Tour introduction

Day 1

Home - Airplane - Honolulu

All day

Welcome to paradise on Earth! Shortly upon your arrival, your tour guide will be waiting for you at the airport. He or she will arrange for you to check in at the hotel.

Free pick-up airport: Honolulu International Airport (HNL)

Free airport pickup time on the tour day: 07:00-21:59. This time refers to the meeting time between guests and the tour guide; no waiting for late arrivals.

On the pickup day, it is recommended to book flights arriving before 22:00. If flights arrive between 22:00 and 6:00 the next day due to force majeure factors such as flight delays, free airport pickup service cannot be provided. We appreciate your understanding.

Day 2

Pearl Harbor - Vehicle - Half day city tour

All day

At 07:45am we will depart from the hotel to visit Pearl Harbor located in the southwestern part of Oahu, Hawaii. Pearl Harbor overlooks the USS Arizona Memorial, which was sunk by the Japanese army, as well as USS Missouri. Afterwards, we will pass by the Hawaii State Capitol and the Pacific National Cemetery for Soldiers and Martyrs, which was closed to sightseeing vehicles after the 9/11 incident. We will pass through Chinatown and overlook the bronze statue of Mr. Sun Yat-sen. We will visit the bronze statue of the first king of Hawaii, Kamehameha, the King's Palace, and the city government building. Finally, we will visit the unique emeralds, black pearls, and red coral shops in Hawaii and return to the hotel around 12:00.

Itinerary:

Pearl Harbor (90 mins, including the USS Arizona Memorial) → **Hawaii State Capitol** (pass by) → **Hawaii Chinatown** (pass by) → **Kamehameha Statue, Kapaau** (outside visit, 15 mins) → **Iolani Palace** (Looking in the distance) → **Emerald, Black Pearl, Red Coral Shop**

Note: Pearl Harbor stipulates that tour guides are not allowed to give explanations within the park; tourists are not allowed to bring any bags into the park, with the exception of wallets.

Morning

Pearl Harbor

Pearl Harbor, nestled at the lowest point of the plains between the Kolau and Waianae Mountains on Oahu's south coast, is a US Navy base and shipbuilding facility, and one of the largest and best safe harbors in the North Pacific. The Pearl Harbor attack occurred on the early morning of December 7, 1941, when Japanese Combined Fleet aircraft and midget submarines launched a surprise attack on the US Naval Base at Pearl Harbor and US Army and Navy airfields on Oahu, Hawaii. We can see the Arizona Memorial, erected by the US government in

1980 on the wreck of the USS Arizona, to commemorate the painful lesson of that attack.

Hawaii State Capital

The Hawaii State Capitol, built in 1969, is a postmodernist architectural masterpiece by I.M. Pei, known for its unique style. The two conical legislative chambers represent Hawaii's volcanic roots, while the numerous supporting columns symbolize palm trees. The vast pool surrounding the open-air rotunda represents the Pacific Ocean surrounding the Hawaiian Islands.

Kamehameha Statue

The King Kamehameha statue is located in downtown Honolulu. The statue depicts King Kamehameha, draped in a feathered cape symbolizing royal authority, holding a spear in his left hand and extending his right hand in a gesture of welcome. King Kamehameha was the first king in Hawaiian history to unify the Hawaiian Islands. Of the fifty states in the United States, only Hawaii has ever been ruled by a king. It's no surprise, then, that the King Kamehameha statue has become a must-see attraction for visitors to Hawaii.

Iolani Palace

The 'Iolani Palace is located in the capitol district of downtown Honolulu. It is now a National Historic Landmark listed on the National Register of Historic Places. After the monarchy was overthrown in 1893, the building was used as the capitol building for the Provisional Government, Republic, Territory, and State of Hawaii until 1969. The palace was then restored and opened to the public as a museum in 1978. An interesting fact to note is that the 'Iolani Palace is the only royal palace on US soil.

