Day 3

Salmon Arm / Revelstoke - Vehicle - Banff National Park - Vehicle - Banff

All day

In the morning, visit the famous "Last Nail" in the Pacific Railway Memorial Park, which is a mark to commemorate the completion of the Pacific Railway and also witness the great contribution made by Chinese workers to the railway more

than a hundred years ago. Then follow Highway 1 to the Rocky Mountains, passing through Glacier National Park - the famous Rogers Canyon Passage. Then pass through Yoho National Park and enter Banff National Park. After lunch, proceed to Lake Louise, known as the "Rocky Mountain Sapphire", surrounded by mountains on three sides, with beautiful scenery. Then go to the crystal clear Moraine Lake (depending on the road conditions), Moraine Lake is recognized as the most photographable lake in the world. Then go to Banff, a famous tourist attraction in Alberta, to visit the Bow River Falls and look at the majestic Hot Springs Castle Hotel. After that, take the Banff Sulfur Mountain Gondola to enjoy the beautiful scenery of the Rocky Mountains. Arriving in the small town of Banff in the evening, the group members can shop at the gift shop and taste a variety of delicacies with different flavors. Overnight in Banff.

Salmon Arm / Revelstoke → The Last Spike (20 mins) → Glacier National Park (Pass-by) → Yoho National Park (Pass-by) → Banff National Park → Lake Louise (60 mins) → Moraine Lake (30 mins) → Bow Falls (15 mins) → Banff Gondola (Mandatory, 60 mins) → Banff

Morning

The Last Spike

The Last Spike was the final and ceremonial railway spike driven into the Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) track by company director Donald Smith on the morning of November 7th, 1885. The ceremony marked the completion of the transcontinental CPR. It was a muted affair at which a group of company officials and laborers gathered at Craigellachie. The Last Spike symbolized more than just the completion of a railway. Contemporaries and historians have viewed the Last Spike as an event when national unity was recognized.

Glacier National Park

Glacier National Park is one of 43 national parks located within Canada. It has approximately 521 square miles of protected areas includes portions of the Columbia Mountains, as well as Rogers Pass National Historic Site. The park contains active glaciers and snowy peaks! It is also home to one of Canada's largest cave systems and even offers a large selection of plants and animals.

Yoho National Park

Yoho National Park lies on the western slopes of the Canadian Rocky Mountains. Vertical rock walls, waterfalls and dizzying peaks draw visitors from all around the world to this unique national park! Johnston Canyon

Crowfoot Glacier

The spectacular Crowfoot Glacier can be viewed from a lookout point on the world-famous Icefields Parkway about 34 km (21 mi) north of Lake Louise. Attached to the northeastern side of Crowfoot Mountain, overlooking Bow Lake, the glacier's runoff feeds into the Bow River, which flows from Banff National Park through the City of Calgary to the Alberta prairies.

Bow Lake

Bow Lake is located approximately 30 minutes north of Lake Louise and off the Icefields Parkway (Hwy 93) in the Canadian Rockies. It is half a mile north of the Crowfoot Glacier. It sits at an elevation of 1,920 m (6,300 ft) and is one of

the largest lakes at the Banff National Park. It is fed by the meltwater from the Bow Glacier in the Wapta Icefield. Bow Lake is a wonderful place for a picnic and to enjoy scenic breathtaking views.

Peyto Lake

Peyto Lake is a popular sightseeing spot! It is a glacier-fed lake in Banff National Park in the Canadian Rockies. The lake itself is near the Icefields Parkway. During the summer, a significant amount of glacial rock flour flows into the lake from a nearby glacier. The suspended rock particles are what give the lake a unique bright, turquoise color. Due to its bright color, photos of the lake often appear in illustrated books.

Columbia Icefield

Columbia Icefield is what is left of a gigantic sheet of ice that covered and formed most of the landscape in the Rocky Mountains. The Ice field covers an area today of 325 square kilometers or 130 square miles and is such an amazing location to explore!

Day 5

Jasper - Vehicle - Mount Robson Provincial Park - Vehicle - Kamloops

All day

In the morning, we will leave Jasper for the famous scenic spot - Maligne Lake and Maligne Canyon. It is the second largest glacial lake in the world and the largest glacial lake in the Rocky Mountains. Here is the world-famous Spirit Island with beautiful lakes and mountains. At noon, we will arrive in the Mount Robson Provincial Park. Mount Robson is not only a UNESCO World Heritage Site, but also the starting point of the Fraser River. It is also the highest mountain in the Canadian Rockies, with an altitude of 3954 meters. After lunch, we will head to Wells Gray Provincial Park and take a visit to Spahats Creek Falls, which is a geographical wonder left after years of glacial and volcanic activities. Overnight in Kamloops.

