Tour introduction

Day 1

Madrid - Vehicle - Zaragoza

All day

Greeted by the first rays of sunlight in Madrid, we'll officially embark on this exciting and unforgettable journey!

We'll begin our visit with a series of landmarks in the Spanish capital. The Grand Palace, a magnificent building from the heyday of the Spanish monarchy, evokes the lingering glory of the former empire. The bronze kilometer zero marker, representing the center of Spain, sits discreetly on the Puerta del Sol pedestrian path. Puerta del Sol, lined with shops, is a great place to shop for Spanish specialties, clothing, and souvenirs. In the afternoon, we'll

depart for Zaragoza. Upon arrival, we'll head directly to Plaza del Ángel to admire the Baroque architecture. Finally, we'll visit the majestic Basilica of Our Lady of the Pilar, located within the plaza. Legend has it that the Virgin Mary appeared here before her ascension, making it considered the first chapel in history. We'll conclude our enriching day exploring Baroque architecture and religious art before transferring to our hotel for check-in and rest.

[Monday] Itinerary:

Madrid → Spain Square (15 mins) → Columbus Monument (15 mins) → Royal Palace of Madrid (Outside visit, 15 mins) → Plaza Mayor (Free time, 90 mins. If guests have purchased tickets independently/pre-booked the Madrid Royal Palace, they may use this time to visit) → Puerta del Sol & Kilometer Zero (15 mins) → Zaragoza → Plaza of Our Lady of the Pilar (15 mins) → Basilica of Our Lady of the Pilar (Outside visit, 15 mins)

2. The Royal Palace of Madrid will be closed on 01/05/2026, 01/12/2026, 03/23/2026, and 03/30/2026. During these dates, private paid entry to the palace is not available—only exterior viewing is permitted. The itinerary will be adjusted to include a complimentary 20-minute tour of Retiro Park.

Spain Square

Located at the end of the Gran Vía, the most conspicuous thing in the center of the square is the Cervantes Monument. Directly in front of the Cervantes statue are the images of Don Quixote and Sancho Panza, the protagonists of his book "Don Quixote".

Columbus Monument

The monument is 60 meters high and was built to commemorate Columbus' triumphant return from his expedition to America in 1492. Five flying goddesses are carved around the center of the column, and eight huge black lions are carved around the base. There are also inscriptions recording Columbus's sailing deeds and sculptures of King Ferdinand and the Queen who funded his expedition at the time. The full-length statue of Columbus on the top of the column is made of cast iron melted from the cannon in front of the Montjuic Castle. It is the largest statue of Columbus in the world, showing Columbus looking into the distance with his right arm pointing to the ocean ahead.

Royal Palace of Madrid

The Royal Palace, also known as the Oriental Palace, is no longer the residence of the royal family, but it is still the main place for the king to receive state guests. The architecture of the Royal Palace combines the traditional Spanish royal architectural style and the Baroque architectural style. The overall shape of the palace is square, with each side 180 meters long and built of white granite.

Plaza Mayor

The Plaza Mayor is a major public space in the heart of Madrid, the capital of Spain. It was once the centre of Old Madrid. It was first built (1580–1619) during the reign of Philip III. Only a few blocks away is another famous plaza, the Puerta del Sol. The Plaza Mayor is a space for the people of Madrid and tourists to shop, walk around, eat, and enjoy the outdoors.

Kilometer Zero

This is the zero kilometer starting point for all roads in Madrid and the whole of Spain. It was originally established by King Philip II in the 16th century. In Spain, all roads lead to the Puerta del Sol. So there is a semicircular graphic sign made of tiles on the sidewalk in front of the municipal building. In the middle of the sign is a map of Spain with KM 0 written on it. In the middle of the map, there is a 0 at the intersection of two pointers pointing in different directions. Another name for it is: the belly button of Spain.

Puerta del Sol

This is the seat of the Madrid Regional Government and one of the most prosperous commercial areas in Madrid. In the middle of Puerta del Sol is the "Zero Kilometer Landmark", which is the center of the Iberian Peninsula.

