Day 1

Paris - Vehicle - Versailles - Vehicle - Paris

All day

Today you will start your pleasant and wonderful journey by visiting Paris, France. The graceful charm of the French capital, Paris, is world-famous. The buildings full of historical and cultural heritage, and the city temperament filled with art and fashion, all of which have long made Paris a world-famous city and a place that countless tourists who are eager to encounter romance have been looking forward to. Then go to Versailles and visit the Palace of Versailles, which is famous for its luxurious and imaginative architectural design. Finally, return

to Paris.

Arc de Triomphe

The Arc de Triomphe is one of the four representative buildings in Paris (the Eiffel Tower, the Arc de Triomphe, the Louvre and Notre Dame de Paris), and is also the largest round arch on the Champs Elysees. It was built to commemorate Napoleon's victory in the Battle of Austerlitz in 1806. The 12 streets in the city of Paris are centered on the Arc de Triomphe and extend in all directions, which is magnificent. The building uses giant sculptures as the main components of the facade. The four groups of huge sculptures on the facade with the themes of "uprising", "victory", "anti-war" and "peace" were created by three French classical romantic sculpture masters at the time, which have great artistic impact.

Avenue des Champs - Elysées

The Champs-Elysees is the most famous street in Paris. It is 1,800 meters long and about 120 meters wide at its widest point. It is a two-way eight-lane street that starts from the Place de la Concorde in the east and ends at the Place Charles de Gaulle in the west. It is a symbol of the beauty and romance of Paris. The Place des Dots divides it into two parts. The eastern section is dominated by natural scenery, with flat lawns on both sides of the street, which is very quiet and peaceful. The western section is a commercial area, which brings together many famous

shops, giving people a sense of elegance and luxury.

Place de la Concorde

The Place de la Concorde is the most famous square in France and one of the most beautiful squares in the world. During the French Revolution, Louis XVI and Queen Marie were executed here. The square was renamed several times and was finally renamed the Place de la Concorde. The square is surrounded by a moat and is octagonal in shape. To the south is the Seine-Marne River, and the Concorde Bridge on the river connects to the Bourbon Palace, the seat of the French National Assembly on the left bank. To the east, between the Louvre and the Tuileries Garden, which was once the French royal palace and was burned down by the Paris Commune in 1871. To the west of the square is the eastern starting point of the Champs-Élysées, which leads directly to the Place Charles de Gaulle where the Arc de Triomphe is located. To the north of the square are two buildings of the same style, the French Navy Ministry to the east and the Crillon Hotel to the west, with the Royal Road sandwiched in between, leading to the Madeleine Church to the north.

Museum and Napoleon's Tomb

The tomb chamber is about 4 meters long and over 2 meters wide. It is made of red quartzite and placed on a green granite base. On the ground, the name of Napoleon's victory battle is engraved on a mosaic. There are five coffins in the tomb: the first is a tin coffin, the second is a peach blossom wood coffin, the next two are lead coffins, and the fifth is a ebony coffin. The latter is engraved with the name Napoleon. Twelve white marble female statues (known as the "Goddess of Victory") guard this tomb. The circular gallery is decorated with ten marble bas reliefs (surface sculptures) to celebrate Napoleon's rule and the emperor's civil actions.

Eiffel Tower

Standing on the south bank of the Seine-Marne River in Paris, France, the Champ de Mars is a world-famous building, a symbol of French culture, and a landmark of Paris. It is affectionately called the "Iron Lady" by the French. The tower was originally built to welcome the World Expo and commemorate the 100th anniversary of the French Revolution.

Montparnasse Tower

Montparnasse is the tallest building in Paris after the Eiffel Tower. Climbing up is the best way to see the city of Paris. When the weather is clear, you can see the city scenery 40 kilometers away from the observation deck. The 56th floor and the panoramic open-air observation deck are all open to tourists.

