It was once the world's traditional automobile center and music capital, and the headquarters of the three largest automobile companies in the United States: General Motors, Ford, and Chrysler. Detroit is also one of the important cultural and artistic centers in the United States, with a rich historical and cultural heritage.

Afternoon

Henry Ford Museum

The Henry Ford Museum is a large historical museum complex with indoor and outdoor exhibition areas. It is located in Dearborn, Michigan, USA. It was built in 1929 with the purpose of preserving American history as much as possible for future generations to visit and learn about, and to better understand the lives of Americans at that time. In fact, the entire complex also includes IMAX theaters, Green Village and other attractions.

General Motors Headquarters

The headquarters of General Motors, one of the largest automobile companies in the United States. Located on the Detroit River, the complex consists of seven buildings. It cost \$500 million to build in the 1970s and still shows the prosperity of Detroit in those days. We will have the opportunity to appreciate many classic and high-end car models.

All day

It also boasts numerous museums and is a renowned tourist destination.

Itinerary:

Ohio town → Point State Park (30 min s) → Washington, D.C. → US Capitol + National Archives (optional, 2 hours, including exterior views of the Supreme Court and Library of Congress) → **White House** (outside visit, 30 mins) → **Lincoln Memorial + Vietnam Veterans Memorial** (45 mins) → **Baltimore**

Morning

Point State Park

Pittsburgh Downtown Park is a 36-acre state park in Pennsylvania, located at the confluence of the Allegheny and Monongahela rivers to form the Ohio River. Before the city of Pittsburgh was founded, in the mid-18th century, the site of what is now Downtown Park had important military strategic value because it controlled access to the Ohio River, which was the main route connecting the French colony of Louisiana, then located north of what is now Canada.

US Capitol

As the political center of the United States, Washington has many iconic political and cultural landscapes, such as the Capitol Building and the U.S. Supreme Court. Congress is composed of the Senate and the House of Representatives, and is the highest symbol of a government owned by the people, governed by the people, and enjoyed by the people. As an important landmark building in the United States, the Capitol Building has accompanied the United States through a difficult and tortuous road.

The National Archives

The National Archives houses precious documents, photographs, and video footage from various periods of American history. Among its most notable collections are the original parchment manuscripts of the founding documents, drafted at the founding of the nation in 1776. These documents include the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. Constitution, and the Bill of Rights. Other collections include the Emancipation

Proclamation of 1863, issued by Lincoln during the Civil War to free slaves, the surrender of Nazi Germany at the end of World War II, and the Watergate tapes that exposed Richard Nixon's corruption and ultimately brought him down.

The White House

The White House is a white neoclassical sandstone building covering an area of more than 73,000 square meters. It consists of the main building and the east and west wings. The White House is the office and residence of successive US presidents and is also synonymous with the US government. Many important US decision-making bills are signed and announced by the president in the White House. George Washington, the founding father of the United States, once expressed his views on the construction of the US President's residence: it must not be a palace, and it must not be luxurious, because the masters working here are servants of the state.

Lincoln Memorial

The Lincoln Memorial is a white ancient Greek temple-style building built to commemorate the 16th President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln. It is regarded as an eternal statue of the United States and a symbol of Washington. It is also the most famous rally for the pursuit of peace and democracy. Martin Luther King delivered his speech "I Have a Dream" here.

Vietnam Veterans Memorial

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is located north of the Lincoln Memorial. It is a 500-foot-long V-shaped monument made of black granite. It is used to commemorate the American soldiers and generals who died while serving in Vietnam during the Vietnam War. The glittering black marble wall is engraved with the names of more than 57,000 US soldiers who died in the Vietnam War between 1959 and 1975, in chronological order of the date of each person's death.