Plaza of Our Lady of the Pillar

Located south of the Ebro River, it is a large square in the old town of Zaragoza that can accommodate 500 people. It is named after the Cathedral of Our Lady of Pilar on the square and is humorously called the "living room of the city" of Zaragoza. It is also often called the Cathedral Square (Plaza de las Catedrales), where the two cathedrals of Zaragoza, the Cathedral of Our Lady of Pilar and the Cathedral of Our Lady of Pilar, are located.

Basilica of Our Lady of the Pillar

The 11-domed Church of Our Lady of Pilar is the symbol of Zaragoza and has many beautiful stories. It was originally a Gothic church building, and silversmith and Baroque art styles were added to parts of it during the construction, renovation and decoration process. The church was built in the 14th century, the decorative screen

of the central altar is a 15th century work, and the tapestry painting of the Passion of Christ was made in the 15th and 16th centuries.

Day 2

Zaragoza - Vehicle - Barcelona

In the morning, we will set off for the charming and passionate Barcelona. After arriving, we will visit the most representative Sagrada Familia, which is a masterpiece of Gaudi, the famous architectural genius. We will continue to the exterior of the Camp Nou, the home stadium of the Spanish La Liga powerhouse Barcelona. As the stadium is undergoing renovation, you can take photos outside the building. After the tour, we will visit the Olympic Games venue on the Montjuic Hill, where the 1992 Olympic Games were held. From the hill, you can overlook the city. Then we will visit the bustling Las Ramblas and Plaza Catalunya in the city center, which are must-see hot spots in Barcelona! After the tour, check in to the hotel and rest.

Sagrada Familia

The masterpiece of the genius artist Gaudi is not only listed as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage, but also a holy place in the minds of many tourists. The three facades of the church are presented in a magnificent and coordinated manner, with simple and neat lines. The reliefs on the door and wall of the church show the stories of the Bible, which are like living creatures. The design of the interior of the church, inspired by caves, mountains, flowers, plants and animals, adds a mysterious rhythm to the church, which is impressive.

Plaza de Gaudí

Plaza de Gaudí, located in the northern part of Barcelona city, Spain, covers an area of 20 hectares. Constructed between 1900 and 1914, it stands as one of the masterpieces of architect Antoni Gaudí. Designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984, this park is an outstanding representation of Gaudí's distinctive architectural style.

It vividly embodies his profound love for natural elements and his bold departure from conventional architectural forms. Attracting visitors and architecture enthusiasts from around the globe, Plaza de Gaudí offers a captivating experience to explore its unique charm and immerse in the rich cultural heritage of Barcelona.

Camp Nou

Camp Nou is located in Barcelona, Spain, and is the home stadium of the Spanish La Liga team FC Barcelona. Camp Nou is the largest stadium in the entire European continent, originally accommodating 98,000 spectators. During the 1982 World Cup in Spain, the number of seats in the stadium increased to 120,000. It is also the second largest stadium in the world, second only to the legendary Maracanã Stadium in Brazil. Currently, modern general equipment makes it the best football venue in Europe. In the 1998-99 season, UEFA awarded it the title of "Five-Star" stadium.

Barcelona Olympic Stadium Lluís Companies Olympic Stadium

The Olympic Stadium is located on Montjuic Hill in downtown Barcelona. Standing at the entrance of the stadium, you can overlook the city of Barcelona. This was the main venue of the 1992 Barcelona Olympic Games, where the opening and closing ceremonies and track and field events were held. The streamlined torch tower is at the north entrance of the stadium. Here you can imagine the spectacular ceremony of Antonio Rebollo shooting an arrow to light the Olympic flame at the opening ceremony.

Las Ramblas

The middle of the avenue is full of flower shops and pavilions. This is a street full of life and colour, with a central sidewalk where you can stroll among the various stalls, florists and shops. The avenue is over one kilometer long, starting from Plaza Catalunya and ending at the Columbus Tower. Each section of the road has a different name. Frequented by tourists and Barcelona locals, this place is always bustling with activity. In addition, there are frequent performances by street artists, which, together with other ever-changing performances, turn Las Ramblas into an unforgettable miniature tour of Barcelona. It was built in the 18th century and was derived from Barcelona's medieval city walls. Today it contains many of Barcelona's most important buildings.