Itinerary:

Jasper → Maligne Lake Cruise (Optional, 60 mins) → Maligne Canyon (45 mins) → Mount Robson Provincial Park (30 mins) → Valemont → Spahats Creek Falls (30 mins) → Kamloops

Special Note:

1. Maligne Lake Cruise is short of resources. It is highly recommended that you pay in advance to ensure the cruise resources.

All day

Jasper National Park

Jasper National Park spans 4,200 square miles (10,878 square km) and contains significant active geologic processes, scenic mountains, along with diverse animal and plant populations. When Jasper was first protected as a forest park in 1907, it covered an area of approximately 5,000 square miles (12,950 square km). In 1930 it was declared a national park with its present size. It was designated part of UNESCO's Canadian Rocky Mountain Parks World Heritage site in 1984.

Maligne Lake

Maligne Lake is the largest natural lake in the Canadian Rockies. Ringed by snow-and-ice-capped mountains, the 22 km long lake stretches past serene Spirit Island right to the melt-water channels of Coronet Glacier. An open forest of lodgepole pine and spruce, home of moose, Harlequin Ducks, and many other types of wildlife surround visitors at the north end of the lake.

Maligne Canyon

Maligne Canyon is the deepest canyon in Jasper National Park, with a depth of more than 50 metres at certain points.

Mount Robson Provincial Park

Mount Robson Provincial Park, the second oldest park in British Columbia's park system, is truly one of the world's crown jewels. The mountain for which the park is named guards the park's western entrance. At 3,954 metres, Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies, towers over the lesser surrounding peaks; winter or summer, this is one of the finest views in the Rocky Mountains.

Night

Hotel: Pacific Inn & Suites Kamloops Or similar

Day 6

Kamloops - Vehicle - BC Wildlife Park - Vehicle - Vancouver

All day

In the morning, we will first visit the Kamloops Sunmore Ginseng Factory. You will learn about the planting and curative effect of ginseng, and you will have the opportunity to taste authentic ginseng tea. Then we will head to visit the BC Wildlife Park. You can see various wild animals here! After lunch, follow us and have a quick view of the filming location of Stallone's movie "First Blood" - Hope Town, which is the only way for gold diggers years ago. After lunch, we will drive back to Vancouver.

Kamloops → Kamloops Sunmore Ginseng Factory (45 mins) → BC Wildlife Park (Optional, 90 mins) → Hope Town (30 mins) → Vancouver

Morning

Kamloops Sunmore Ginseng Factory

Sunmore Ginseng Factory is located in Kamloops. Due to its pollution-free fertile soil and semi-desert dry climate, Kamloops has become the largest producer of American ginseng. It is famously known as the "Ginseng Capital." During this visit, visitors will have the chance to understand the growth process of American ginseng and its various nourishing medicinal effects.

BC Wildlife Park

The BC Wildlife Park is a non-profit organization dedicated to the rescue & rehabilitation of injured wildlife. Discover some of British Columbia's iconic wildlife and view nearly 200 animals and 65 animal species, including bears, elk, bobcats, arctic wolves, and cougars. The majority of the Parks animals are rescued, including Clover, the only Kermode Bear in human care in the world.

Hope Town

Hope town is the perfect place to walk around and explore. It is filled with beautiful nature views and instant relaxation. Take a look at all that this town has to offer.

Day 8

Vancouver - Vehicle - **Neck Point Park** - Vehicle - **Port Alberni**

All day

Take the BC ferry to Nanaimo! Along the way, you will enjoy the beautiful scenery of the Georgia Strait. We will first visit the the Neck Point Park, where you can see the jagged coastal rocks and take a walk on the old trails in the forest. Following, we will head to Coombs, where there is the most distinctive supermarket on Vancouver Island, Old Country Market - Goats on Roof. The roof of the supermarket is covered with green grass, and the goats are living on the roof! Overnight at Port Alberni.

Itinerary:

Vancouver → BC Ferry (120 mins) → Nanaimo → Neck Point Park (60 mins) → Old Country Market - Goats on Roof (60 mins) → Port Alberni

All day

Neck Point Park

Neck Point is a destination waterfront park for Nanaimo and the region. The park is well known in the community for its historic, scenic and natural features. Rugged rock cliffs, with pebble bay beaches, and winding trails through Garry Oak groves will be found here. The park is a great location for photographers wanting to capture the essence of Nanaimo and the west coast lifestyle! The headland area in the north section of the park is a great spot to watch for Orca and Sealions and otters.