Baltimore Inner Harbor

Pearl Harbor was originally a wharf, but after renovation, it has now been transformed into a comprehensive place integrating sightseeing, entertainment and shopping, and enjoys the reputation of "sightseeing center". You can walk to Pier 3 to admire the novel glass pyramid-shaped National Aquarium; enjoy the magnificent city view at the Top of the World Observation Center; and taste the delicious and juicy Chesapeake Bay crabs and oysters in the restaurant. Don't forget to stroll on the riverbank with charming night views, you may hear the hoarse voice of street performers or have a romantic encounter!

Independence National Historical Park

Philadelphia is a land that witnessed the independence and birth of the United States. The National Independence Historical Park, built in the spirit of the American War of Independence, contains some historical buildings related to the American Revolution and the founding of the country. It is known as "the most historic square mile in the United States." In the park, you can see the Independence Square surrounded by green trees, the towering milky white clock tower, and the bronze statues of the founding heroes standing on the lawn. The overall atmosphere here makes people feel solemn and dignified.

Morning Transportation: Drive from Independence National Historical Park to Princeton

Travel distance: 45mi Travel time: 50Minute

Afternoon

Princeton University

Princeton University is one of the eight Ivy League schools and a famous comprehensive private university. It has beautiful scenery and is known as one of the most beautiful campuses in the eastern United States. There are many Gothic Revival-style buildings on campus, most of which were built in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Nassau Hall is the main administrative building on campus. It was built in 1756 and was briefly used as the Capitol in 1783.

Afternoon Transportation: Driving from Princeton to New York

Travel distance: 55mi Travel time: 1Hour10Minute

Rockefeller Center is described as one of the greatest projects of the Great Depression era, Rockefeller Center was declared a New York City landmark in 1985 and a National Historic Landmark in 1987. There, you will enjoy what is considered to be the best night view of the New York City skyline. Trendy Dumbo's cobblestone streets and converted Brooklyn warehouse buildings are the backdrop for independent boutiques, high-end restaurants and trendy cafes.

Second Stop: Equitable Building → Trinity Church → Bank of New York → Federal Hall → New York Stock Exchange → Trump Building → Deutsche Bank → Charging Bull → Customs House → Standard Oil Building → Cunard Line HQ

Third Stop: Rockefeller Center (pass by Diamond District and International Gem Tower)

Fourth Stop: Pulitzer Fountain → Grand Army Plaza → Plaza Hotel → Times Square → Nasdaq MarketSite

Morning

One World Trade Center Observatory

One World Trade Center, also known as the "Freedom Tower," stands on the site of the original World Trade Center, which collapsed during the September 11 attacks. At 1,776 feet, One World Trade Center is the tallest building in the United States and the third tallest in the world. This height commemorates the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. Upon arrival, guests are greeted by a large video board featuring welcome messages in various languages, and their hometowns are highlighted on a dynamically generated world map. "Voices" offers a unique experience, where the story of the people who built the building recounts their experiences, while "Foundations" provides an up-close look at the bedrock on which the building stands. From the Global Welcome Center to the guest elevators featuring virtual time-lapse, to the breathtaking video displays, and finally to the Discovery Level with its 360-degree views, every detail is a welcome addition to this experience.

Liberty Cruise

Take the Statue of Liberty cruise around the island to start a one-hour tour of the Hudson River. On the way, you will see the Manhattan skyline and the scenery on both sides of the Hudson River, and overlook the Empire State Building and the World Trade Center. The cruise slowly passes by the Statue of Liberty, and you can clearly see the Statue of Liberty wearing a radiant crown, holding the torch of freedom, and holding the Declaration of Independence in her hand. It is magnificent and eye-catching, symbolizing the lofty ideals of the American people for freedom and their yearning and pursuit for a better life.

RiseNY

Step into a recreation of New York's first City Hall subway station, where a short film by award-winning filmmaker Ric Burns, voiced by Jeff Goldblum, sweeps you through the city's history. Next, explore seven immersive galleries alive with iconic artifacts, dazzling costumes, and pop culture treasures, co-curated with top museums across the country. The grand finale lifts you 40 feet into the air on a soaring 4D ride, flying over all five boroughs through

a year of celebrations. Your journey ends standing on a replica of the Statue of Liberty's torch, gazing out over Times Square as if you were standing in the middle of New York Harbor itself.