Plaza Catalunya

Plaza Catalunya is the central square of Barcelona and one of its main attractions. It is one of the largest squares in Spain and one of the core areas of Barcelona life. Many important streets such as Las Ramblas, Passeig de Gràcia or Roundabout Sant Pere start from here. The grounds are large and host performances, exhibitions and trade fairs or fashion shows throughout the year. In addition, it is one of Barcelona's main commercial districts and a hub for many modes of transportation. There is a huge space in the center of the square, surrounded by gardens and forests. It features two twin fountains separated by a terrace and sculptures by important artists, mainly Catalan.

In the morning, we will depart along the coastline to Valencia, the third largest city in Spain. Historically, Valencia has always served as Spain's gateway to the Mediterranean and is a center of commerce and culture. At that time, Valencia was radiant and attracted Arabs to come and go frequently, making Valencia enjoy prosperity and glory that other cities did not have. Although Valencia has lost its aura today, it is still an important city for trade fairs, and the Fallas Fire Festival held every March makes it famous. The world-famous Spanish seafood paella originated here. After arriving, visit the Plaza Mayor, the ancient city gate and the Valencia Cathedral in the old town. The most eye-catching thing in the church is the agate cup collected in the south wing chapel. It is said that this cup is the Holy Grail used by Jesus at the Last Supper. After the tour, head to the white coast resort city of Alicante and stay at the hotel.

Peniscola is located on the Costa del Sol in Spain. It is one of the most beautiful towns in Spain and is famous for its beautiful sea views and medieval castles. The town is surrounded by the sea on three sides and has a great sea view. Here you can not only see the first ray of sunlight breaking through the clouds and shining on the sea in the early morning, but also capture the last rays of the setting sun. The beautiful Irta Mountains are towering, making it a place that photography enthusiasts yearn for. In 1411, Pope Luna moved here because he yearned for the beauty of this town and lived there for 18 years until he abdicated.

Plaza de la Virgen is one of the landmarks of La Seu in the old town. Its pink exterior wall and conical spire are very distinctive.

Valencia Cathedral Quart and Serranos Towers

This is a long-standing ancient building that has gone through the changes of ancient Roman temples, Arab mosques and Christian churches. It is a witness to the historical changes of the country of Spain. Because of this, this church also contains a variety of architectural styles such as Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque, and Neoclassicism, and is well worth viewing.

Day 4

Alicante - Vehicle - Granada - Vehicle - Mijas/Malaga

All day

In the morning, we will depart for Granada, a historic city at the foot of the Sierra Nevada Mountains in Andalucia. This city was ruled by the Visigoths and Arabs, and was the last stronghold of the Arab Moorish dynasty that ruled the Iberian Peninsula for 800 years. In the 15th century, King Ferdinand successfully expelled the Arabs and completed the great cause of unifying Spain, leaving behind relics of various civilizations and cultures. After arriving, we will visit the Alhambra Palace (also known as the Red Palace), a product left by the Moors in the "Golden Age". The exquisite architecture, fresh and refined style, and stunning beauty are admirable. You can enter the interior if you book tickets in advance. If you do not book, you can visit the old town for free. After the tour, we will go to the famous resort Costa del Sol. At dusk, we will arrive at the white house village of Mijas for a tour. The classic Andalucia mountain city scenery overlooks the beautiful scenery of the Costa del Sol. Overnight in Malaga or a nearby city.

Alicante → Granada → Alhambra Palace (Outside visit, 15 mins) → **Charles V Palace area** (free time, 1 hour, Alhambra entry permitted during this period for guests with pre-booked tickets) → **Mijas** (1 hour) → **Malaga**

Kind reminder:

1. In winter, the sunshine is relatively short. If there is not enough time, Mijas from Baiwu Village will go there the next morning.

2. The Alhambra Palace limits the number of tickets per day to control the flow of people. If you want to enter the interior for a visit, it is strongly recommended to book tickets on the official website. The admission time is between 1:30 pm and 2:30 pm. 3. Please be advised that the Alhambra will be closed on 12/25/2025 and 01/01/2026. Consequently, the following adjustments will apply: Free time near the Palace of Charles V and any self-paid visits to the Alhambra are cancelled. Instead, we are pleased to offer a complimentary 1-hour tour of the Albayzín district. This tour includes a stop at the Mirador de San Nicolás, celebrated as the premier vantage point for stunning panoramic views of the Alhambra.