Day 3

Little Circle Island Tour

All day

Join us on this beautiful day as we depart from the hotel! We will first pass by the world-famous-beach Waikiki Beach, to see the Diamond Head volcano! This beach is also a hotspot surf center that has spectacular sea views. Following that we will pass through the high-class residential area of Hahaione and stop at the Hanauma Bay. Shortly after, we will visit the natural wonders of the sea spring vents and pass by Sauna Beach. Here, we will overlook Rabbit Island and Turtle Island! Take a look as we pass by the White Beach, the Hawaiian National Reserve, and the Dafengkou Scenic Area. Finally, we will return to the hotel.

Itinerary:

Waikiki Beach (Pass-by) → **Diamond Head Lookout** (15 mins) → ***Hala Premium Residential District*** (pass by) → **Hanauma Bay Scenic Area** (15 mins) → **Hālonā Blowhole** (15 mins) → **Sauna Beach** (pass by) → **Rabbit Island and Turtle Island** (overlooking) → **White Beach, Hawaiian National Reserve** (pass by) → **Nuuanu Pali Lookout** (15 mins)

Afternoon

Waikiki Beach

Waikiki is a neighborhood of Honolulu on the south shore of the island of Oʻahu. Waikiki is most famous for Waikiki Beach, which is one of six beaches in the district, along with Queen's Beach, Kuhio Beach, Gray's Beach, Fort DeRussy Beach, and Kahanamoku Beach.

Hālonā Blowhole

On windy days when the tide is high, the ocean breeze sends the waves rolling onto the shore where the rock formation then shoots sea spray high into the air through the cave acting like a geyser. Today you will look at the Hālonā blowhole. This blowhole is most active when the tide is high, and the winds are strong. It can even shoot sea sprays up to thirty feet high in the air.

Nuuanu Pali Lookout

Just a five-mile drive northeast of Downtown Honolulu is the Nuuanu Pali Lookout. It offers panoramic views of the sheer Koolau cliffs and lush Windward Coast. The Pali Lookout is also known for its strong and howling winds. You'll understand why the Nuuanu Pali Lookout is one of Oahu's best scenic points when you feel the wind pushing up against you. You can even hear the winds whistle through the mountains and see the breathtaking views of Oahu's lush Windward Coast.

Night

Day 4

Hawaii Island Tour

All day

Today we will fly to Hawaii Island from Honolulu. First, we will go to the rare black sand. At the same time, there will be great, green surprises waiting to be discovered in these black sands. Passing through Banyan Avenue, we came to a biscuit shop famous for its handmade biscuit. Afterwards, we will arrive at Wailua River State Park, where the bronze statue of King Kamehameha of Hawaii is erected. Then we will arrive at Rainbow Falls, one of the most famous waterfalls in Hawaii. It is named after the common rainbow. When the water splashes, you will

see the rainbow as if it was generated in the waterfall. Finally, we will come to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park. In the visitor center, you can see the changes caused by volcanic activity on the park and the entire island. Such exhibits include visiting the steam holes formed by the rich rainfall and volcanic geothermal in Hawaii; getting up close at the Halemaumau Lookout to observe the crater and feel the majesty of nature; visit the huge Thurston magma tunnel formed by the flow of magma; and seeing with your own eyes the sight of lava flowing through the land on the Chain Crater Road!

Itinerary:

Fly from Honolulu to Hawaii Island → Richardson Black Sand Beach (15-20 mins) → Banyan Avenue (Vehicle View) → Big Island Biscuit Shop (15-20 mins) → Wailua River State Park/King Statue (15-20 mins) → Rainbow Falls (15-20 mins) → Hawaii Volcanoes National Park (1.5-2hours)

All day

Richardson Ocean Park

Richardson Ocean Park is the black sand beach closest to Hilo. It is known to the locals as ‘Richardson’s’ and is the best choice for snorkeling on the East side of the Big Island. Richardson’s is part of a series of beach parks along Kalaniana’ole (south Hilo). If you take a close look at the sand on Richardson beach you will see that it is mostly made out of black lava sand!

Rainbow Falls

The Rainbow Falls cascades 80 ft over a lava cave! Legend has it that it is home to the ancient Hawaiian goddess Hina, the goddess of the moon.

Hawaii Volcanoes National Park

Explore the most geological, powerful, and biological landscapes at the Hawaii Volcanoes National Park! This is a national park that will blow your mind away. It is truly a diverse national park that demonstrates the true power of nature. Explore this unique national park with us today!