Old Country Market - Goats on Roof

The Old Country Market started as a roadside fruit stand providing fresh produce to travellers heading to the west coast of Vancouver Island. Over the years it has evolved into a landmark of Coombs, with a mixture of shops and eateries for locals and visitors alike. Oh yeah, and there are goats... on the roof!

Day 9

Port Alberni - Vehicle - Tofino - Vehicle - Port Alberni

All day

Rise and shine! We will drive to Tofino in the morning! You can choose to watch whales at your own expense on the cruise ship or explore the natural hot springs on the island. Or you can just have your own peaceful time by the seaside. In the afternoon, we will head to the Pacific Rim National Park Reserve - Long Beach Unit and appreciate the natural scenery there. Finally, we will go to the Amphitrite Point Lighthouse to breathe the sea breeze! Overnight at Port Alberni.

Itinerary:

Port Alberni → Tofino (3 hours, Optional for Tofino Whale Watching Cruise) → **Pacific Rim National Park Reserve - Long Beach Unit** (30 mins) → **Amphitrite Point Lighthouse** (30 mins) → **Port Alberni**

Morning

Tofino Whale Watching Cruise

Guests of our Tofino whale watching trips will tour the waters of Clayoquot Sound where we most often view Grey Whales. The grey whale migration from Baja California, Mexico begins to arrive along the west coast of Vancouver Island in February and continues through late May. From March through October, over 200 'resident' grey whales will stay feeding in the waters. Humpback whales are seen throughout our season, with the most frequent sightings between June and September. You will also see Orcas (Killer Whales) throughout the year. In addition to whales, you will have chance to enjoy views of sea lions, eagles, sea otters and other amazing wildlife while on the water.

Afternoon

Pacific Rim National Park Reserve - Long Beach Unit

Lying along the west coast of Vancouver Island in the traditional territories of the Nuuchalch First Nations, Pacific Rim National Park Reserve boasts kilometres of long sandy beaches, unspoiled temperate rainforests and adventures that will delight the explorer in all.

Amphitrite Point Lighthouse

The Amphitrite Lighthouse is a classic sight in Ucluelet. In fact, if you've been to Ucluelet, but didn't go to the lighthouse, it hardly counts as having visited the quaint fishing village on the west coast of Vancouver Island. As peaceful and postcard-perfect as the lighthouse looks, especially as the sun kisses the horizon goodnight, basking the squat white building in pinks and golds, it is a product of tragedy. No matter the season, seeing the Amphitrite Lighthouse is a treat for the eyes of anyone on the coast.

Day 10

Port Alberni - Vehicle - MacMillan Provincial Park - Vehicle - Vancouver

All day

We will head to MacMillan Provincial Park in the morning. This park boasts the nicely preserved temperate rainforest on the west coast, and there is an 800-year-old fir tree in the park. Next, follow us to visit the Little Qualicum Cheeseworks. The Cheeseworks provided self-service machine of filling a can of fresh milk. There are also several kinds of cute pet animals in the farm for animal lovers. Finally, we will return to the center of Nanaimo and take the ferry to Vancouver in the afternoon.

Itinerary:

MacMillan Provincial Park

The 157-hectare MacMillan Provincial Park is located on both sides of Pacific Highway 4 on the shores of Cameron Lake, 19 miles (30 km) west of Parksville and 10 miles (16 km) east of Port Alberni on Vancouver Island, British Columbia. MacMillan Provincial Park on Vancouver Island is famous for Cathedral Grove, one of the most accessible stands of giant Douglas-fir trees in British Columbia. A stroll on the network of trails meandering through the towering ancient Douglas-firs, some of which are more than 800 years old, can be quite an inspirational experience.

Little Qualicum Cheeseworks

Little Qualicum Cheeseworks was established in 2001. Visitors can meet the mixed herd of 45 dairy cows, watch the live stream of the robotic milker (voluntary milking system), and interact with the calves and a variety of animals including sheep, goats, and rabbits. The cheese plant has an outside deck for watching the cheesemaking through the windows. In the farmgate store, guests can find a wide range of artisan cheeses along with specialty local foods, gifts, décor, baked goods! In late 2017 Little Qualicum Cheeseworks opened Canada's first milk-on-tap dispenser where visitors can bring a reusable jug or purchase a glass or plastic bottle from the store, and fill up on fresh milk right from the farm.