Alhambra Palace

The Alhambra Palace is the royal palace of the Kingdom of Granada established by the Moors in Spain in the

Middle Ages. Its name comes from Arabic, meaning "Red Castle". The palace is a masterpiece of architecture that perfectly combines Islamic secular architecture with gardening techniques, and is an excellent representative of Arabic palace and courtyard architecture. In 1984, it was listed as a cultural heritage in the World Heritage List. The Alhambra Palace is mainly composed of the Alcazaba Castle, the Nasrid Palaces, and the Generalife Palace as a summer palace. The Lion Courtyard and the Myrtles Courtyard are also attractions that cannot be missed.

Costa del Sol

The Costa del Sol is a region on the Mediterranean coast of the province of Málaga in Andalusia, southern Spain, between the Costa de la Luz and the Costa Tropical. Previously just a few quiet fishing villages, the area became a world-famous tourist destination in the second half of the 20th century thanks to the whitewashed villages located on the hills overlooking the ocean, attracting millions of visitors each year.

Day 5

All day

In the morning, we will head to the romantic cliff town of Ronda. It is as spectacular and magical as a city in the sky. The romance of the breathtaking cliffs and ancient bridges makes Ronda the most suitable town for honeymoons and elopements in Hemingway's works. It attracts countless tourists to visit and is one of the famous attractions in southern Spain. We will then transfer to Seville, the soul of Andalusia. This city was once the capital of the Islamic Empire, the guardian angel of Andalusian culture, the birthplace of Flamenco dance, and the host of the 1992 World Expo. Upon arrival, we will visit the Cathedral, built in the 16th century. Next to the main altar is the tomb of Christopher Columbus, which was built to honor the great navigator's discovery of the New World. After the tour, we will proceed to the Royal Palace of Seville, which was listed as a World Cultural Heritage by the United Nations in 1987. This building has experienced both Islamic and Catholic dynasties, and the clever combination of the past and present has formed one of the most complex and beautiful buildings in the world. We will then stroll through the Santa Cruz Barrio, the Torre del Oro, and the Maria Luisa Park, which was the site of the 1992 World Expo. The intricately carved porcelain paintings in the Plaza de España detail the history and style of bygone Spain.

Seville Cathedral

The Cathedral of Saint Mary of the See, better known as Seville Cathedral, is a Roman Catholic cathedral in Seville, Andalusia, Spain. It was registered in 1987 by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, along with the adjoining Alcázar palace complex and the General Archive of the Indies. It is the fourth-largest church in the world as well as the largest Gothic church.

Alcazar of Segovia

The Royal Alcazar of Segovia, historically known as al-Qasr al-Muriq and commonly known as the Alcazar of

Segovia, is a royal palace in Seville, Spain, built for the Christian king Peter of Castile. The palace is a preeminent example of Mudejar style in the Iberian Peninsula, combining Romanesque, Gothic, and Renaissance structural elements. It was registered in 1987 by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, along with the adjoining Seville Cathedral and the General Archive of the Indies.

Barrio Santa Cruz

The Santa Cruz is the old Jewish quarter of Seville, a famous neighborhood and major tourist destination in the center of Seville, Spain, with its whitewashed houses, mansions, and courtyards.

Tower of Gold

The Torre del Oro (English: "Tower of Gold") is a dodecagonal military watchtower in Seville, southern Spain. It was erected by the Almohad Caliphate in order to control access to Seville via the Guadalquivir River. Its name comes from the golden shine it projected on the river, due to its building materials (a mixture of mortar, lime and pressed hay).

Maria Luisa Park

María Luisa Park is a major urban park in Seville. Designed by French landscape architect Floresté for the 1929 Ibero-American International Exhibition, it gave rise to a uniquely Spanish garden architecture style known as the "Neo-Sevillian" or "Neo-Arab," which significantly influenced the design of all Spanish public parks during the first three decades of the 20th century.