Palace of Versailles

The Palace of Versailles, located southwest of Paris, was the palace of the French feudal emperors. It was first built in the 16th century and has been expanded many times to its current size. The Palace of Versailles is famous for its luxurious and imaginative architectural design. Later, it became the object of imitation for the royal palaces of various European countries. It is a brilliant pearl in the treasure house of human art. The appearance of the Palace of Versailles is magnificent and spectacular, and the interior furnishings and decorations are even more artistic. It is magnificent and luxurious everywhere. It was listed as a World Cultural Heritage in 1979.

Seine River Cruise

The Seine River divides the entire downtown area of Paris in two. The well-known Eiffel Tower, Notre Dame Cathedral, and Louvre are all built on the banks of the Seine River. Take a cruise to admire the famous French architecture on both sides of the Seine and experience the romantic feelings of France.

Louvre Museum

The Louvre was built in 1204. After several expansions, the castle was converted into a museum after the French Revolution. It is one of the three largest museums in the world, along with the British Museum in London and the Metropolitan Museum in New York. Today, the Louvre Museum has a collection of 400,000 pieces, spanning more than 1,500 years. Treasures of civilizations such as ancient Greece, ancient Rome, and ancient Egypt are beautifully displayed here. It can be said to be a mysterious palace of treasures. Appreciate the dazzling array of world art treasures, as well as the "Mona Lisa", "Venus" and "Winged Victory" statues, which are known as the "Three Treasures of the Louvre".

Night

Moulin Rouge Show in Paris

The Moulin Rouge, a renowned Parisian cabaret, is renowned for its thrilling cabaret and is known as the birthplace of the modern cancan. This dance incorporates acrobatics and athleticism, with glamorously dressed women performing a cheerful dance, often lifting their skirts and performing high kicks to the rhythm. The show is both breathtaking and captivating. The topless performances are also a real draw, with the dancers' exquisite costumes custom-made by Italian designers. The stage design is exquisite, with a variety of scenes. The dancers, hailing from all over the world, perform at a high level, interspersed with acrobatics, magic, and other performances, creating a breathtaking and thrilling experience.

After breakfast, we will head to Reims, the economic capital of the Champagne region in France and a significant city in French history, known as the City of Kings. Since the 11th century, French kings have been required to ascend to the throne in Reims, making the Cathedral of Reims one of the most important attractions. Then we will drive to Luxembourg, an ancient city renowned for its fortresses with a history of over 1000 years.

Reims Cathedral

The outstanding handling of new architectural techniques in the 13th century, and the harmonious marriage of sculptural decoration with architecture, has made Notre-Dame in Reims one of the masterpieces of Gothic art. The former abbey still has its beautiful 9th-century nave, in which lie the remains of Archbishop St Rémi (440–533), who instituted the Holy Anointing of the kings of France. The former archiepiscopal palace known as the Tau Palace, which played an important role in religious ceremonies, was almost entirely rebuilt in the 17th century.

Adolphe Bridge

Adolphe Bridge is also called the New Bridge, it was built between 1900 and 1903 during the rule of Grand Duke Adolphe. This event was followed with great interest from abroad, because the bridge had the biggest stone arch in the world up to then. The big double arch spans more than 85 meters across the Pétrusse valley.

Alzette Valley in Petros Canyon

The Petros Canyon, also known as the Grand Canyon of Luxembourg, is the natural boundary between the old and new urban areas of Luxembourg City. Because of the 100-meter width and 60-meter depth of the Petros

Canyon, Luxembourg has always been regarded as a military stronghold in history. Today, the Petros Canyon has become a beautiful tourist attraction in Europe. Standing on any bridge over the Grand Canyon, you can see lush and towering trees growing on both walls of the valley. There are many types of trees, and their growth directions are different, which further demonstrates the unrestrained natural beauty of the Petros Canyon.