Day 5

Maui 1-day Tour

All day

Today, we will fly to the beautiful island of Maui. Our first stop is Ho‘okipa Beach Park, where you’ll witness the

mesmerizing activities of unique marine life. Next, we'll visit Kepaniwai Park and Heritage Gardens, a cultural gem that showcases the history and way of life of Hawaii's diverse communities. Then, we'll arrive at the Maui Tropical Plantation, where you can stroll through lush gardens and admire rare plants from Hawaii and other tropical regions. Afterward, we'll head to Kaanapali Beach, a prime spot for wave watching and surfing. Nearby, the Nakalele Blowhole and the dramatic "Dragon's Teeth" lava formations reveal nature's breathtaking wonders. Finally, the luxurious Kapalua Bay Villas will provide an exquisite resort experience. After a day filled with both serenity and adventure on Maui, we'll return to Honolulu for hotel check-in, leaving you with unforgettable memories.

Itinerary:

Fly From Hawaii Island to Maui → Kahului Airport (OGG) Pickup → Ho'okipa Beach Park (40 mins) → Kepaniwai Park and Heritage Gardens (20 mins) → Maui Tropical Plantation (30 mins) → Kaanapali Beach (30 mins) → Nakalele Blowhole (20 mins) → Dragon's Teeth (40 mins) → Kapalua Bay Villa (20 mins) → Fly From Maui to Honolulu

All day

Ho'okipa Beach Park

Hookipa — it means "hospitality" in Hawaiian. Located miles away from the crowds, this pristine beach is nestled on the island's north shore alongside the Road To Hana. Thanks to its consistent winds, large waves, and sprawling reef system, this is one of the best locations in all of Hawaii for windsurfing. Modern-day surfing on Maui started here, at this beach just outside of the charming artsy town of Paia on Maui's northern coastline.

Kepaniwai Park and Heritage Gardens

Kepaniwai Park and Heritage Gardens, adjacent to the Wailuku Stream, is a beautiful public park containing displays that honor the cultures that contributed to modern Maui. Among the interesting structures are an early-Hawaiian hale, a New England-style saltbox, a Portuguese-style villa with gardens, and dwellings from such other cultures as China and the Philippines. The park's name harkens back to the infamous Battle of Kepaniwai in 1790 between Kamehameha I and Kahekili, king of Maui.

Maui Tropical Plantation

Maui Tropical Plantation is located in Waikapu, on the road heading from Kihei towards Lahaina. The property covers over 60 acres and is home to a wide variety of tropical plants, including crops being cultivated at the plantation including coffee, macadamia nuts, avocado, and papaya.

Kaanapali Beach

Kaanapali Beach is a landmark attraction on Maui Island. It has a 5-kilometer-long white sand beach and clear waters. It is a popular beach for tourists. Visitors can snorkel, swim, fish, surf and other activities here. Of course, you can also lie comfortably on the beach chairs and enjoy a leisurely time. The famous landscape on the beach

is the diving ceremony held on the PuuKekaa on the north side of the beach. The divers will first light the torches placed along the cliffs, and then jump off the PuuKekaa. Tourists can watch this thrilling and exciting scene.

Nakalele Blowhole

Nakalele Blowhole is a 100-foot-tall natural fountain that gushes out like a geyser as the waves and tides surge. Nakalele is a popular tourist attraction on Maui, and you can see it from a safe distance with just a short hike. It is known for its magnificent ocean power and unique environment, and is a must-see for nature lovers and adventure enthusiasts.

Dragon's Teeth

Dragon's Teeth is a scenic spot and geological wonder located in the northwest. The place got its name from its unique rock formations that look like rows of dragon's teeth.

Kapalua Bay Villa

The Kapalua Bay Villa is a place for the rich to relax and vacation. Kapalua can be translated as an arm embracing the sea. It is a gold-level tourist resort in Maui. The villa district is not only designed by a master architect, but also has award-winning restaurants, more than 20 boutiques and historical sites, and also holds Kapalua Wine & Food Festival every year.