New York City Fortune Tour

Manhattan's financial dream blossomed in New York, where almost all the world's top financial institutions are gathered. Today we will visit some classic landmark buildings in New York, the world's financial center, such as the Canyon of Heroes, Park Road Building, Trinity Church, New York Stock Exchange, Rockefeller Center, etc., to experience the rich financial and commercial atmosphere.

Afternoon Transportation: Driving from New York to the hotel

Day 5

Binghamton - Vehicle - Niagara Falls - Vehicle - Erie

All day

Niagara Falls is a group of three waterfalls at the southern end of Niagara Gorge, spanning the border between the province of Ontario in Canada and the state of New York in the United States. Formed by the Niagara River, which drains Lake Erie into Lake Ontario before going out to Atlantic by the Gulf of Saint Lawrence, the combined falls have the highest flow rate of any waterfall in North America that has a vertical drop of more than 50 m (160 ft).

Summer Itinerary: (Applied when Maid of the Mist opens)

Binghamton → Niagara Falls Classic Tour (Optional, 2.5 hours, including Whirlpool Park + Cave of the Winds + Maid of the Mist) → **Erie**

Winter Itinerary: (Applied when Maid of the Mist closes)

Binghamton → Niagara Falls Classic Tour (Optional, 2.5 hours, including Whirlpool Park + Cave of the Winds + Old Fort Niagara State Park) → **Erie**

Niagara Whirlpool State Park

The Niagara Whirlpool is 125 feet deep and was formed by water erosion 7,500 years ago. It is located where the Niagara River suddenly turns northeast from the northwest. The rapid river water flows back after the change of direction, forming a huge whirlpool. The park is very quiet, with barbecue pits and picnic tables. Standing on them, you can overlook the whirlpool below, which is very spectacular.

Maid of The Mist

The Maid of the Mist is the most monumental boat trip in the United States since 1846. There is no better way to experience Niagara Falls in the United States. Put on a blue raincoat and take aboard the dreamy Maid of the Mist boat to experience the refreshing mist, surging waves, and roaring waterfalls produced by more than 2 million liters of water per second. As a unique fleet of yachts, under the skilled command of captains, they have been sailing safely in the waves of the Niagara Gorge for more than 100 years and have carried tens of millions of tourists directly into the depths of the misty water.

or

Old Fort Niagara State Park

The War Fort is a tourist attraction of great historical value. It existed at the mouth of the Niagara River leading from Lake Ontario to Lake Erie before the independence of the United States. Therefore, it played a very important role in the Indian-French War, the American War of Independence, and the Anglo-American War at that time. Behind it is the vast Lake Ontario, one of the five Great Lakes of the United States.

Cave of the Winds

The entrance to the Cave of the Winds is on Goat Island, where there is a small museum and a small cinema. You can then take an elevator down 53 meters in the Niagara Gorge cave to the bottom of the valley. Standing at the foot of the falls, looking up, you will see the falls rushing down with overwhelming momentum, which can't help but make people feel passionate and resonate with nature.

Hotel: Sleep Inn Erie near Sports Center; similar

Day 6

Rock & Roll Hall of Fame

The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum is dedicated to the memory of the most celebrated and influential artists, producers, engineers, and others who have influenced the music industry in some significant way through rock and roll. Like the Cleveland Music Festival, the Hall of Fame comes alive with the energy, passion, and soul of music. The 150,000 square foot museum features seven floors and four theaters for films, special events, free public programs, and a variety of changing exhibitions.

Afternoon Transportation: Travel by car from Rock & Roll Hall of Fame to Chicago

Travel distance: 350mi Travel time: 6Hour