Luxembourg Constitution Square Platz der Verfassung

The "Monument to the Fallen Soldiers" in Constitution Square was completed in 1923. It was built to commemorate the 3,000 Luxembourg soldiers who died in World War I and was rebuilt after being destroyed in World War II, so it has a dual meaning. The monument is 12 meters high and is a square obelisk. On top of the monument stands the statue of the goddess of victory, which was created by local artist Claus. At the two corners of Constitution Square are the underground entrances of the Betelius Battery and the Beck Battery, and opposite them is the Church of Our Lady. Looking from the square to the other side, you can see the Adolf Bridge and many beautiful buildings. It is an excellent place to view the Grand Canyon, the Adolf Bridge, and the castle.

After enjoying breakfast, we will first drive to the German town of Trier. Trier is the oldest city in Germany, once the capital of the Western Roman Empire and the birthplace of the communist giant Marx. We will visit Museum Karl-Marx-Haus and the Porta Nigra. Then head to Koblenz, known as the German Horn, which is the confluence of the Rhine and Moselle rivers in Europe. Then we will drive along the Rhine River and stop briefly in the bustling town of L ü d ersheim on the way. In the afternoon, we will arrive in Frankfurt, the largest financial city in Germany, and visit the city center's Romberg Square and the St. Paul's Church, which symbolizes freedom and democracy.

Museum Karl-Marx-Haus

Located at 10 Brückenstrasse in the ancient city of Trier, Germany, the three-story, off-white building is a typical example of architecture in the Rhine region of Germany at the time. The house's instruction manual is available in seven languages: German, English, Russian, French, Spanish, Chinese, and Japanese, with both simplified and traditional Chinese versions available. Among the numerous editions of "Das Kapital" on display at the house are the original German edition and the exquisitely printed Chinese edition.

Porta Nigra

Porta Nigra, commonly known as the Black Gate, is a famous ancient relic from the Roman period and the symbol of the city of Trier. Porta Nigra is the best-preserved Roman city gate north of the Alps. In 1986, it was designated as a World Cultural Heritage along with other ancient Roman sites and the cathedral in Trier.

Morning Transportation: Drive from the Porta Nigra to Koblenz

Rhein

The Rhine originates in the Alps in Graubünden, Switzerland, flows through Liechtenstein, Austria, Germany and France, and finally flows into the North Sea in the Netherlands. The Rhine is about 1,232 kilometers long, with a navigable section of 883 kilometers and a drainage area of 185,000 square kilometers. The Rhine is one of the longest rivers in Europe and one of the busiest river basins in the world.

Ruedesheim am Rhein

Rudesheim is located on a forested hillside. The whole city is full of red roofs and tree-lined streets, filled with the fragrance of flowers and sparkling with sunlight. Everything in the town is small and exquisite, including the small wine alley, small museum, small train station, and small statue of the goddess Germania. Only the vineyards are large. The vineyards change color with the changing seasons, and picturesque villages are hidden in the vineyards. Every manor is an ancient story.

Afternoon Transportation: Drive from Rudesheim am Rhein to Frankfurt

Römerberg Square

The square is the center of Frankfurt's old town, located north of the Main River and the site of the old town hall. The square was built in the Middle Ages, destroyed during World War II, and almost completely rebuilt after the war. Today, the square still retains the appearance of a medieval street, forming a sharp contrast with modern Frankfurt. The Römer Square is a symbol of Frankfurt's culture and history.

St. Paul's Church

St. Paul's Church is a church in Frankfurt, Germany, and an important political symbol of Germany. It is an oval Protestant church, built in 1789 and completed in 1833. St. Paul's Church is located near the Roman Square and was the seat of the Frankfurt National Assembly during the Prussian period. Therefore, it is also called the "St. Paul's Church Parliament" and was once an important political symbol of Germany.

