's victory over Emperor Maxentius and the unification of the Roman Empire. There were 21 triumphal arches in ancient Rome, but only three remain in Rome today. The Arch of Constantine is one of them, and the other two are located in the Roman Forum.

Il Vittoriano

The Vittoriano Monument to the Unification of Italy (Il Vittoriano), also known as the Victor Emmanuel II Monument, is located on Piazza Venezia, Rome's largest square. Completed in 1911, it commemorates the unification of Italy and the patron saint of King Vittorio Emanuele II. Due to its shape and color, it has been nicknamed the "Wedding Cake" or "Typewriter." This neoclassical white marble structure took 25 years to complete. Its most striking feature is its curved facade, formed by 16 columns, which combines grandeur and sophistication.

Trevi Fountain

The Trevi Fountain is another magnificent location to visit on your trip to Italy! It is a fountain in the Trevi district in Rome. The proper throwing of coins into the Trevi fountain for good luck is a habit extremely common. In order to do so, you must place the coin in your right hand and toss it over your left shoulder!

Bagnoregio

The ancient city of Bagnoregio is said to be the prototype of Hayao Miyazaki's "Castle in the Sky", so it is also known as the "Castle in the Sky". The ancient city was built during the Etruscan civilization period. It is about 300 meters long and 200 meters wide. Because it is located on the top of volcanic tuff, it collapsed after several earthquakes. In the 19th century, it could only be connected to the outside world by a bridge about one kilometer long. From a distance, it looks like a castle in the sky.

Night

Hotel: A Point Arezzo Park Hotel; Hotel Planet International; similar

All day

Departing in the morning, we'll visit the hilltop Piazza Michelangelo for a panoramic view of Florence, admiring this beautiful city brimming with artistic flair. City attractions include the 13th-century Basilica di Santa Maria del Fiore, the world's third-largest cathedral, and the arched bridge over the Arno River, a medieval gold trading site. The area also houses the burials of Italian celebrities such as Michelangelo, Leonardo da Vinci's concubine, and renowned physicist. The world-renowned Italian leather industry and leatherworking techniques originated here, so we'll take the opportunity to shop at a leather company for practical leather goods. In the afternoon, we'll travel to Pisa and visit the world-famous Leaning Tower of Pisa. Originally the bell tower of Pisa Cathedral, the Leaning Tower, despite its unstable foundation, has remained standing for centuries, becoming a fascinating landmark. Afterward, we'll drive to the port city of Genoa and check into our hotel.

Morning

Florence Cathedral

It is the symbol of Florence and the tallest building in the city. The church complex consists of the cathedral, bell tower and baptistery. It is not only large in scale, but also a representative building of the early Renaissance. The facade of the church is made of bright red, dark green and white marble, which are arranged into geometric shapes. It is very spectacular and fully interprets the classic, elegant and free spirit advocated by the Renaissance. It looks very solemn and exquisite from any angle. No wonder it is named "Madonna of the Flowers".

Basilica of the Holy Cross

The monumental baroque church dominates Krakowskie Przedmieście with its two high towers, and the sculpture of Christ carrying the cross standing in front of the entrance is one of the most recognizable sights in Warsaw. Look at the hand raised toward the sky and imagine what meaning this gesture could have for Varsovians along with the inscription "Sursum Corda" (lift up your hearts) when Poland was partitioned or under occupation.

Palazzo Vecchio (Old Palace)

Palazzo Vecchio, also known as the Old Palace, is located in Piazza del Comune. It was the town hall of the former Florentine Republic. The entrance of the building is decorated with the city emblem and a replica of Michelangelo's famous sculpture "David". In the early days of the Kingdom of Italy, when Florence was still the capital of the kingdom, it was used as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Parliament Building. After the capital was moved to Rome, it has continued to serve as the Florence City Hall to this day. The lintel of the gate is engraved with "King of Kings and Lord of Lords" in Latin, which refers to Jesus Christ. The lions on both sides and the lilies on the wall are the symbols of Florence.

All day

Depart for the French Riviera in the south of France in the morning, arriving in the small country of Monaco around noon. Monte Carlo, its capital, boasts stunning scenery, nestled against the backdrop of mountains and facing the sea, making it a sought-after holiday haven for the world's wealthy. From the hilltop of the Monaco Palace, you'll enjoy breathtaking views of the small country. Afterward, we'll travel to the relaxing resort of Nice, admiring the Bay of Angers and the Promenade des Anglais. We'll then proceed to Cannes, renowned for its film festivals. Take in the venues, where the handprint-studded cobblestones bear witness to the lives of international stars who have graced the streets. Southern France is renowned for its perfume production, so we'll pass through perfume-producing towns along the way, visiting a perfume factory where you can choose your favorite scent. Departing the French Riviera in the afternoon, we'll drive to the nearby city of Avignon and check into our hotel (without stopping in or passing through Avignon).

Bay of Angels

The Bay of Angels is located on the Promenade des Anglais and is named after its shape resembling angel wings. The Bay of Angels is one of the beautiful beaches in France and a good place to spend the summer. Climbing up the castle and looking down from the east is a good angle to appreciate the Bay of Angels. If you don't visit the Bay of Angels, you will have wasted your trip to Nice. If there is a blue moon in the world, it must be in the Bay of Angels in Nice.

Promenade des Anglais

The Promenade des Anglais was built by the British colonists in Nice in 1822. It is 5 kilometers long and is located next to the Bay of Angels, connecting Nice Airport and the Castle Hill. The avenue is decorated with palm trees all year round, and is lined with famous brand shops and luxury hotels on both sides. In the 19th century, a large number of British people chose the Bay of Angels in Nice as their holiday destination to escape the cold winter. In 1820, the British Lewis David initiated a social fundraising to build the pedestrian street, which was only 2 meters wide at the time, into the avenue of today's scale, and named the avenue "Anglais".