Spain Square

The Plaza de España is a spectacle of light and majesty. Framed in the María Luisa Park, this plaza was designed by the great Seville architect Aníbal González as an emblematic space for the 1929 Ibero-American Expo. The result was a plaza-palace unique in the world. Its proportions are lavish. It has a total area of 50,000 square meters, without a doubt one of the most imposing plazas in Spain.

All day

In the morning, we will set off towards the Portuguese border. After crossing the border, we will arrive at Cape Roca, the westernmost point of the European continent, in the afternoon. In addition to feeling the vastness of the Atlantic Ocean, you can also purchase a commemorative certificate to prove that you have set foot on the western end of Europe, which is of great commemorative value. After the tour, we will go to the capital Lisbon to visit the famous Belém Tower in the city, a monument to the navigators who symbolized Portugal as a pioneer in the age of navigation and the discovery of the New World. Then we will go to the Jerónimos Monastery to take a peek at the Manueline-style exterior left over from the heyday of Portugal's maritime power in the 16th century. After the tour, we will be sent to the Plaza de Lima Luci and Plaza Pambo for free activities. If you are interested, you can try the authentic Portuguese egg tarts in a century-old shop.

Cabo da Roca

At the seaside in the western suburbs of Lisbon, you can visit Cape Roca, "the end of the continent and the beginning of the ocean," and the monument that records the precise longitude and latitude. Overlooking the endless Atlantic Ocean and breathing the fresh sea breeze is refreshing.

Belem Tower

Belém Tower, officially the Tower of Saint Vincent is a 16th-century fortification located in Lisbon. It once served as a point of embarkation and disembarkation for Portuguese explorers and as a ceremonial gateway to Lisbon. It was built during the height of the Portuguese Renaissance and is a prominent example of the Portuguese Manueline style. It also incorporates hints of other architectural styles. The structure was built from lioz limestone and is composed of a bastion, a 30-metre (98.4 ft), four-storey tower. Since 1983, the tower has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one that you must discover.

Monument to the Discoveries

The Portuguese Maritime Monument was built in 1960. It stands on the square by the sea. It is magnificent and has become a symbol of Portugal. From a distance, the monument's solid base looks like a white stone sailboat sailing on the sea, which makes people imagine. In terms of details, the exquisite stone carvings of figures on the base are exquisitely crafted and can be called a masterpiece. The monument is engraved with statues of Henry,

Da Gama and 80 other sailors. On both sides are some navigators who set out with him, as well as famous generals, missionaries and scientists in Portuguese history. Behind the monument is a large cross symbolizing religious beliefs.

Maria Luisa Park

María Luisa Park is a major urban park in Seville. Designed by French landscape architect Floresté for the 1929 Ibero-American International Exhibition, it gave rise to a uniquely Spanish garden architecture style known as the "Neo-Sevillian" or "Neo-Arab," which significantly influenced the design of all Spanish public parks during the first three decades of the 20th century.

Mosteiro dos Jeronimos Monastery

The Monastery of Saint Jerónimos is a magnificent monastery located in the Belém district of Lisbon, Portugal. It can be said to be a treasure of architectural art from the heyday of Portugal. It was built to commemorate the discovery of the sea route to India by the Portuguese. The famous navigator Vasco da Gama is also buried here. In 1983, it was listed as a World Cultural Heritage by UNESCO together with the nearby Belém Tower.

Toledo Cathedral

Toledo was once the capital of the Kingdom of Castile in Spain and is a world cultural heritage city. You can get a bird's eye view of Toledo from the top of the Ring Hill. Toledo itself is a work of art, with streets and alleys full of Roman, Visigothic, Muslim and Jewish-style buildings. Stroll through the famous Toledo Art District and enjoy the vicissitudes and beauty of this small city known as the "city crowned by the imperial crown".

Catedral de Toledo

Toledo Cathedral (Catedral de Toledo) is a prominent example of Spanish Gothic architecture and the cathedral of the Catholic Archdiocese of Toledo. Construction began in 1226 and took nearly 300 years to complete, with further additions in the 18th century, each spanning several decades. Combining a variety of architectural styles, it is one of the largest cathedrals in Spain. Beyond being a religious sanctuary, the cathedral also houses a vast collection of precious art, including paintings, sculptures, and gold and silver artifacts.