Today we will depart from Frankfurt to Bonn, the capital of the former West Germany and the hometown of the musician Beethoven. Upon arrival, we will visit Beethoven's former residence and the University of Bonn, one of the most outstanding comprehensive universities in Germany. Then we will drive to Cologne to check in at Cologne Cathedral, a Gothic architectural wonder standing on the banks of the Rhine. Its magnificent twin-tower facade, towering spires, flying buttresses and exquisite carvings all show the Gothic architecture's pursuit of perfection in details and infinite pursuit of divinity. The charm of art is intoxicating. Walking into the Cologne Cathedral is like entering a sacred space where light and shadow interweave. After the visit, we will head to Amsterdam, the Netherlands.

Beethoven-Haus Bonn

Beethoven's former residence is located at No. 20 Bonn Lane in the north of Bonn. It is a two-story pink house that is very inconspicuous. Beethoven's parents moved here in 1767, and Beethoven was born here three years later. In 1889, it was converted into a former residence museum, which is the largest collection of Beethoven's life in the world today. Beethoven's former residence has 12 exhibition halls, and the exhibits in the exhibition halls are cultural relics carefully selected from more than 150 original documentary materials: such as portraits of Beethoven in various periods, paintings of his relatives, teachers, friends and his living environment, manuscripts of his works, and musical instruments he used. Beethoven's life is told in chronological order. Among them, the scores of Symphony No. 6 "Pastoral" and Piano Sonata "Moonlight" are treasures that cannot be missed for classical music fans.

University of Bonn

The University of Bonn, full name Rhein-Friedrich-Wilhelm-Bonn University, is located in Bonn, North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany. It is a first-class German and world-renowned institution of higher learning, one of the top 100 universities in the world, a member of the German elite university, the U15 University Alliance, and Europaeum. As one of the largest comprehensive universities in Germany, its predecessor was the Cologne State Academy founded in 1777.

Cologne Cathedral

Located in the heart of Cologne, on the banks of the Rhine, Cologne Cathedral is a landmark landmark. Its 157-meter - tall bell tower makes it the second tallest church in Germany and the third tallest in the world, as well as the third - largest Gothic cathedral in the world. Recognized for its exceptional integration of all medieval Gothic architectural and decorative elements, the cathedral has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Formed from its foundations to its present-day sprawl, the cathedral, like a forest of stalagmites, embodies the spirit of the German nation in a way that no other building can match.

Afternoon Transportation: Drive from Cologne Cathedral to Amsterdam

Setting off at sunrise, today we'll first visit the quintessential Dutch village of Windmill Village, where we'll visit the iconic windmills, a traditional clog factory, and a cheese factory, where we'll learn about the clog and cheese making processes. We'll then return to Amsterdam and visit Dam Square, the heart of the city. The National Monument, located east of Dam Square, commemorates the soldiers who died in World War II. We'll then visit the Royal Palace of Amsterdam, whose stone foundations are supported by 13,659 wooden piles, known as the "eighth architectural wonder of the world." The magnificent interior is not only a symbol of Dutch history but also a treasure trove of art and culture, a treasure trove worth exploring. You'll then enjoy a glass-bottomed boat tour along the canals, admiring the captivating scenery. Finally, we'll visit a diamond factory. Amsterdam, known as the "City of Diamonds," is renowned for its exquisite craftsmanship.

Amsterdam Windmill Village Zaanse Schans

The Windmill Village is an inhabited, open reserve and museum located 15 kilometers north of Amsterdam. The old buildings vividly depict the Dutch life in the 17th and 18th centuries. Real houses, old shipyards, wooden shoe making performances, and windmills attract thousands of tourists every year. The Zaan area may be the first industrial area in the world. 250 years ago, more than 800 windmills stood on this small piece of land. They undertook various industrial tasks. Among the five windmills, three are open to tourists. Boating on the Zaan River allows you to appreciate these beautiful windmills from another perspective. The museum in the windmill village includes a wooden shoe factory, a bakery, a cheese and dairy workshop, and a grocery store that is more than 100 years old.

Dam Square

Dam Square is located in the center of Amsterdam and is a landmark building in Amsterdam. There are various cafes, restaurants and bars on Dam Square. The majestic buildings around Dam Square are also worth seeing. The Royal Palace of the Netherlands located on Dam Avenue Square is a miracle in the history of architecture in the 17th century. A total of 13,568 tree stumps support the building.

Royal Palace of Amsterdam

The Royal Palace of Amsterdam is one of the four royal palaces in the Netherlands. It was originally a city hall and court. As the political and economic center of the city, it is also an important square in the city and a favorite subject for painters. It is still full of vitality today. The main attraction here is its architectural structure and the gorgeous decoration inside the palace. The palace with gorgeous interiors opens 17 halls, rooms and galleries for the public to visit. The exquisite interior is amazing. It retains about 2,000 pieces of royal furniture such as sofas, tapestries, chandeliers, and hanging paintings with rich meanings. After visiting the palace, you can also wander in the square in front of the palace, feed pigeons or watch street performers to enjoy the European style.

Nationaal Monument

The National Monument is located on the east side of Dam Square. It was built to commemorate the soldiers who died in World War II. Every year on May 4, the citizens of Amsterdam hold a memorial event in front of the National Monument to remember the soldiers who died in World War II. The National Monument is built with white travertine and is 22 meters high. It is magnificent. The inscription "De Vrede" meaning "Peace" is engraved at the bottom of the obelisk. There are four male sculptures in different postures and locked around the bottom of the obelisk. There is a female sculpture holding a baby surrounded by doves of peace in the middle of the front. The former shows the suffering in the war, and the latter symbolizes victory and peace. The male sculptures on both sides of the obelisk represent the resistance of the working class and intellectuals to the war, depicting sadness and pain. There are lion sculptures on the left and right sides of the front of the National Monument, implying that they will protect the spire like the sphinx in front of the pyramid.

Brussels Atomium

The Brussels Atomium is located in the Emmental City Park in the northwest suburb of Brussels. It was designed by Belgian engineer André Waterkeyn for the Brussels World Expo in 1958 and has now become a representative Belgian landmark. The Atomium adopts a cubic crystal structure of α iron magnified 165 billion times. It is composed of 9 large aluminum spheres with a diameter of 18 meters. Each sphere represents an atom, which also represents the 9 provinces of Belgium at that time. The spheres are connected by hollow steel pipes, each of which is about 29 meters long. The total weight of the 9 spheres plus the steel frame structure is 2,200 tons, and the highest sphere is 102 meters above the ground. The surface of each sphere is welded with 5,800 triangular arc-shaped aluminum sheets. Under the sunlight, this majestic building shines silver, which can be called a unique scientific work of art. Looking from the top of the sphere, there are currently 4 spheres of the Atomium open to the public, and the other spheres are used for research or rental. From the circular reception hall on the ground, you can take the lift directly to the top ball. This elevator has a speed of up to 5 meters per second, making it the fastest elevator in Europe. The top ball is for tourists to enjoy the scenery. It is surrounded by a circle of fixed tempered plexiglass windows and is equipped with multiple telescopes. From the top ball, you can see all the buildings of Brussels, near and far: Brussels City Hall, the National Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Miniature Europe and other buildings are all in sight.

Brussels Town Hall

The Town Hall of the City of Brussels is a Gothic building from the Middle Ages. It is located on the famous Grand Place in Brussels, Belgium, across the Brussels City Museum. Interestingly enough, it is the only remaining medieval building of the Grand Place and is even considered to be a masterpiece of civil Gothic architecture.

Grand-Place in Brussels

Let's explore the Grand Place! The Grand Place is located at the central square of Brussels. The Grand Place is one of the greatest tourist destinations and the most memorable landmark in Brussels. It is also considered one of the most beautiful squares in Europe and has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1998.

Manneken Pis, Brussels

The Manneken Pis is the symbol of Brussels, the capital of Belgium. This world-famous bronze statue of a little boy is a statue and fountain located in the pedestrian zone in the city center. This statue of a five-year-old child is not big, but it has a history of nearly 400 years.
